

How Much Have You Committed?

When Paul wrote his second letter to Timothy, he knew the end was near. He looked back over his life and used two illustrations from the Grecian games to describe it. He mentioned fighting (wrestling or boxing) and racing. "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (4:6). It is at times like this that a man reflects on how his life has been spent. It is a time for self-evaluation.

Look at his words in chapter one. He urged Timothy to never be ashamed of the gospel nor of Paul. "Share with me in the sufferings for the gospel" (1:8). Four verses later he mentions his suffering again. "For this reason I also suffer these things; nevertheless I am not ashamed..." Throughout much of his life he had been despised, mocked, blasphemed, beaten and imprisoned. The world looks at such men with contempt, yet Paul was not ashamed.

How could this be? Read the rest of this verse. "For I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day." Just what had he committed to the Lord? Take time to consider the following thoughts as if you knew your life was about to end and then reflect back on it. What have you committed to the safekeeping of God until the day of judgment?

The end of a man's life is a time for reflection on how it has been spent

- He had committed to the Lord his choice to suffer shame at the hands of men for Him to recompense on the final day.
- He had committed his soul to the Lord. That eternal spirit was about to depart from his body, and he had loved the Lord with all of his heart and soul. He believed the Lord knew this and would keep it until the end.
- He had committed his body as a living sacrifice and it was offered on the altar of service. Now the time had come for his life to be sealed with his own blood. With absolute confidence he knew he would be vindicated someday.
- He had committed the future into God's hand and while there was much uncertainty about that future, he knew *Who* held the future. "I know whom I have believed..." He may not have known the "what," but he knew the *Who*!
- He had committed all that there was to Him who was able. On this earth there were times when Paul was bound and helpless because there were those who were able to do this to him. Yet Paul knew that their power was nothing compared to the power of the Almighty. There is no comparison to be made between the two. Those Roman soldiers thought they were able to control Paul's future. He knew better.

How deep is your commitment to the Lord? How much of yourself or your life belongs to Him?

Things Pertaining to the Kingdom of God

The book of Acts begins by telling the reader what Jesus did for the forty days that He was on the earth between His resurrection and His ascension. It simply says that He with His apostles, "to whom He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God" (Acts 1:3). The text states that Jesus was "speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God." What sorts of "things" do you think He spoke concerning the kingdom?

Perhaps He spoke of the immeasurable value of His kingdom, as He once did when He told the parable of a man who found treasure in a field, and "for joy over it" sold all that he had to buy the field (Matt. 13:44). Surely His apostles needed to remember that!

Perhaps He spoke of the citizenship of His kingdom, as He once did when He told the parable of a great supper, to which all persons near and far (of all demographics) were invited (Luke 14:15-24). Surely they needed to hear that again!

Perhaps He spoke of the labor required in His kingdom, as He once did when He told the parable of the laborers in the vineyard, who all received the same wage for their hard work (Matt. 20:1-16). The apostles needed to remember that!

No wonder He spent 40 more days speaking about it!

Perhaps He spoke of the timing of the coming of His kingdom, as He often did by saying it was "at hand" (Matt. 4:17), would come in that generation (Mark 9:1) and was "not many days" away (Acts 1:5). They needed to know that!

Perhaps He spoke of the laws of His kingdom, as He often did by emphasizing that man must "do" the will of God (Matt. 7:21), for His word would be the standard of judgment (John 12:48). Surely the apostles needed to remember that!

Perhaps He spoke of the entrance into His kingdom, as He had before, emphasizing that unless one is baptized ("born of water and the Spirit") that "he cannot enter the kingdom of God" (John 3:5). The apostles needed to know that for sure!

Perhaps He spoke of the eternal destiny of His kingdom, as He emphasized in the parable of the tares that only those who practice righteousness in His kingdom will be gathered to the Father (Matt. 13:37-43).

No doubt, "the things pertaining to the kingdom of God" of which our Lord spoke during those 40 days included "things" He had already taught concerning the kingdom and "things" which the apostles would go forth and preach (and write about in our New Testament). The establishment of His kingdom in the first century and our citizenship therein is the central purpose of His coming—no wonder He spent 40 more days speaking about it! Do you know and love His kingdom?

