Truths About the Sabbath, Simply Stated

When you study

the Bible, never

ly and simply

There are religions whose name indicates that they believe that we must observe the Sabbath on Saturday and that there is no authority to worship God on the first day of the week. Then, there are many who say that we must observe the Ten Commandments and that God has changed His

teachings, and now Sunday is the "Christian Sabbath." Keep in mind that the Bible always identifies Saturday as the Sabbath and nowhere is the Sabbath identified as being Sunday. Consider the following truths, simply stated, that may help us as we study His word.

overlook truths The Sabbath was not sanctified by God in the Garden of Eden on the day He rested. We have God states clearnot read Genesis 2:2-3 carefully. "He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in

it He rested from all His work..." God had completed His resting and because He had rested, He blessed that day. He could have blessed it on the next day, but He had completed His rest, then He blessed it. Read the next point to see precisely when He revealed that He had blessed that day.

Neither Adam and Eve, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, nor the Jews in Egypt ever observed the Sabbath. Just days before Moses died, he spoke to the Jews about the Ten Commandments and the keeping of the Sabbath. He called those commands the covenant God made with Israel (Deut. 4:13). Then, he said to the Jews who had been at Mt. Sinai (Horeb) when the Ten Commandments were given, "The Lord our God made a covenant with us in Horeb. The Lord did not make this covenant with our fathers, but with us, those who are here today, all of us who are alive" (Deut. 5:2-3). The Bible clearly and simply states that God did NOT make the covenant with anyone before Mt. Sinai.

> The Sabbath was a sign between God and the Jews, not all mankind. How much clearer can God state the truth that the Gentiles were NOT part of the keeping of the Sabbath. Regarding the Sabbath God said, "It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel" (Ex. 31:17).

The Sabbath was given to the Jews, who as slaves had no rest, to be remembered BECAUSE they had been slaves. They were told to remember the Sabbath day. How did they do this? "And remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt and the Lord your God brought you out from there...therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath" (Deut. 5:15). Gentiles were not slaves in Egypt, so the Sabbath was not designed for them!

As you study the Bible, never overlook truths God states clearly and simply.

A Spacecraft Seeking What We Already Know

How could they

While searching for near-Earth asteroids on September 11, 1999, a groundbased telescope discovered an asteroid that was later named Bennu. After several years of researching this asteroid along with development of astounding space exploration technologies, a NASA spacecraft called OSIRIS

-REx was launched from Cape Canaveral, Florida, on an Atlas V

411 rocket on September 8, 2016. After orbiting the sun for a year, it used Earth's gravitational field on September 22, 2017 to change its trajectory to match Bennu's trajectory and began its journey to rendezvous. OSIRIS-REx arrived at Bennu on December 3, 2018 (two years after it was launched). On October 20, 2020 (another two years later), OSIRIS-REx touched down very briefly on the surface of Bennu to collect samples of rocky material. The space-

craft is scheduled to depart from Bennu in March 2021 and will return to Earth to drop off the samples, which will parachute to a landing site in the Utah desert on September 24, 2023.

The asteroid Bennu is approximately 510 meters in diameter (slightly more than the height of the Empire State Building). It is orbiting the sun at 63,000 mph and is 200 million miles away from Earth. The predetermined landing zone for the OSIRIS-REx was only 52 feet across. So, why is NASA spending nearly \$1 billion on this mission? Here it is: "OSIRIS- REx seeks answers to the questions that are central to the human experience: Where did we come from? What is our destiny?" Other sites suggest that the findings from OSIRIS-REx will "hold key information to unlocking how the solar system formed." They suggested that "Asteroids like Bennu, which possess organic, carbon-rich minerals, may have provided the building blocks for life to arise on Earth."

> Stop for a moment and consider how ignorant and illogical their purpose is. They researched the speed, trajectory and orbit of this asteroid for years. They designed a spacecraft that could travel the precise speed and direction for over two years in order to rendezvous in exactly the right place. They were able to calculate precisely where the asteroid would be years in advance of it actually being there, and they know exactly how long it will take for the spacecraft

to return. HOW? HOW could they calculate all of this with such exactitude? They could only do so (and be confident in their computations) because THERE IS PRECISE DESIGN IN OUR UNIVERSE! IF our universe was the result of a "Big Bang," the chaos of an explosion would NEVER create such order!

Here they are...trying (they say) to learn more about the origin of life on Earth...when the answer for such is right there in front of them in the precision of their calculations. Only a designed universe could exhibit such design!

He begins this thought with an unpopular concept, "I have made myself a slave to all." This is a true surrender of self for the needs of others. In seeking to gain perspective of others, we need to recognize it should be done out of a heart of service for their good, "so that [we] may by all means save some." Paul's motivation was to teach and save the lost. Our motivation is not social in nature, to be liked or accepted by a group or individual. While that might be the outcome, our motivation is to be educated and adept enough to teach in a way that they will listen. Giving people information is not hard. Giving people information in a way that they will listen, that is the trick. For some, we need to be able to relate, find common ground, or sit where they sit for a

> while. A genuineness of our motive can be shown with our investment of time and thought with those

> Please note that Paul in no way lived as a lawless person during his time working with those that were without the law. He said he was still under the law of Christ. In our service to others, we must maintain the moral convictions and commandments

we have been taught. If we waver or set them aside, then we undermine the absolute nature of God's word. We have taught them situational service. By our actions we teach that we must follow God's law, but that there are times when we can set it aside. In doing so, we have taught them lukewarm service.

Let us be motivated to sit with people. Make the time to learn where people are coming from. We are more prepared to teach effectively. We see example after example of Christ doing the same thing. Should we be any different?






