# **Two Philosophies of Preaching**

The clarity of the message of every prophet of God stands in marked contrast to much of the preaching done today. While it might be true that some have been too harsh in their preaching throughout all the centuries, so much of the preaching we hear today is far removed from the kind of preaching

given by God to His people by His prophets.

God's instruction to Isaiah could not be mis-**Preaching should** understood. "Cry aloud, spare not; lift up your voice like a trumpet; tell My people their transgression, and the house of Jacob their sins" (Isa. 58:1). God's people were clothed in complacency and outwardly involved in worshiping God. Isaiah specifically mentions specific acts of worship-multitudes of sacrifices, burnt offerings, the observance of the Sabbath

and monthly feast days, praying to God with outspread hands, assemblies of sacred meetings, the burning of incense and many prayers (Isa. 1:11-15). However, there was no leader among them who openly confronted their sinful hearts. This is why God told Isaiah to raise his voice with the astounding clarity of a trumpet and openly address their sinful complacency.

Albert Barnes, in his commentary about the commission God gave to Isaiah, describes the kind of preaching God wanted Isaiah and preachers today to do. "Speak loud and distinctly, so that the language of reproof may be heard. The sense is, the people are insensible and stupid. They need something to rouse them to a sense of their guilt. Go and proclaim it so that all may hear. Speak not in whispers; speak not to a part, but speak so earnestly that their attention will be arrested, and so that all shall hear."

Our culture, especially among the younger generation, is characterized by conversations in a non-confrontational

> manner. This concept has become part of the philosophy in pulpits throughout the land. Where is that voice in the wilderness of the forerunner sent by God that openly addresses the evil in his world? John lived among a generation of vipers and unashamedly cried out against open immorality. "It is not lawful for you to have your brother Philip's wife." A question which should be asked in churches in America is,

"How long has it been since you last heard a message with such clarity about marriage and divorce in the pulpit?"

Preaching has changed. Far too many preachers are like the religious leaders in Isaiah's day. Every preacher today should solemnly read God's charge to Isaiah. The reality is that the sophistry of human wisdom has become the norm. The world will never be truly converted to Christ without upsetting the souls of those immersed in complacency. Preaching should never be designed to gain the approval of men, but of God!

We have heard the story so often (and even some of the misinformation that is frequently associated with it) that we may not stop to consider the marvel of the event and the truly unusual things that transpired when those wise men (or magi) came to find By David Sproule the "King of the Jews."

First, consider the setting. Jesus was not depicted as a

baby, still lying in a "manger" or feeding trough of the animals (Luke 2:7). The family was now in a "house" (Matt. 2:11). The wise men told Herod "what time the star appeared," which may have placed the age of Jesus as old as two years of age (Matt. 2:7, 16). He wasn't a newborn or an infant anymore.

Next, consider the men. They are called

"wise men" (Matt. 2:1, NKJV, ESV) or "magi" (NASB). They are not identified as "three kings." They had traveled "from the East"—probably from the region of Persia, hundreds of miles away, requiring multiple weeks to complete. These men were not Jews coming to visit their Jewish homeland. These men were Gentile priests or philosophers-religious men and studied men, but not servants of the one true God.

Contemplate what they journeyed so far and so long to do on that day. They did not come to feast in the palace of an earthly king. They did not come to receive the royal welcome and royal treatment of a great empire. Their sole purpose was "to worship Him" (Matt. 2:2). To worship who? A "young Child" (2:8, 9, 11). Think about that.

They traveled hundreds of miles for maybe even a month to worship...a child. They sought diligently for this child...to worship Him. They rejoiced with exceeding great joy at the prospect of worshiping...a child. They fell down on the

> ground in humble submission to worship...a child. They opened their treasures and gave valuable gifts to a child...to worship Him. Grown men prostrating themselves and worshiping a child. Why? Because even they knew who this Child was and they knew He was worthy of all that it would take for them to come and worship Him! What a glorious scene!

Do you know that you know a million times more about Jesus than those "wise men" did? How "wise" does that make you? You have the fullness of the revelation of God telling you who He is, what He did and what He wants. What an immeasurably profound blessing! You get to worship (not just a child) the risen Savior, who died on the cross for you, opening the way to heaven for you! Do you mind traveling to do that? Do you rejoice with exceeding great joy to do that? Do you humbly submit yourself to do that? Do you open your treasures to do that? He is worthy! Oh, so worthy!

