Do You Have a Secret Life, Hidden from Others?

Isn't it remarkable how the use of smart phones has changed news reporting? It seems that whenever there is a crisis, someone takes their phone and starts videoing. When it is placed on social media, it can almost immediately go viral. Secrets are revealed which just a few years ago would be hidden. The same is true of those times when microphones of politicians are accidentally left open, and we hear the private views of our leaders. It seems that there are no secrets anymore.

However, there is an even greater aspect of this matter. The last verse of Ecclesiastes says, "For God will bring every work into judgment, including every secret thing, whether good or evil." Look carefully at what is said—every work and every secret thing when we stand before the great throne of judgment. "And the dead were judged according to their works, but the things which were written in the books" (Rev. 20:12). Nothing will be hidden in that day.

Think about the possibility of what could happen in many homes in America. When voices are raised in confrontation between husband and wives, are things said which could easily be captured on cell phones? What if your husband or wife captured the words you said to them? What if that out-

burst of anger were no longer hidden? If you had known it was being recorded, would you have spoken what you said? How would others view you if they could view you at times like this? You walked away from that time thinking it was over for it was not public and it was not recorded. You were wrong. Heaven's "smart phone" captured it, and God will bring every secret thing into judgment.

The same is true of all relationships in our homes. The conversation between parents and children could be captured. Would you as a mother or father, or a son or daughter, be the same if you knew it was being recorded? It is—every secret thing will be part of the final judgment.

What about whispered spreading of gossip or destructive speech? That which is seemingly secret or parts of private messaging or conversation is being "recorded"—every secret thing.

Now there is the other aspect of Solomon's final words. It is not just the "secret evil" which we have done which will be involved. Every "secret good" we have done will be remembered on that day. There is no need to reveal what we are doing so others will think we are righteous. Every cup of cold water given to others is "recorded."

Never forget that God knows it all—all the good and all the evil. There is a "heavenly smart phone."

At the final judgment, there is nothing hidden which will not be revealed

"I Perceive That You Are Very Religious"

On his second missionary journey, the apostle Paul came to the city of Athens. Perhaps if Dorothy had been traveling with Paul on this journey, she might have said, "Toto, I have a feeling we're not in Jerusalem anymore." While Paul had preached in pagan cities before, Athens was unique.

When Paul arrived in Athens, "he saw the city was full of idols" (Acts 17:16). How full was it? Pliny, a Roman author and civil officer of the late first century, wrote that there were over 30,000 public idols in Athens. Think about that number. That's not including any private idols that people had in their homes. It is estimated that this was more idols than the rest of Greece combined. Amazingly, the population of Athens was only 10,000 people. Paul saw the city was "full of idols"—30,000 idols and only 10,000 people.

When Paul stood up on Mars Hill to preach to these idolatrous folks about "The Unknown God," he began by saying, "I perceive that in all things you are very religious" (17:22). Think about that statement. Were these people right with God? Certainly not! They didn't even know Him! But, Paul still concluded that they were "very religious." Is it enough to be "religious," or does God expect more from us?

In Acts 10, we find a man who was also very religious.

He was "a devout man and one who feared God with all his household, who gave alms generously to the people, and prayed to God always" (10:1-2). But, still, even he was not right with God and needed to learn and make changes (including working "righteousness," as defined by God) to be "accepted by Him" (10:35). Being religious was not enough!

Jesus Himself envisioned the day of judgment when "many" would say to Him, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?" (Matt. 7:22). These are very religious folks. They are so much "closer" to the Lord than the idolatrous (but religious) folks in Athens and even the Gentile (but religious) centurion. Still, even though they claimed to be doing things for the Lord "in His name," they were not right with Him at all. At the judgment, Jesus will say to them, "I never knew you; depart from Me" (7:23).

Question #1: Are you religious? Question #2: Is that enough? Question #3: What have we convinced ourselves is "enough" religion to "please the Lord" and "make it to heaven" (just "enough" to get by)? Friends, "being religious"—yes, even being "very religious"—is not what God is looking for! He is looking for us to "do" His will (Matt. 7:21) and to be "always abounding in the work of the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58). To hear "well done" (Matt. 25:21) requires faithfully doing and serving!

Is it enough to be "religious," or does God expect more from us?

