Update on the Churches in Abaco and Grand Bahama

A Great Door of Opportunity—Marsh Harbour Relief

The last four months have been filled with challenges to meet the needs of brethren. We focused our work initially on three places—Eight Mile Rock and Freeport on Grand Baha-

ma Island, having met almost all of their primary needs. In addition, we have sent supplies to Nassau where many of the Christians from Abaco took refuge from the storm.

The port in Marsh Harbour has just opened and we have turned much of our attention to that area. The picture on this page shows how the two buildings of the

church were some of the only buildings not completely leveled by the 180+ MPH winds. The picture shows the annex (the building with part of the white roof remaining) and the church building with a heavily damaged roof and no windows or doors. Several months of help lie before us, as we try to bring normality of those who have lost so much.

One of the first problems to be solved was where to store what is sent until it can be used. In situations like this, there is always the danger of looting. That problem has been solved by purchasing two 40-foot containers, which have been shipped and now are situated beside the church building.

With the opening of the port we can more easily help the

South Abaco church, which is 20 miles south of Marsh Harbour. We have purchased another container to be used there.

As these members continue to return to Marsh Harbour, we will become even more involved in meeting their needs.

The homes of these members were severely damaged by Dorian, so material and building supplies were part of that

first shipment. As we sent teams to help repair homes in Freeport, we plan to do the same in Marsh Harbour. Please let us know if you have the skills and willingness to spend at least a week in Marsh Harbour.

We stand amazed at how so many problems are being solved. We recognized we would need someone there full-time to oversee this reconstruction. We have hired Ben Allen (he is

seated on the right at a recent planning session), a member at Marsh Harbour, to devote the next year in seeing that this work is done. He is a highly respected contractor and we have great confidence in him. He will em-



ploy other Bahamians to help, so that the work will not be totally dependent on American workers and can be on-going.

The pallets have arrived (more have been shipped and soon will be at the wharves) and food and other supplies are already being distributed. Please take time to look at the photos and even more importantly please pray for all that is being done. God has used brethren throughout our land to meet the needs of the suffering saints. We thank God for your willingness to be part of His work.
