# Sometimes It's Better to Die Young

Many know of that time when the prophet Isaiah came to King Hezekiah who was seriously ill. The message was simple. Isaiah told the king that he was to die. "Set your house in order, for you shall die, and not live" (2 Kgs. 20:1). When the prophet departed, Hezekiah prayed so fervently to

God that before Isaiah had left the palace God told the prophet to return to the king and deliver the message that his life would be lengthened fifteen years. There are some vital truths we must learn from the details of this wonderful story.

### Hezekiah's Ingratitude

immediately responded with a heart filled with thanksgiving for all that God had done. Such was not

the case. "But Hezekiah did not repay according to the favor shown to him, for his heart was lifted up" (2 Chron. 32:25).

Now before you react too quickly, how often have you prayed about matters, and your prayers were answered? How did you respond? Adversity leads us to prayer, but we must learn to repay God for the favor he has shown.

### Hezekiah's Gratitude

No details are given, but that verse in 2 Chronicles

shows that God's wrath was looming over Hezekiah and over his kingdom. It never became a reality because of the king's response. "Hezekiah humbled himself for the pride of his heart, he and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the wrath of the Lord did not come upon them in the days of Hezekiah."

Hezekiah was one of the great kings of the Jews, and it impacted the lives of all those in Judah. It is obvious that their petitions of God changed what was about to happen. God

> heard Hezekiah's petition to spare his life and his petition for deliverance from the impending doom.

#### Don't Live Too Long

God did lengthen his life fifteen years. What You would think that Hezekiah would have thank God for His happened in those years? You may not be aware of name was Manasseh, and he ruled for fifty-five years.

During his reign, the Jews totally forgot about God and temple worship stopped. That glorious temple Solomon built fell into disrepair, and the Bible kept in the temple was completely forgotten and lost.

Who was Manasseh, and what was his relation to Hezekiah? He was Hezekiah's son who was born to him during the fifteen years God added to his life. It would have been far better had Hezekiah died than to have lived and fathered evil Manasseh. The point is obvious. Better to die young and faithful than to live too long and create evil!



## "A Funny Way to Count"

"So, how many did we have here today?" The question is asked in regard to the number of attendees at the lunchtime Bible study. "We had one, eighty-one," is the response shouted back. What?! Everyone can obviously see that there were not over 100 people at the Bible study! There are

barely 181 chairs even set up in the room, and less than half of the chairs are filled! This quy can't count!

An explanation is then provided for the count. "It was not stated that we had one hundred, eighty-one people here. But, we had one, eighty-one. There are 81 persons in the room. Plus, the Lord is here! And, since 'the LORD is one' and He comes first, we had One, eighty-one today." Tricky! Tricky! Leave it up to a preacher to count like that!

While that is a silly way to count those in attendance, the truth is that the Bible teaches us to "count" those who are present in that fashion. "What? You can't be serious!"

When Jesus was speaking about the matter of church discipline and the responsibility to "tell it to the church" and for the church to take collective action, He concluded His comments by laying out this principle, "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:15-20). Jesus affirmed that when believers are "gathered together" by His authority to do exactly as He wills us to do, He is there. If there are three persons, then the count is One (Jesus), three. Or you could write it 1(3).

Near the end of the New Testament, the opposite viewpoint of this "counting method" is affirmed. The apostle John wrote, "Anyone who goes too far and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God; the one who abides in the teaching, he has both the Father and the Son..." (2 John

> 9-10). Contrast this with Jesus' teaching in Matthew 18. Wherever two or three are gathered together, but are gathered to teach, to hear, to adhere to, to abide in a doctrine other than the doctrine of Christ, the Lord is not there. If there are three persons present, then the count is Zero (no Jesus), three. Or you could write it 0(3).

The first number is the one that matters. The presence of the Lord is the ONE that matters! But, the Lord is only present if the group of Christians is (1) gathered to DO His will and (2) gathered to TEACH and ABIDE in His doctrine. If both of those are true, the ONE Lord is there. But, if either of them is not true, the Lord is NOT there. In mathematics, 1(3) still equals 3. But, 0(3) equals 0. Think about that! If a group does not teach His doctrine, abide in His doctrine and practice His doctrine, then the Lord (the ONE that matters) is not present! We need to count the way He counts!

The Bible teaches us to "count" those who are present in that fashion.

# Living in Harmony with God

I saw a grandfather holding his grandson. The man was standing with his arms holding the child. On the man's face you could see complete contentment. The boy had melted onto his grandfather's shoulder. His eyes were open. He was perfectly still. It appeared as though he had no cares

or worries. He was just happy about where he was. Both were exactly where they wanted to be. What a beautiful picture of two lives in harmony.

This is not unlike some of the images that the Bible uses to describe God's relationship with mankind. "When Israel was a youth I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son... Yet it is I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them in My arms... I led them with cords of a man, with bonds of love, And I be-

came to them as one who lifts the yoke from their jaws; And I bent down and fed them" (Hos. 11:1-4). This passage serves to contrast God's care with the disobedience of Israel. We can see the tenderness of God in this description.

We see this also in Jesus' teaching. "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, the way a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were unwilling" (Matt. 23:37). We see the care and concern of God contrasted with a hard-hearted people. God used eagles to describe this in Moses' day. "He found him in a desert land, And in the howling waste of a wilderness; He encircled him, He cared for him, He guarded him as the pupil of His eye. Like an eagle that stirs up its nest, That hovers over its young, He spread His wings and caught them, He carried them on His pinions. The LORD alone guided him..." (Deut. 32:10-12). These passages point to the type of relationship that God wants.

It is obvious that He was willing to pay the price to have this relationship restored after man's sin. "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). God wants that close relationship with us. Many of us want it and have it. When we walk in obedience, we have what so many before us have missed out on. "For you were formerly dark-

ness, but now you are Light in the Lord; walk as children of Light (for the fruit of the Light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth), trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord" (Eph. 5:8-10). God still sees us as His dear children. God wants to live in harmony with us. The only thing standing in the way of that relationship is us. We impede such great blessings by our own childish stubbornness. We must surrender, put away our self-will and walk in obedience. Then, we can live in harmony with God of this world. Then, we can be perfectly content and exactly where we both want to be.

# Articles Published in PBL Family News Emails Last Week

### Just ask!

It is interesting to note various parallels between Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7) and his half-brother's epistle near the end of our New Testaments (the book of James). One such parallel is on the word "ask." Five times in Matthew 7, Jesus emphasized the need for God's people to "ask" (7:7-11). A similar emphasis is found in chapters one and four of James.

First, we must learn the need to "ask" (Jas. 4:2). Second, we must learn to "keep on asking," as accentuated by the Greek present tense (1:5). Third, we must properly direct our request and "ask of God" (1:5). Fourth, we must "ask in

faith, with no doubting," having absolute confi-

dence in the power and willingness of the One of whom we ask (1:6). Fifth, we must not "ask amiss," with the wrong motives and for fleshly purposes (4:3).

Jesus said, "Ask, and it will be given to you" (Matt. 7:7), affirming that the "Father who is in heaven [will] give good things to those who ask Him!" (7:11). Do you believe it? Just ask! -DS


