Who Is the Father of Your Child?

There are hundreds of churches around the world which are struggling because of a lack of leadership. Every year there are preachers who decide to no longer preach and many others who, because of failing health or advanced age, no longer stand as God's messengers. Add to this the

fact that death takes many from us. The truth is that the number of preachers who graduate from our colleges and schools of preaching are not replacing those who no longer preach. It is a serious problem in the church.

Consider also the fact that even more churches are suffering because of a lack of qualified elders and deacons. Many congregations which in time past had elders no longer have them. There is a diminishing number of men who take seriously the work of serving as deacons. How has all of this come about?

The Lord's plan is very simple. It is for godly parents to fully understand their place in rearing their children to lead His people. We think of our children as being ours, but such is far from the truth. The Jews took what they thought were their children and actually sacrificed them to idols. How did God see this? "You have slain My children and offered them up" (Ezek. 16:21). Our children are not ours but His. They are God's before He gives them to us. "Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord" (Psa. 127:3). We receive our inheritance from the Lord when we are in our twenties!

Hannah understood this. She was no different from the way many of you were. When in your teens you thought about your future-who you would marry, where you would live and the children you would have. Hannah's plan had not come about, for though she had a husband she had no children and agonized in prayer that she might have them. God heard

her prayer and gave her Samuel. She gave him back to God by giving him up while he was so young. Her his name he was words? "For this child I prayed and the Lord has granted me my petition which I asked of Him. Therefore I also have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives he shall be lent to the Lord" (1 Sam. 1:27-28).

The leadership problem facing the church is serve God. serious because we have lost sight of His plan. It has come about because we no longer see our children like those in the past saw their children. Parents, I urge you to change your view of those precious little ones in your home. They are not your children but His. How we view them drastically changes how we raise them. Every time Hannah called Samuel by name (his name means "a gift from God"), he was reminded of the fact that God had given him to Hannah so that she could give him back to God! "I Give You All of Me"

Popular love songs often have lyrics that are adept at describing a Christian's relationship with his God. Such are some of the words of the chorus of John Legend's "All of Me." Think about these words as if they were written about you and your Savior. "'Cause all of me loves all of you...You're my

end and my beginning, Even when I lose I'm winning, 'Cause I give you all of me, And you give me all of you."

"All of me loves Now, don't get distracted by this popular artist. Think about how these words simply reflect all of you... the words that Jesus used to depict our responsibility You're my end toward our God. In Mark 12:29-30, Jesus said that "the first of all the commandments is...You shall love and my the Lord your God with ALL your heart, with ALL your beginning" soul, with ALL your mind, and with ALL your strength." What does that look like: "ALL of me loves ALL of You, my God!" "I give You all of me, my Savior!"

When we love the Lord with ALL of our heart, ALL of our soul, ALL of our mind and ALL of our strength, WHAT'S LEFT? God is not interested in having "a special place in your heart"—He is interested in having ALL of your heart. This may sound like wishful-thinking or best-case-scenario, but if that's the case, why would the Lord be so emphatic on this point? Even in the Old Testament, Solomon wrote, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep His commandments, For this is man's all" (Ecc. 12:13). This is man's what? This is man's "all"! The WHOLE of man is to love and serve the WHOLE of God!

I must not hold anything back from the Lord in my service, for (think about this!) He did not hold back anything from me! "Lord, I give You all of me." Why? "Because You gave me all of You!" God gave Himself (not someone else) to

> come to this earth (John 1:1-3, 14). God gave Himself (not someone or something else) on the cross (Phil. 2:6-8). God gives me, as His child, the opportunity to even be a "partaker" of His "divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:4). What a thought!

How do I show the Lord (not just in mere words) that "all of me loves all of Him"? How can He know that "I give Him all of me"? It is reflected in my

priorities on this earth (Col. 3:1-3). It is reflected in my sacrifice of self and denunciation of the world (Rom. 12:1-2). It is reflected in my love for and involvement in the church (Matt. 6:33). It is reflected in my worship of Him (Col. 3:16). It is reflected in my daily choices (1 Pet. 2:9-12). It is reflected in my efforts to tell others about Him (1 Cor. 2:1-2).

God alone is worthy of my all! God alone is worthy of such love! I must give Him my all, not for my own sake, but for His own sake! He alone is worthy!

What Is Your Soul Worth?

Who does my soul belong to? Do we take time to examine what we are putting in our souls? We typically eat what we like or is easy. Similarly, we put into our souls what we like or is easy. Have we stopped to think about the demands of our souls and who can rightfully make those demands?

It was God that made man in His image (Gen. 1:26-27). It was God that breathed life into man (Gen. 2:7). God said to Ezekiel, "Behold, all souls are Mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is What is in your Mine" (Ezek. 18:4). As Jesus spoke to the Father, "Yet not as I will, but as You will" (Matt. 26:39). Peter echsoul? oes this idea and asked us to arm ourselves with this submission of the soul. "Therefore, since Christ has suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same purpose, because he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, so as to live the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for the lusts of men, but for the will of God" (1 Pet. 4:1-2). God made us, and it is our duty to submit our will to the will of God.

We need to make sure our soul's desire is not misguided. It is possible in today's culture to do whatever we feel. Feelings and fleshly desires are not a safe guide and lend themselves to guiding us down the wrong path. Paul wrote, "Walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh. For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law" (Gal. 5:16 -18). This idea of flesh versus spirit has at its core the concept of our soul. Which will win out? Or which will we allow to dominate our souls? The battle is that we are spirit in a flesh "tent,"

as Paul would say. So, if we are paying closer attention to the flesh, we have the temptations that are listed in this passage as the "deeds of the flesh." However, if we keep ourselves in tune with what the Spirit teaches, then we are more likely to practice the fruits of the Spirit: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law" (Gal. 5:22-23).

Paul finishes his letter to the church in Thessalonica with these words, "But examine everything carefully; hold fast to that which is good; abstain from every form of evil. Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thess. 5:21-23). It is my prayer that we can maintain this focus on those things which are most important. "For what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" (Mark 8:36-37).

God will do what's right

The Lord told Abraham that He was going to destroy the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah because of their wickedness—specifically because of the sodomy/homosexuality that was being practiced inside those cities (Gen. 18:16-21; Jude 7). Abraham pleaded with the Lord to spare the righteous in those cities and then he drew this conclusion about the Lord, "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?" (Gen. 18:25).