The Church in All Her Glory

Paul writes about the sacrifice of Christ, “that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory” (Eph. 5:26-27). That task is something we must continue to do—maintaining the church in all her glory.

The divine contribution and foundation of the church has been laid. It was the Lord that pitched the divine sanctuary (Heb. 8:2). Christ is the Head of it (Col. 1:18). Christ is the founder and builder (1 Cor. 3:11; Matt. 16:18). It is bought with His blood (Acts 20:28). The purpose is to glorify God (Eph. 3:21) and to save (Eph. 5:23; Acts 2:47). These are things that no human institution or deviant form of righteousness and holiness could ever perform.

We play a part in her continued glory. Our contribution includes living as sanctified members (Eph 5:26; 1 Cor 1:2). Christ must be sanctified in us (1 Pet. 3:15). We must seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matt. 6:33). We must be those who are always abounding in the work of the Lord (1 Cor. 15:38). We must “hate evil and cling to what is good” (Rom. 12:9). Part of that process is putting to death the fleshly. “Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry” (Col. 3:5). We must put aside “anger, wrath, malice, slan-

der, and abusive speech from your mouth” (Col. 3:8). Having put away those things, we are to remain diligent to keep them at bay in our hearts and minds. As God’s elect, we are to “put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity” (Col. 3:12-14). We all benefit from being in a family where everyone is striving to be like Christ in these ways. The ultimate purpose is also to maintain the glory of His church.

We must do our part to maintain her glory!

There are things that we must not allow into our hearts and assemblies. Things that would tarnish the glory that God desires. Those things are indifference (Rev. 3:16), worldliness (1 John 2:15-17), division (1 Cor. 12:25), compromise (Gal. 1:10), irreverence in worship (1 Cor. 11:20-22), and irregularity assembling with the saints (Heb. 10:25). The glory and purity of the church must be maintained in our hearts. As the Hebrew writer warns, “Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living God. But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called ‘Today,’ so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin” (Heb. 3:12-13). The love and desire to present the church without spot or wrinkle must be in us as it is in Christ.

“My treasures are laid somewhere beyond the blue”

There is certainly nothing wrong with having earthly treasures, but that is not the same thing as “laying up treasures.” The act of “laying up treasures” is a deliberate and persistent effort to (1) focus one’s life in a particular direction, (2) devote one’s time and effort toward a particular end, and (3) seek the reward that comes from these efforts.

Jesus makes it clear that there are only two options in the arena of “laying up treasures.” One either “lays up treasure for himself” (Luke 12:21) “on earth” (Matt. 6:19) (think about the limited, temporal and self-focused nature of those treasures) OR he is “rich toward God” (Luke 12:21) and lays up “treasures in heaven” (Matt. 6:20) (think about the bountiful, eternal and Jesus-focused nature of those treasures).

Where is “your treasure” (Matt. 6:21)? Jesus said that determining the answer to that question will tell you everything about yourself. Are your treasures really laid up in heaven? – DS



Always looking for some new doctrine

There was something that God thought was pertinent for man to know throughout the ages about the Athenians. It was not something that was flattering by any means, but a grave concern in the eyes of God—enough to inspire Luke to write about it. The Athenians wanted to hear Paul’s so-called “new doctrine,” because “all the Athenians and the foreigners who were there spent their time in nothing else but either to tell or to hear some new thing” (Acts 17:21).

There are people today (in and out of the church) who are reminiscent of the Athenians. They are fascinated by the idea of finding a “new” teaching in the Bible, which has never been discovered, or they find great satisfaction in discovering how the Bible really doesn’t teach some “old” truth but actually can be understood in some “new” way.

God put Acts 17:21 in the Bible to warn us about seeking after or buying into “new” doctrines. When God’s people strayed from Him 2,600 years ago, He called them to “seek the old paths” (Jer. 6:16). That’s still sage advice for us today (cf. 2 Tim. 1:13)! – DS

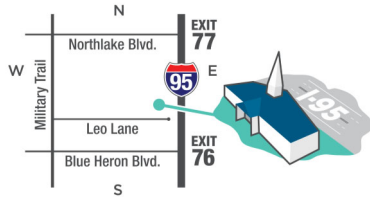
