If I Only Had a Bible

While the Bible clearly affirms that it will completely supply us in every aspect of our work for the Lord (2 Tim. 3:16-17), some do not believe it. While the Bible clearly affirms that it contains everything which pertains to life and godliness (2 Pet. 1:3), some do not believe it. Consider the following.

Several years ago in a Bible study with the Jehovah's

Witnesses I asked them, "If I only had a Bible, what would be the odds of me ever becoming a Jehovah's Witness?" Their answer, "I do not think it would ever happen—the odds would be one in a million." Think about the implication of this.

There was no religious group called Jehovah's Witnesses before 1931! The movement was founded by Charles Russell beginning in about 1880.

The very name of the movement and many of the doctrines taught by that religion-the sinfulness of blood transfusion, the teaching that only 144,000 will go to heaven, internal structure of the movement centered around the Watchtower in Brooklyn, etc.-did not exist until Charles Russell spread that teaching. If I only had a Bible, there is no way to express the likelihood of one becoming a Witness. It simply would never happen. It takes more than a Bible to be a Witness.

Now apply that to all the religious movements in the

denominational maze of our world. If I only had a Bible, would I wear any denominational name? They are unknown in the Bible as names for God's people. If I only had a Bible, would I be a Mormon? A Seventh-Day Adventist? A Catholic? A Protestant? A Fundamentalist? Add any name of all the other denominations and ask the question, "If I only had a Bible, what would be the odds of me being a _____?"

> It simply could not happen. These names are not found in the Bible, and if I limit myself to using the Bible as the only source revealing God's way, I would never wear these names.

Now expand this concept and apply it to the church organizations and church hierarchies of our day. Apply it to the very acts of worship. Apply it to the diversity of teaching about morality, homosexuality, marriage and divorce. If you only had a Bible,

what would you be religiously? What name would you wear? When and how would you worship? What would be the standard of morality you would embrace?

One more thought. When the church began and the Bible was written, what did the church look like? Remember they only had a Bible, and they became the church Jesus established. The only way denominations can exist is for them to teach more or teach less than the Bible teaches. So, follow only the Bible religiously. That is all you need to find God.



21 Biblical Meditations During Communion (Part 1 of 4)

The most meaningful part of a Christian's week is when He communes with His Savior every Lord's Day (Matt. 26:29; 1 Cor. 10:16). The Lord knew what He was doing (obviously) when He instructed His church to observe the Lord's Supper every first day of By David Sproule the week (Acts 2:42; 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:20;

16:2). As with all of His instructions, partaking of the Supper every Sunday is not a random command, but purposeful, for He knew that humans need a regular reminder of the most important things, and regular motivation to stay devoted to those most important things. Communing every first day of the week ensures that we stay focused as His people.

But, what do we do when we partake and "do the same thing" week after week? We eat of the

unleavened bread, as He instructed, in order to honor and remember His "body," which was "given" for us (Luke 22:19). But, what do we do as we partake? We drink of the fruit of the vine, as He instructed, in order to honor and remember His "blood," which was "shed" for us (Luke 22:20). But, what do we do as we partake?

Jesus told us that, by partaking and while partaking, we are to do this "in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22:19; 1 Cor. 11:24-25). It is not a meaningless or thoughtless time! It is not a "dead time" in our worship! Our hearts are to be remembering what our Savior did for us!

We are warned very forthrightly of partaking "in an unworthy manner" (1 Cor. 11:27, 29). What does that mean? Does that mean I am not to partake if I don't feel "worthy"? No, that's not the meaning at all. The expression is not an adjective to describe the partaker, but it is an adverb to describe the action—the manner in which I partake is to be worthy.

Communing the week stay focused

The text warns that if I do not partake in a "worthy manner" that I "will be guilty of the body and blood every first day of of the Lord," and that I will be eating and drinking "judgment to" myself (1 Cor. 11:27, 29). Every conscientious reader of the New Testament has been ensures that we taken aback by that warning and has sought diligently to eat and drink in a "worthy manner," and fortunately for us, the text explains what that entails. As

> we partake, (1) we are to remember "the Lord's death" (11:24-26), (2) we are to "examine" ourselves (11:28), and (3) we are to "discern the Lord's body" (11:29). The action of eating and drinking is considered "worthy" by the Lord when the worshiper's heart and mind are fully engaged!

> So, practically speaking, what does that mean? How can I, week-after-week, remember, examine and discern? The Bible provides abundant resource for my weekly meditation. The articles over the next three weeks will suggest 21 ways.

What is the best news you have ever been able to share? The announcement of an engagement or maybe the birth of a child? Perhaps a good report from the doctor or an important interview? Whatever the good news is, it feels good to share!

Our work as Christians is much like what Isaiah spoke about in his day. "The Spirit of the Lord GOD

is upon me, Because the LORD has anointed me To bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to captives And freedom to prisoners; To proclaim the favorable year of the LORD And the day of vengeance of our God; To comfort all who mourn, To grant those who mourn in Zion, Giving them a garland instead of ashes, The oil of gladness instead of mourn-

ing, The mantle of praise instead of a spirit of fainting. So they will be called oaks of righteousness, The planting of the LORD, that He may be glorified" (Isa. 61:1-3).

Paul talks about Christians sharing the good news as the "ministry of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:18). He mentions future judgment for all deeds done in the body, "whether good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10). Then, based on that, "knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade men" (2 Cor. 5:11). Even though some thought they were out of their minds, this was to the glory of God. Yet, those Christians knew them to be of sound mind, and the message was to their benefit (2 Cor. 5:15). Not too different from today. Many would consider the message of Christ to be crazy and not worth learning. We know the truth and press on. Paul says, "the love of Christ controls/compels us" to share the message (2 Cor. 5:14). "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to

God. He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Cor. 5:20-21).

We get to share the best news ever!

We get to share the best news ever! We are ambassadors of eternal peace, in a heavenly realm, with an all-powerful Ruler. Our governing authority has shown that He cares for us individually and collectively. "Now all these things are from God, who

reconciled us to Himself through Christ... namely, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:18-19). We warn and persuade men away from the judgment to come toward reconciliation. We share with others that will allow them to stand with confidence before the throne on the day of their judgment! Will they all listen? No. Will they say we are crazy and mock us? Maybe. We get to say that a child was born, a bride is waiting, death is conquered, and we can nail that final interview.

Plug the leak!

On March 11, 1864, the Dale Dike Dam in South Yorkshire, England broke and flooded the city of Sheffield. More than 600 houses were damaged or destroyed and more than 240 people lost their lives. It is believed that a small leak in the wall of the dam expanded until the dam failed.

Can you imagine? All of that devastation caused by just a small leak? God knew the destructive nature of something that starts out small and is left unchecked. "The beginning of strife," our Lord tells us, "is like releasing water" (Prov. 17:14). Letting out just a little can lead to major strife. "Therefore," we are in-

If someone had found that small leak in the dam in 1864 and stopped it, lives could have been saved! If someone (i.e., me or you) would plug up a leak in our temper before it bursts, much heartache and strife can be avoided! Let's learn to plug the leak and walk away! -DS
