Two weeks ago, I wrote the first article on the increasing need for preachers to be developed in the church. At that time, I had no plans to write much about this, but the more I have thought about it, the more I see that these matters need to be discussed. You can have a modern "Hannah or Lois or

Eunice," but there is an urgent need for a modern "Eli or Paul" to help develop a modern "Samuel or Timothy."

In past years, parents saw their children as gifts lent to them by God to train them to be lent back to God. These parents were helped by many members of the church who played a part in the development of our youth. This has changed, and the lack of church leaders today is the evidence for this.

young Mark from his hometown to be part of the work in Antioch. Mark became part of the team which first took the gospel throughout the island nation of Cyprus. Mark's mother started the young man in the right direction, but would he have ever developed had not members of the church played a vital role?

Barnabas took another young Christian and helped develop Saul of Tarsus. He likely was not young in age but was young in the faith. As a youth Saul was taught, most likely by

his parents, a vital truth. Paul said, "I myself always strive to have a conscience without offense toward God and men" (Acts 24:16, see also Acts 23:1). This truth enabled those in the church to develop the future apostle. The "young" Christian, Paul, was taken under the wing of the "older" Christian, Barnabas, when the church did not even want Paul to be used by the church (Acts 9:26-27). Later Barnabas traveled

over 150 miles to bring the "young" Christian from Tarsus to help the church in Antioch. There may have never been a Saul without his parents laying the foundation, and there may have never been a Saul without a Barnabas helping develop him.

There are other illustrations which show this truth even more vividly, but let me urge you to look inwardly to see what role you can play in impacting the destiny of the church—not as a parent, but as one who sees the worth of young Mark, or "young" Paul and does all they can. We all can do more!

Thou Shalt Not Steal

There may be some who think that the subject of this article is insensitive or inappropriate. It is not intended to be at all. The purpose is to get us to saturate our thinking and our decisions with God's Word.

Think for a moment how frequently and how strongly God spoke about the sub-

ject of stealing. His clarify on this subject is unequivocal. Think for a moment about what we see happening today. Is there any "stealing" going on that is being publicized widely? Is there any "stealing" going on today

For the last several weeks, what have we seen on the news? Have we seen individuals breaking into a store and walking out with items for which

that is even, by some, being accepted and justified?

they did not pay? Have we seen individuals break, ruin and even burn things that belonged to someone else? Can I ask you a question? Have you heard anyone during those reports explain how the "taking," the "destroying," the "burning" in these particular situations is "understandable" and even "justifiable"? It is certainly easy to get caught up in the emotions of present-day events, but is there ever a time when it is right to do wrong? Is a sin ever not a sin?

Consider for a moment what God says. "You shall not steal" (Ex. 20:15). Two verses earlier, He said it is wrong to

steal someone's life. One verse earlier, He said it is wrong to steal someone's spouse. One verse later, He said it is wrong to steal someone's trust. He puts the same thoughts together again in Leviticus 19: "You shall not steal, nor deal falsely, nor lie to one another...You shall not cheat your neighbor, nor rob him" (19:11, 13). Another person's property must be respected—care and responsibility for that which is another's is essential (Ex. 22:7-27). There's no room for stealing of any kind.

In the New Testament, we are commanded, "Let him who stole steal no longer, but rather let him labor, working with his hands what is good, that he may have something to give him who has need" (Eph. 4:28). There is no room at all in the verse for seeking to justify stealing at any time for any reason. There are eternal ramifications for such actions. Among other sins, those who steal (i.e., "thieves") "will not

inherit the kingdom of God" (1 Cor. 6:9-10). Taking something that is not mine will cost me my soul!

Achan didn't think it would be a big deal to take what was not his in Joshua 7. After all, it was "there for the taking." However, his stealing harmed his nation and destroyed his family. Think about that. There's no justification for stealing!

Wrong is always wrong! There is never an exception to that! Sin is always sin! There is never an exception to that! May God help us to not try to accept it or justify it...ever!

How Strong Is Our Resolve?

Being a Christian in the United States has been convenient in some ways. It was an accepted world view. Not everyone was happy with it, but there was no overt animosity toward Christendom. That convenience has been waning. I have been of the opinion that the benign opinion of the mass-

es toward Christianity wouldn't last. The church was birthed in persecution and hatred. The world's response to the gospel has always ebbed and flowed over time. It is only natural that we would see another shift. Even now congregations are under attack in other countries like Nigeria by radical Islamists. This is from Sylvester Imogo, a brother in Nigeria: "But right now Muslim militia and terrorists have circulated virtually everywhere in the North and South

[Nigeria]. Life for most people is unsafe. Ordinary trips to the market, farms, and other places of economic activities are now dangerous. And this is worsening the state of poverty and suffering. We are living every day at a time and looking forward to the day that God in His Providence would intervene."

What are we doing to prepare ourselves for the future of the church in the U.S.? "For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. You have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood in your striving against sin" (Heb. 12:3-4). Christ is our supreme example in all things. He didn't promise a life free of suffering. He promised an eternal rest after this life. He needed to look forward to the reward, "who for the joy set before Him, endured the cross" (Heb 12:3). We need to strengthen our faith in the small choices, so that when the big things come along, we are already resolved to

In comparison with eternity, the important things we need to focus on right now are not masks, not political affiliation, and not social injustice. Those are all things that would divide the church if we are not careful. The important things right now are these: Am I resolved to follow Christ no matter the cost? Am I resolved to help those around me? Am I resolved to maintain unity and the bond of peace in the church?
