 - 1. References to its existence (Col. 1:13-14; Rev. 1:5-6, 9)
- C. The church, God's chosen people
 - 1. Chosen by God (Tit. 2:11-14; 1 Pet. 2:1-10)
 - 2. Called to be faithful (Rev. 2:10)
 - 3. The promised home (Phil. 3:20-21; John 14:1-3)