Florida, A Sinful State

Florida is not the innocent sunshine state with decent tax laws and a good place to retire. According to a new study by Wallethub, we are the second most sinful state behind Nevada. To rank the states, they compared data from 43 metrics that ranked each state in seven areas: anger and hatred, jealousy, excesses and vices, greed, lust, vanity, and laziness. Sounds like a lonely mathematician's Friday night. Not only did they find the most and least sinful states (well done, Vermont), this study also highlighted problem areas that certain states have. It is no surprise that Nevada has the highest rate of gambling addicts, which proves that legalization doesn't eliminate the problem. However, you wouldn't think that Missouri would have the highest rate of drug usage. While this may have been just a ploy to get people clicking, it raises an interesting thought. What are people thinking about sin?

Wallethub used the infamous seven deadly sins list that was compiled by Pope Gregory I around 600 A.D. The Bible mentions several lists of sins, even things God hates. "There are six things which the Lord hates, yes, seven which are an abomination to Him: haughty eyes, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked plans, feet that run rapidly to evil, a false witness who utters

lies, and one who spreads strife among brothers" (Prov. 6:16-19; cf. Gal. 5:19-21). While it is clear that the Bible condemns these things, do we, as a society, think that they are something we should be condemning? The answer is rather obvious. By our actions it is clear that mankind is not against sin. We are more on the "heart that devises wicked plans" level. Nor is it a good social practice to draw attention to anything you think is a sin. We are not just alright with sin. We are against anyone labeling anything a sin.

Would you leave your sinful state?

As children of God, we are called to help people see sin for what it is. Not a cute thing to joke about but a great danger. "Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even expose them; for it is disgraceful even to speak of the things which are done by them in secret. But all things become visible when they are exposed by the light, for everything that becomes visible is light" (Eph. 5:11-13). It is obvious that we need to be careful with the tactics we use when doing this, but we do not need to get comfortable with sin. A danger we have is living in a world of sin and getting "used to it." Sin still needs to bother us. We should still be repulsed by it, enough to help people make changes in their lives. People and family around us are "being deceived with empty words" (Eph. 5:6). We, children of light, need to walk in wisdom and help people come out of their sinful state and into the marvelous light of the gospel (Eph 5:8; 1 Pet. 2:9).

"But I didn't actually tell a lie"

Out of envy and hate, Joseph's brother "conspired against him to kill him...and cast him into a pit" (Gen. 37:20). Then they planned to say, "Some wild beast has devoured him" (37:20). Although they did not kill him or say those actual words, after selling him to the Ishmaelites, they took his tunic, dipped it in the blood of a goat, brought it to their father and said, "We have found this. Do you know whether it is your son's or not?" Jacob recognized it and said, "It is my son's tunic. A wild beast has devoured him" (37:32-33). Did Joseph's brothers tell their father a lie?

Some might argue that they didn't actually lie. (But they did!) They set up all the circumstances so that their father would believe a lie, and then they let him believe it. That's lying. That's deceit! Brethren, God tells us to lay aside "all deceit" (1 Pet. 2:1), for "those who practice such things [as deceit, v. 29] are deserving of death" (Rom. 1:29-32). Deceit (i.e., lying and leading one to believe a lie) is of the Devil (Rev. 12:9), and not of God! Get away from it! – DS



"May I borrow your car?"

Has someone ever borrowed your car? Suppose that you had a brand-new car, which you just drove home from the dealer, and it only had 10 miles on it. Now imagine that a friend came over and you let him borrow it. What would you think (and how would you like it?) if your friend returned the car and it had paint splattered all over the outside, it had dozens of empty beer bottles on the floors that had been spilled all over the leather seats, it had cigarette butts littering every visible crevice, it had all of the windows broken out, and it looked like your friend had done everything possible to destroy your brand-new car, rather than carefully maintain it?

Now, consider this. God let you borrow HIS (not yours) brand-new body when He gave it to you at your birth. It truly (and in actuality) belongs to Him! How are you taking care of it? In what condition do you plan to return to Him? Are you treating it like the borrowed car illustration above? Or, are you using it to "glorify God" in all that you do (1 Cor. 6:19-20)? Think about it. I need to use my body in ways that would be acceptable to Him and would honor Him! – DS
