Judging According to Appearance

As you make

other's worth,

look on the

inside!

That deceitful

serpent lures us

in a variety of

lust of the flesh

Jesus commanded us to judge when He said, "Judge not according to appearance, but judge with righteous judgment" (John 7:24). When we judge according to appearance, we can easily miss the real truth.

God told Samuel to go to the house of Jesse to anoint the new king to replace evil

King Saul, and he failed to understand this truth. When Samuel saw Eliab, Jesse's firstborn, he said, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before him" (1 Sam. 16:6). The pearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (16:7). God rejected seven sons of Jesse until David, the youngest was chosen as the next king.

Consider how easily hypocrites use this weakness of judging by appearance to deceive. Jesus described hypocrites in various ways to call attention to how they seek to hide their evil hearts by appearing to be holy. "Woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you cleanse the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of extortion and selfindulgence" (Matt 23:25). He also described them as being like beautifully adorned tombs, "...but inside are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness" (Matt. 23:27-28). They prayed long prayers standing visibly on street corners. They gave great sums to help the needy but not until they had sounded the trumpet to call attention to themselves. Judge not according to appearances!

Some want to judge a church by how many notable people attend. Compare the ornate temples of the first centu-

ries with the places Christians met, often in secrecy. "You see your calling, brethren, that not many wise Lord responded to Samuel, "Do not look at his ap- judgments about according to the flesh, not many mighty, are called. But God has chosen the foolish things of the world..." (1 Cor. 1:26-27). The Lord also said, "Listen my beloved brethren: Has not God chosen the poor of this world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom which He promised to those who love Him" (Jas. 2:5).

> So, when you look at others remember what Samuel forgot—man looks at the outward appearance, but God looks at the heart. A person's true nature is not determined solely by his outward appearance as a Christian. Remember that Jesus judges us by how we regard the least in the kingdom (Matt. 25:40). Righteousness is determined by the heart of a man, not by how he makes himself to appear.

> As you make judgments about other's worth, use righteous judgments—look on the inside!

Is It Worth It?

For some reason, we sometimes try to justify certain behaviors and think we will "be ok" and that God will "be ok" with us. Unfortunately, that is what "the flesh" does and how "the devil" works—he deceives us into thinking according to "the flesh" and living according to "the flesh."

God issues warning after warning against giving into and flirting with our fleshly desires. One such passage is in Galatians 5:19-21. In this text, the Lord describes some manifestations of "the works of the flesh." It is not that these "works" are difficult to identify. He says that they are "evident"—clearly identifiable in one's life and, thus, avoidable (if one ways to fulfill the would so choose). They are described as "the works of the flesh" to emphasize that these are the product

of the devil's influence in our lives (and not the Savior's). As the enemy of God, that deceitful serpent (2 Cor. 11:3) lures us in a variety of ways to "fulfill the lust of the flesh" (Gal. 5:16).

Our loving Lord is quick to alert us to the consequences of practicing such things. It's interesting that Galatians 5:21 uses the expressions "and the like" and then "such things." This was not intended to be an exhaustive list of all sinful deeds, but it would include anything that was "like" them, embracing "every form of evil" (1 Thess. 5:22). Those who engage

in these activities "will not inherit the kingdom of God." There are eternal consequences for choices that we make on this earth. We must recognize that we jeopardize our home in heaven when we give into works of the flesh.

There are sexual sins, such as adultery, fornication, impurity, lewdness, sensuality (5:19), and even homosexuality (1 Cor. 6:9). Is it worth it to engage in these acts when God says that I "will not inherit the kingdom of God" if I do?

> There are religious sins, such as idolatry and sorcery (5:20), which are in direct violation of the one true God. Is it worth it when God says that I "will not inherit the kingdom of God" if I do these things?

> There are interpersonal sins that involve how I feel or act towards others, such as hatred, strife, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, factions, envy (5:20-21), even ex-

tortion (1 Cor. 6:10). Is it worth it to engage in these when God says that I "will not inherit the kingdom of God" if I do?

There are unrestrained sins, such as drunkenness and revelries (5:21). Is it worth it to engage in these acts when God says that I "will not inherit the kingdom of God" if I do?

Too often, we try to justify certain behaviors and think they will "be ok" and God will "be ok" with us. Read the New Testament. God warns against such choices over and over. Is it really worth losing heaven to fulfill these fleshly desires?

