Leader is our Lord, and the Bible has so many verses emphasizing this truth. Paul said, "imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ" (1 Cor. 11:1). Peter said, "Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps" (1 Pet. 2:21). A good way to look at this is to think about the path our Leader has taken and where He is now. If we keep following Him, imitating Him, we shall someday be where He is now. The leader of the game could sometimes make it too difficult to follow him. Obviously, Jesus is not this way, but leaders in the church and in our homes can easily make this mistake. I was the youngest of the four children in our family and the youngest when a large number of cousins were part of the game. The best leaders never forgot what it was like when they were younger and with great compassion made it challenging and yet enjoyable for those who had less ability than

> many. We need to thank God for godly, caring and compassionate leaders in the body of Jesus.

**Strong leaders** er when there are many strong followers.

There were times when those who were not the leader, but who were ahead of you in the line, did not follower the leader. They took it on themselves to get in charge of the game. When this happened, the game fell apart. Think of how this applies to spiritual leaders and followers in our day. It also emphasizes how important it is to be a good follower.

This month we are focusing our attention on becoming stronger leaders. Parents lead, elders lead, older brothers and sisters lead, deacons lead as do teachers and preachers. You may not see yourself as a leader, but rest assured others are watching you. The important thing is for us to never forget the one who is the Leader of all of us.

Isn't it rather amazing what lesson you can learn even as a child which helps you throughout all your life!

# The Ephesians, Saved By Grace

Grace alone,

not a Biblical

concept.

It is a popular idea that we are saved by grace alone. "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph. 2:8-9). This passage in Paul's letter to the Ephesians is used to support

that teaching. What it doesn't say is that they were saved by grace alone. Further looking into the context reveals a more detailed picture. We can determine from Scripture how they were saved and what was involved in their salvation. By examining the Ephesians, popular idea but we can understand how people are saved by grace.

Looking at the context of the letter, we see that they heard the word of truth. "In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of

your salvation—having also believed" (Eph. 1:13). They heard the message that has the power to save (Rom. 1:16). If one is to be saved by grace, he must hear and learn the gospel in order to know God's will. This same passage clearly states that they also believed the truth, "having also believed." They had to hear in order to believe (Rom. 10:17). Believing the truth is essential to salvation (John 8:24; Heb. 11:6; Mark 16:16).

When we look into the context of the New Testament, specifically Acts and the story of their conversion, we learn more details about the Ephesians. "This became known to all, both Jews and Greeks, who lived in Ephesus; and fear fell upon them all and the name of the Lord Jesus was being magnified. Many also of those who had believed kept coming, confessing and disclosing their practices. And many of those who practiced magic brought their books together and began burning them in the sight of everyone; and they counted up the price of them and found it fifty thousand pieces of silver. So,

> the word of the Lord was growing mightily and prevailing" (Acts 19:17-20). Repentance is "to change one's mind or purpose" always in the NT, involving a change for the better and repentance from sin, except in Luke 17:3-4. The gospel changed the lives of many in Ephesus. They turned completely in their way of life. Though they had once practiced magical arts, witchcraft, etc., they showed repentance in a bonfire that cost 50,000 pieces of silver.

We see that they were baptized. "When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 19:5). To be saved by grace, one must be a penitent believer who is then baptized for the remission of sins (Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38). Being saved by grace includes being saved by baptism (1 Pet. 3:21). They had to overcome and remain faithful as we do today (Rev. 2:7). Being saved by grace alone is a popular idea. The Ephesians show us that it is not a Biblical concept. Let's let their example help us in our walk today.

# Articles Published in PBL Family News Emails Last Week

### The "Cone of Uncertainty"

Those who live along a southern coast know about the "Cone of Uncertainty." It starts to appear as the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) tracks a storm system through the tropics. The cone is intended to represent "the probable path of the storm center," showing its WHERE and WHEN over the next several days (or at least the estimated general area).

Do you wish that the coming of Jesus had a "cone of uncertainty," which would depict the expected WHERE and WHEN of the Lord's return? "Well, it looks like He could be here on Friday at 2:00 a.m." How would that change your life (especially on Thursday)?

The reality is that we know the WHERE – everywhere on earth (1 Thess. 4:3-17; John 5:28-29; Rev. 1:5). So, it doesn't matter if we're on the coast, in the mountains or on the prairie. But, the WHEN could be any time! God's cone shows His impending return...every single day. Have you made all of your preparations? There are no actual cones or warning signs! – DS



So, there's Bible class on Sunday mornings and Bible class on Wednesday nights. There's worship on Sunday mornings and worship on Sunday nights. There are various other events (for the whole church or certain segments of the church) a couple times during the month. Then, there may be certain "favors" that deacons or elders or members ask to be done.



"You know what," some members have been known to say, "that's just too much. I don't have time for all of this. This is getting pretty inconvenient. We need to cut back on this church stuff."

Friends, what are we allowing (and, more accurately, intentionally planning) to dominate our schedules? Even if you added up all of the things mentioned in the first paragraph (and round it up), that might (at the v-e-r-y most) reach 7-8 hours per week for "church stuff." That's barely 4% of your week. Friend, is that too much time to give to God? Do you need to cut that back? Let's each one honestly evaluate (1) how we view "church stuff" and (2) how much we are actually doing for Him. – DS
