### The Importance of One Letter

It is easy for us to overlook the importance of a single word, even of a single letter, as we speak. An illustration of this is shown in the adage, "The only difference in united and untied is where 'i' is found." One single letter moved one space totally changes the meaning of a sentence where it is found.

This is why it is important to take time to look at individual words/letters as we read the Bible.

#### **Two Lists**

Look at these two lists and see if you notice how one letter changes the word of God. The Bible speaks of: His doctrine (Matt. 7:28); the apostles' doctrine (Acts 2:42); your doctrine (Acts 5:28); the Tim. 1:10); the doctrine of Christ (Heb. 6:1); etc.

Now, look at the second list: the doctrines and commandments of men (Matt. 15:9; Mark 7:7); the commandments and doctrines of men (Col. 2:22); the doctrines of devils 1 Tim. 4:1); and strange doctrines (Heb. 13:9). Did you see the difference? It is the letter "s" to show a distinct difference between the word doctrine and the word doctrines.

The Bible uses the plural, doctrines, to refer to false teaching, but it never uses the plural to refer to the teaching from heaven. It rarely uses the singular to refer to teaching coming from the heart of man, and every time it does, it clearly identifies its origin.

#### The One Doctrine

On any Bible subject there is only one teaching. In our society, we have the concept that one doctrine is as good as another. That is why people say, "That's what you believe about it. Let me tell you what I believe about it." This language

> ignores the fact that our God is one and when He speaks it is always singular. There is no way that He, who cannot lie, can teach one thing in one place and a contrary thing in another.

#### The One Faith

tell you what I Paul says that there are precisely the same doctrine of the Lord (Acts 13:12); sound doctrine (1 believe about it." number of "faiths" as there are gods. "There is one body, and one Spirit...one hope...one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God..." (Eph. 4:4-6). The Bible does not make provision for me to have one faith and you have another faith. Our faith comes from the doctrine we are taught, and the Bible never, even one time, speaks of the doctrines of God.

> Religious division mocks the prayer of Jesus for unity among His followers. If I believe and teach the only doctrine found in the Bible and others teach only the same doctrine from the same source there will be unity. There is a vast difference between doctrine and doctrines!

When Paul wrote his first epistle to the young evangelist Timothy, he charged him with various responsibilities toward the elders of the church (5:17-25). Note this one in particular: "Do not receive an accusation against an elder except from two or three witnesses" (5:19). Apparently it would have

been common in the first century for someone to come "to the preacher" with "an accusation against an elder." (If only that problem was limited to the first century!) Agape "love co-

The instruction to Timothy was clear: "Do vers a multitude NOT receive" it or "entertain" (NIV) it! That is the general rule! There is one and only one exception: If the accusation comes from two or three witnesses. Does that have any application to us today?

The principle of "two or three witnesses" was a long-standing divine policy. Under the Law of Moses, "One witness shall not rise against a man concerning any iniquity or any sin that he commits; by the mouth of two or three witnesses the matter shall be established" (Deut. 19:15). The death penalty could only be enforced "on the testimony of two or three witnesses" (Deut. 17:6), for "one witness is not sufficient testimony against a person" (Num. 35:30).

Jesus established that same principle in the New Testament (see John 8:17-18). He specifically applied it to conflict between brethren. Ideally and initially, an issue is to be handled in private, one-on-one. If that fails to resolve the matter, Jesus said, "Take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established" (Matt. 18:16).

Connect First Timothy 5:19 with Matthew 18:15-16. The words of Paul to Timothy not only apply to one person bringing an accusation against an elder. The words apply to

> any one person bringing an accusation against anyone else. We have no right to "receive" or "entertain" accusations against others! Although that juicy piece of "information" about another person "seems right" (Prov. 18:17), we have heard only "one side" of the matter, and it would be "folly" for us to speak or act in that situation (18:13).

"Death" is "in the power of the tongue" (Prov. 18:21). If the death penalty could not be enforced unless two or three witnesses established the validity of a matter, then our tongue must not be engaged to promote one's demise, when we have heard only one side of the story!

Psalm 15 affirms that to dwell in the presence of God, one must not "slander with his tongue" or "take up a reproach against his friend" (v. 3). We have no right to "entertain" accusations against others! Agape "love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Pet. 4:8) and practices "The Golden Rule" (Luke 6:31)!

#### The Man Who Cried, "It's Ma'am!"

It happened in December of last year at a GameStop retail store in Albuquerque, New Mexico. An employee was accused of misgendering (referring to someone with a word or pronoun that does not represent the gender with which they identify) by calling a man dressed and identifying as woman, "sir."

That person began screaming and cursing and affirming that he was a woman, even to the point of asking the employee to step outside so that he could show him how much of a woman he was, referring to fighting.

Not very ladylike. Isaiah wrote, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; who substitute darkness budge

call evil good, and good evil; who substitute darkness for light and light for darkness; who substitute bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter" (5:20)! We are in a time when truth is being redefined. Everything is being rebranded, renamed, and redone. In some cas-

es, that is good. Who didn't want a better Hulk movie? Thank you, Marvel. However, in areas of greater importance, like gender, there are some things that should never be moved, changed or altered. It's like living in a not-so-fun house where perception is not reality. How do we live in it, and how do we prepare our children to live in it?

In our homes and areas where we have control, we must keep things right-side-up as much as possible. Not only for our own sanity but for the influence on our children. Our

homes need to be a refuge for truth. Anything that addresses the issue of reassigning truth (from homework to Disney—everything) needs to be talked about as a family. They are getting this thrown at them from every angle. Teachers say that homosexual relationships in schools are as common as heterosexual relationships. They are being programmed that tolerance means I have to agree or be silent about my own beliefs. At home, they need to be able to process this with you.

Give them the opportunity to ask questions. Teach them how to reason through the murky waters of this new truth they are being bombarded with. We must teach them to be respectful but firm. It is alright and healthy to be able to disagree with someone. We can be respectful to people without accepting their opinions or life choices (Eph. 4:14-15).

In our own interactions with people of the opposite truth, what should we do? How should we speak? We need to show wisdom in how we speak (Col. 1:28). Our words need to be seasoned in such a way as to be heard (Col. 4:5-6). We need to be respectful but firm. We can't budge on truth. Would we not be offended to have to call a man a woman? Would you not feel oppressed if everyone and every establishment around you catered to this new truth? This is not really truth, only there are some teaching it and wanting to promote it. We should not be among those who promote it or are silent to correct it, but we must protect those around us.