Consider Your Influence

We have an ability that we may not be using effectively for Christ. In His Sermon on the Mount, He described it as salt and light (Matt. 5:13-16). We should be very concerned about our influence. The Lord's work consists of influencing people in God's direction (Col. 1:28). Influence comes down to a

matter of communication, both verbal or non-verbal. This includes our online communication. Sometimes, we are guilty of neglecting principles of influence and communication. Here are three to consider.

First, we need to examine self before influencing others. The most significant change starts with self. The "inside out" approach in influencing others is best. Jesus illustrates the importance of self-examination with the story of a man with a beam in his eye trying to help a man with a splinter (Matt. 7:3-5). Paul wrote, "I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified" (1 Cor. 9:27). In doing this, we must model the conduct we wish to encourage in others (Acts 20:34-35; 1 Cor. 11:1).

Second, we should try to understand where people are coming from and advise with compassion. It is true that in some cases we have to earn the right to be heard by showing

ourselves to be genuinely concerned about the other person. We can often be sympathetic to the situations of others. To be able to be empathetic is more influential. We need to be able to understand the real needs people have. Often a grumpy disposition is less about who they are and more about what they are struggling with. This is not an excuse, but understanding it changes how we approach them. Just telling them to stop being grumpy won't help. If we help them deal with what is

making them grumpy, that gets to the source. Understanding needs to go before being understood (Phil. 2:4). Jesus, the Master Teacher, saw people with His perfect understanding and compassion (Matt. 9:36).

Lastly, a good example is not enough. We must communicate. Character and compassion are not enough to communicate the truth of the gospel, it takes words (Eph. 1:13; Acts 11:13-14; Rom. 10:17).

The gospel is of no benefit if it is not made clear (Col. 4:3-4; Eph 6:19-20). We must strive to balance courage and consideration. We must be courteous as well as candid (Col. 4:5-6). We must communicate. We cannot afford to sacrifice clarity for courtesy. We must be what we ought to be and genuinely seek to understand others. We must "admonish/warn" and "teach" (Col. 1:28). We all have people in our circle of friends that only we can influence. We are their only link to the truth of the gospel. Are we using that influence for the sake of Christ or social and political issues?

"Pardon the language"

Dear fellow Christian, is it really Christ-like to share something on social media but to make a disclaimer about its sinful content? Sometimes we see a video or meme and think it really conveys a message dear to us in an effective manner, but we think that saying, "Pardon the language," exonerates us from sharing un-Christlike speech.

Would that also work and be appropriate if there was other vile content? Suppose we said, "Please pardon the nudity, but the message here is powerful"? Or, "Please pardon the sexual abuse portrayed, but the message here is so impressive"? If I put "a stumbling block in a brother's way" (Rom. 14:13), or if I cause "one of these little ones who [believes in Jesus] to sin/stumble" (Matt. 18:6; Mark 9:42), I myself sin. If I look like the world in my posts (Rom. 12:2), then the world cannot see Christ through me (1 Cor. 11:1).

EVERYTHING I do must portray Jesus, purity and holiness (Gal. 2:20; 1 Tim. 4:12; 1 Pet. 2:11-12). While I might ask others to "pardon" my un-Christlike shares, do I think He will "pardon" me? – DS

Aren't you glad you're made in God's image?

God is all-powerful! When it came to His creation, He could have created you/me/us/mankind in any image that He wanted! He could have made us in the image of the llama or the monkey. But, He didn't! He could have made everyone in the image of Shaquille O'Neal or Jennifer Lopez. But, He didn't!

He could have made everyone in the image of your second-grade teacher or your car mechanic. But, He didn't! He made us...in His own image!!!

Obviously, this is not dealing with a physical image but a spiritual one. No other created thing has been made "in the image of

God" (Gen. 1:26-27), having been given the ability to reason (Isa. 1:18; Rom. 1:20), the ability to know and to choose between right and wrong (Josh. 24:15; 1 Tim. 2:4; Rom. 12:1-2), the natural inclination to seek and to worship God (Acts 17:25-31; Psa. 19:1). But, that which sets us apart completely from all other creatures is the immortal soul that our Father has given to us (Matt. 10:28; Ecc. 12:7; Luke 12:20; Heb. 12:9).

Every person, without exception, is made in the image of God! Are we living like it? – DS


