Christ's Present Reign in His Kingdom

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Introduction

- 1. Much contemporary thinking in the denominational world claims that Jesus is not presently reigning as King.
- 2. The purpose of this lesson is to show that Christ is currently reigning in His eternal kingdom.

I. The Death of Christ Was According to Prophecy

- A. The purpose of the first coming of Christ was not to live and reign on earth for a thousand years but to be crucified (Isa. 52, 53; Acts 8).
- B. Christ was delivered up and crucified in accordance with God's eternal plan (Acts 2:23; cf. Luke 22:22) and not because He was surprisingly rejected.

II. The Burial of Christ Was According to Prophecy

- A. Isaiah says, "And He made His grave with the wicked, and with the rich in His death..." (53:9a).
- B. Many passages show the fulfillment of this prophecy (Matt. 27:57-60; Luke 23:53; Mark 15:46; John 19:42).

III. The Resurrection of Christ Was According to Prophecy

- A. Psalm 16:10 says, "For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption" (cf. Acts 2:29-32).
- B. It was never in God's plan for Christ to come and reign on earth a literal one thousand years, but that He should be crucified at the end of a brief ministry on earth (just as He was) and be raised from the dead (just as He was).

IV. The Coronation of Christ Was According to Prophecy

- A. 2 Samuel 7:12-14 makes it clear that Jesus is presently reigning as King over His kingdom (cf. Heb. 1:5; Acts 2:29).
- B. In Acts 2:30-31, God had sworn to David that He would set one of David's descendants upon David's throne (cf. Acts 2:33).

V. The Establishment of the Kingdom Was According to Prophecy

- A. When was the kingdom established? The Bible teaches that the kingdom was set up on the first Pentecost following the resurrection of Christ from the dead (Dan. 2:32, 44; Dan. 7; Matt. 4:17; 3:1-2; Luke 10:9; Matt. 16:18b-19a; Col. 1:13; Heb.12:28; Mark 9:1; Luke 24:49; Acts 1:8; Acts 2:4).
- B. What is the nature of the kingdom? Jesus came to establish the kind of kingdom (spiritual) which He actually did set up (John 6:15; Luke 23:15; John 18:33-37).
- C. How long is the kingdom to last? (Dan. 2:44; Luke 1:33; Heb. 12:28; Acts 2:34-35; 1 Cor. 15:25, 26)

Conclusion

- 1. Contrary to the doctrine of premillennialism, it was not the purpose of Christ to come into this world to sit on a literal throne in a literal city for a literal one thousand years.
- 2. Jesus does not have to wait until He comes again to be crowned King; He is already King—King of an eternal kingdom.
- Only those who believe and obey the message of the King can be citizens of the kingdom.
