The Danger of Shallow Biblical Knowledge

God is in heaven

and you are on

the earth; there-

fore let your

words be few



When I was a student at Freed-Hardeman University, the Mooresville congregation near Lewisburg, Tennessee wanted to send me to help spread the gospel in Georgia. Through one of teachers at the college, I made contact with the church in Savannah, and I preached in my first gospel

meeting in an attempt to plant the church Statesboro, Georgia.

I was there for two weeks knocking on doors and inviting the people to the upcoming meeting. On the Sunday before the meeting began, I worshiped with the Bull Street congregation where W.F. Buffington was preaching. I will never forget what he said in that Sunday morning Bible class.

He was discussing a topic dealing with the application of Biblical truths to a moral situation.

There was a new convert in the class who felt like he was a Bible scholar and continued to interrupt the older preacher. Brother Buffington was kind, but the young man persisted in his effort to interrupt the teacher. Finally brother Buffington had had enough so he said, "_____, you are still too worldly to discuss this and you are not as smart as you think you are. The best way you can help this class is to be quiet and listen to what God says."

I have thought of this often over the years and have

found myself in a similar situation. People who have just a shallow knowledge of the Bible fail to remember what Paul says, "Knowledge puffs up...and if anyone thinks that he knows anything, he know nothing yet as he ought to know" (1 Cor. 9:1-2). The actions of that new convert are such a vivid illustration of that old adage, "A little knowledge is a dangerous thing."

> The wisdom of Solomon on this topic is seen in Ecclesiastes chapter five. "Walk prudently when you go to the house of God; and draw near to hear rather than to give the sacrifice of fools, for they do not know that they do evil. Do not be rash with your mouth, and let not your heart utter anything hastily before God. For God is in heaven and you are on the earth; therefore let your words be few." To hastily speak in the house of God is to act as a fool. When it comes to

Bible study, I think often about that new convert. Brother Buffington's advice, "Let your words be few."

So many times, we speak too rashly about spiritual matters, especially when our knowledge is shallow. As you study your Bible, listen to what God has said. It is foolish for anyone to add his own opinions about spiritual matters. Study the Bible. Study it often. Study it deeply. Then, humbly tell others about what you have learned.

I will never forget that young convert's actions.



Linger Around It and You'll Do It, Too!

What is the worst thing that you could ever do? There are all sorts of answers that could be given to that question, but can you think of anything worse than denying Jesus in His very presence? There's probably

not anything worse than that, especially By David Sproule when you do that just hours after you "vehemently" stated, "If I have to die with You, I will not deny

You!" (Mark 14:31). What could lead someone to do such a horrible and regrettable thing? Look at the We must refuse passage in Luke 22:54-62.

First, Peter separated himself from Jesus. He was right there with Jesus in the verses leading up to this (even drawing his sword and striking the servant of the high priest in order to protect Jesus), but now, all of a sudden, the text states, "But Peter fol-

lowed at a distance" (22:54). I've seen teenagers do this with their parents—keeping their distance...not wanting to be seen together in public...not wanting folks to mistakenly think that "I'm with them." The moment that we start to distance ourselves from Jesus—even just a little bit—we have opened up "a place" in our lives "to the devil" (Eph. 4:27). We must never be ashamed to walk closely with our Lord (2 Tim. 1:12).

Second, Peter sat among the enemies of God. When Christ's enemies "had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter was sitting among them" (22:55). The verb tense for "sitting" in verses 55-56 indicates a perpetual activity. The psalmist had warned about the danger of such a practice: "How blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, Nor sit in the seat of scoffers!" (Psa. 1:1). Sitting down shows acceptance, ease and approval (Rom. 1:32; Eph. 5:11-14; 1 Cor. 15:33). We must refuse to willfully associ-

ate with those who are anti-Christ (2 Cor. 6:14-18).

