The older I get as a Christian the more I am convinced that the key to greater spirituality is found in meditating on the psalms. David was a man after God's own heart. By letting our hearts speak these words which flowed from the heart of David, our hearts will become like David's heart and

at the same time become like the heart of God.

I am not sure which psalm appeals to you, for the one that appeals to me is determined by what is happening in my life as I read them. One important psalm answers the question, "David, what is the one thing you have desired of the Lord?" If I asked you the same question, how close would your answer be like the answer David gives in Psalm 27?

"One thing I have desired of the Lord, that

will I seek ... " Receiving from the Lord is dependent on our seeking His help in finding it. Our service to Him cannot be far down on our list of the most important things in our lives. The Bible speaks of "with all your heart" nine times in the book of Deuteronomy (4:29; 6:5; 10:12; 11:13; 13:3; 26:16; 30:2, 6, 10) and each shows the importance of seeking Him with our all.

"...that I may dwell in the house of the Lord ... " It is likely that David's house of the Lord was the tabernacle given at Sinai. It was a tent, yet David said that his desire above all things was to dwell in that house. God was there. How important is it in your life to be in His presence to worship Him?

"...all the days of my life..." As a young man who was facing Goliath, he looked back to past events which had happened and said, "God delivered me from the ... lion and ... the bear," and then added, "He will deliver me..." (1 Sam. 17:37). He believed deeply in the providence of God as a youth and all the days of his life, even as an old man (Psa. 37:25).

> "...to behold the beauty of the Lord ... " David knew that it was in the house of the Lord he would be able, not just to glimpse at His beauty, but to behold it. We come into His house, to sit at the table of the Lord and view the most beautiful manifestation of the Lord as we commune with Him at the cross.

"...and to inquire in His temple." We come into His temple and listen to Him speak His words to us in Bible classes and worship. Bible study by its very nature generates questions as we seek for deeper knowledge and the closest relationship we can have with Him. Every time, without fail, we inquire of Him and His will for our lives He gives the answer. The Creator of the world longs to have fellowship with us and provides the answers our souls seek in His temple.

How close does your one desire parallel the one thing David desired of the Lord? Think about your answer.



Long Live the King!

You know the story. "All the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him, '...Now make us a king to judge us like all the nations'" (1 Sam. 8:4-5). Samuel's response was one of displeasure when they said, "Give us a king By David Sproule to judge us," so he "prayed to the

Lord" (8:6). The Lord told Samuel, "...they have rejected Me, that I should not reign over them" (8:7). What does that mean, "that I should not reign over them"?

Just over 100 years earlier, the men of Israel tried to get Gideon to "rule over us" (Judg. 8:22). Gideon quickly replied, "I will not rule over you...the Lord shall rule over you" (8:23). Israel already had a King! So at the coronation of Israel's first human king, Samuel chided the people for demanding that "a king shall reign over us" (cf. 1 Sam. 8:19; 10:19; 12:12), when "the Lord your God was your king" (12:12).

While millennia have passed, two things remain the same—(1) people still believe that their personal ideas for human government are still the best, and (2) Jehovah is still King! It does not matter if someone lives in a nation that has a president, a king, a queen, a prime minister, a chancellor or a supreme leader, every living creature lives under the sovereign rule of the King of heaven!

The God of heaven (i.e., the God of the Bible, the Creator and Sustainer of all things) is described as "the great King" (Psa. 48:2). There is no one above Him! He is "the great King above all gods" (Psa. 95:3). His rule is not limited to a certain region or to a certain people, for "God is the King of all the earth" (Psa. 47:7, 2; Zech. 14:9). While some rulers sit on an earthly throne over an earthly nation, "God reigns over the nations; God sits on His holy throne" (Psa. 47:8). While earthly

> rulers will be replaced through death, term limits or elections, "Jehovah is King forever and ever" (Psa. 10:16; cf. 29:10).

> Regardless of what happens in the next election, regardless of whether your candidate wins or not, regardless of whether you like those who are in positions of government authority or not, regardless of whether you believe in God or not, you have a

King! He reigns over all countries of the earth. He reigns over all peoples of the earth. He has been on the throne from eternity and He will be on the throne throughout eternity! There is not one single thing that can end or affect His rule!

So, does He have your vote? His reign is universal. But the greatest place that He wants to reign is in your heart and in your life...by your choice and by your desire. "Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor and glory forever and ever" (1 Tim. 1:17).

By Their Fruits

The day after Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem this curious event unfolds. On the next day, when they had left Bethany, He became hungry. Seeing at a distance a fig tree in leaf, He went to see if perhaps He would find anything on it, and when He came to it, He found nothing but leaves, for it was

not the season for figs. "He said to it, 'May no one ever eat fruit from you again!' And His disciples were listening" (Mark 11:12-14). Later, Jesus and His followers returned, and the tree was "withered from the roots up" (Mark 11:20). At this point, Jesus used the dead tree as a lesson about prayers of faith. This was indeed an opportunity for insight concerning the dimensions and the power of prayer. But before that, when He first confronted the tree, the issue at hand was something else. The issue at hand was a tree failing as a tree.

For Jesus, this was not a simple outburst of frustration. Fueled by anger, Jesus would soon enter the temple and carry out some extreme renovation in order to make a point (Mark 11:15). His displeasure toward the tree also had a purpose. When He first approached the fig tree, He was not pleased when He discovered it was missing a key element figs. There is often established a parallel between mankind and plants. Jesus referred to a fig tree in one of His parables. And He began telling this parable: "A man had a fig tree which had been planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and did not find any. And he said to the vineyard-keeper, 'Behold, for three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree without finding any. Cut it down! Why does it even use up the ground?' And he answered and said to him, 'Let it alone, sir, for this year too, until I dig around it and put in fertilizer; and if it bears fruit next year, fine; but if not, cut it

down'" (Luke 13:6-9). There were certain expectations concerning this tree. If expectations were not met, there was a limit to the time allowed for it to produce fruit. So, when Jesus confronted the tree, He How will you be was not merely expressing His anger. There was a lesson right then and right there. Anyone who followed Christ would be expected to live a life that produced fruit. "You will know them by their fruits. Grapes are not gathered from thorn bushes nor figs

from thistles, are they? So, every good tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot produce bad fruit, nor can a bad tree produce good fruit" (Matt. 7:16-18). The lesson here is that people are defined in the same way, and the ultimate fate of a person is determined by what is produced by his life. "Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire" (Matt. 7:19). Being known by our fruits can be both liberating or the most scary thought, depending on your fruit.

A Christian's work ethic

In the workplace, in the home, in the community, in the church...God's child should be known for his strong work ethic! Think about this. The words "lazy" or "laziness" are used 15 times in the book of Proverbs and never, as you would expect, in a favorable light. God contrasts laziness in that book with being "diligent" (10:4; 12:24, 27; 13:4) and "upright" (15:19).

Later in life, Solomon again warned about "laziness" (Ecc. 10:18) and urged readers to action: "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might" (Ecc. 9:10).

Many people today seem to be inclined to give and do the minimum, or even less than that if

possible. That's not only true when they are "on the clock" at work, but it is evident in their efforts at home and even in the church. A child of God should stand out. He will not be one who is "lagging" or "slothful" (i.e., lazy, idle, sluggish) in his efforts, but he will be known for his "diligence" (Rom. 12:11). May God help us to be known as hard workers with a strong work ethic. Such not only reflects upon ourselves but more especially upon our God! – DS