# **Filling the Void**

Aristotle stated, "Nature abhors a vacuum." A perfect vacuum is space that contains no matter. This is an impossibility in nature or even a lab. Consider yourself as a spiritual vessel for a moment. The Bible already uses that analogy in several passages (2 Tim. 2:20; Rom. 9:20-21). What would

happen if you stopped filling yourself with God? Would your

spiritual reserve eventually just empty and be void of any contents? Sometimes we deceive ourselves thinking that way. We think to ourselves, "I may not You decide if you be reading, praying or practicing any of the other spiritual disciplines but at least I'm not doing bad things." We like to think that we are neutral and doing no harm. One of the problems of creating a perfect vacuum in a lab is isolating that empty space from any outside influence.

The same is true for us. In reality, we are not empty vessels doing no harm. If we are not filling the void of our souls with the influence of God, it will get filled with the influence of the world. Try one of these exercises and see what it says about what we are filling ourselves with. Look into your internet history and see what has been on your mind most. Ask friends or co-workers to tell you what they think is most important to you. Sometimes what others perceive of us is closer to reality than the lies we sell ourselves. If you really want to get introspective, download the app Quality Time, and let it track which apps you use most. The old saying, "Time will tell," is in this case, "Time will tell on you." Jesus said it this way, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21).

There are ways that we can be purposeful in filling ourselves up with God. An empty vessel will get filled, but a full vessel has no need of anything. We need to fill ourselves with

> God's wisdom and direction. We can do that by s-l-ow-l-y reading the Bible-not doing it to check it off the list but actually thinking about what we are reading. We should be meditating and praying about the truths that are there. We can passively listen to it as we drive. Let it be the background or soundtrack to our commute. We can spend time studying with fellow brothers and sisters. We all need be doing it.

Why not incorporate someone else into the routine? We also need to fill ourselves up with the practice of God's word. We need to ask ourselves what we are doing to put what we learn into play in our lives and in our families. We can be an influence to help keep other vessels full. "Iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (Prov. 27:17).

A perfect vacuum is rare, and a perfect person is rarer still. Do not let the outside influence us. You decide if you will be a vessel of honor or dishonor. Stay pressurized with God.

#### "The Most High rules in the kingdom of men"

Do you suppose that the Jews respected Nebuchadnezzar, when he besieged their home nation of Judah, when he took them captive and when he carried them back to Babylon as his prisoners of war? Yet, it is under his rule as tyrant king that the Lord revealed to him and to His people "that the Most

High rules in the kingdom of men, and gives it to whomever He chooses" (Dan. 4:17, 25, 32). The primary lesson was for that arrogant man to know his place in the affairs of the Most High God. But, there is also a lesson for every man, including us today.

God wanted Nebuchadnezzar to "know...know...know... know" (4:17, 25, 26, 32) that "Heaven rules" (4:26). No matter who is on the throne or in leadership, we must always remember who is on the Most High throne! And He is the one who placed those on "earthly thrones" in those positions of leadership. Thus, the Most High God deserves our submission and our respect. But, so does the earthly leader, no matter who he/she is (Rom. 13:1-7; 1 Pet. 2:13-17). - DS

#### Commit ourselves to God like Jesus did

The apostle Peter recounts how Jesus continually suffered and was reviled at the hands of His enemies, and then He reveals what Jesus did in response—He kept on committing Himself (the force of the verb tense) to God (1 Pet. 2:23). Two chapters later, Peter was continuing to address the present reality of the followers of Christ also continually suffering and being

> reviled at the hands of their enemies. He called upon them to respond as Jesus did-keep on committing (the force of the verb tense) your souls to God (1 Pet. 4:19).

> So, what does it look like to keep on committing your soul to God? Peter added these three

words: "in doing good" (4:19). Peter had emphasized doing good in the face of evil throughout the book (2:12, 14, 15, 20; 3:6, 11, 16, 17). While the world will treat you with contempt, in an effort to get you to stop "doing good," the will of God is for us to use that as an opportunity to do even more good...for Him! Don't let the world control you! Respond to their evil like Jesus did-keep on committing yourself to God by keeping on doing good! – DS