Third, Peter stayed in that compromising situation. Peter's first denial of Christ ("Woman, I do not know Him") should have shaken him up (22:57). It should have caused him to reevaluate where he was and what he was doing. Instead, he stayed "a little while" longer (22:58). This led him to deny Christ a second time ("Man, I am not!"). Surely, after

hearing those words from his mouth in response to a second person, now he will come to himself and leave. Right? Look at how verse 59 begins: "Then after about an hour had passed." This was not a guick episode. Peter may have been there for more than two hours, which led him to deny Jesus a third time ("Man, I do not know what you are saying!").

It was finally the rooster crowing and the look of the Lord that woke him up (22:60-62). May God help us to not linger around evil, lest we end up doing evil ourselves!

Before the Election (Part 5)

"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity" (Psa. 133:1)! We know that to be true, and we strive for that end. However, there are times when we feel more like, "too long has my soul had its dwelling with those who hate peace" (Psa. 120:6). We may feel at

odds with the majority of people around us. Holding certain ideals or moral absolutes has become less popular. Instead of being tolerant of people, for some, it becomes a reason to be disrespectful or indecent. I know that the very process of an election, in normal circumstances, is divisive. However, this election seems to be more explosive and ugly than any other. As God's people, what are we going to do?

We need to look to one of the main functions of the Christ. Isaiah said this about the future Messiah, "Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end" (9:7a). At His birth angels said, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men" (Luke 2:14). In His death he consummated peace between God and man. "And he came and preached peace to you who were far away, and peace to those who were near; for through Him we both have our access in one Spirit to the Father" (Eph. 2:17-18). There is a sense in which His whole purpose was peace. If we are to be children of God, then we need to be making similar efforts. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God" (Matt. 5:9). We can do that by loving our enemies and blessing those that hate us. "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven" (Matt. 5:44-45a). We need to also display a wisdom that is from above. "But the wisdom from above is first pure, then

peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, without hypocrisy. And the seed whose fruit is righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace" (Jas. 3:17-18). We must be able to contend and not be contentious. "The Lord's bondservant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to teach, patient when wronged, with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to

the knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will" (2 Tim. 2:24-26).

We must be those who are seeking after peace. That does not mean compromise on truth and morals. However, "the one who desires life, to love and see good days, must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit. He must turn away from evil and do good; he must seek peace and pursue it" (1 Pet. 3:10-11). Will you be a peacemaker?

They had a mind to work

God's people faced severe opposition in the rebuilding of the wall around Jerusalem after returning from Babylonian captivity, which is probably why they had not completed the task in the 90 years before Nehemiah. And once they started the monumental task, their enemies (particularly Sanballat and Tobiah) countered them at every turn. Nevertheless, Nehemi-

ah recorded, "So we built the wall" (Neh. 4:6). Underscore the word "so," emphasizing that they were going to complete the work, regardless of the attempts to stop them. The great restorer revealed what was driving them: "...for the people had a mind to work."

Think about that. They hadn't rebuilt the wall for 90 years. It would be easy to just let it remain in rubble. Opposition was all around them. It would be easy to just back off. But they didn't. And, even more, they couldn't. They were minded to finish the task and knew the Lord would help them. What about us? Do we (do you? do I?) have a mind to work? Will we stop at nothing to do get things done for our God? Will we resist the urge to let up and back off in our effort? -DS

Making the best of a bad situation

We face them all the time...sometimes daily...but to different levels or degrees. Car problems, unexpected home repairs, conflict at work, conflict at home, health issues, death, disappointments, mistreatment from others, broken friendship, loss of job, etc., etc. Bad things happen all the time. "Time and chance happen to [us] all" (Ecc. 9:11). (Easily remember where

this verse is located by looking at the three numbers: 9-1-1.)

What do we do when bad things happen? First and foremost, pause and talk to God, no matter what it is (1 Pet. 5:7). Second, recognize there are many things out of your control and there is

nothing that you can do to change them. Accept that. Third, identify what you can control and work on that. Fourth, ask yourself, "How big a deal is this? Really?" How much of this situation can you (should you) just let go and move on? Fifth, if the situation warrants, identify one or two people that you can lean on for support—wise counsel you can trust, who will talk to you straight, who may have been there themselves. Sixth, you're not done. Talk to God some more! -DS
