## The Election Is Over—Now What?

Is it possible that we have lost focus in the midst of all the political turmoil seen in the last election? Can you recall a time when so many people felt so strongly about the choice of a new president and the direction each of them would take our nation? Social media has reflected the division in a land

envisioned as being "one nation under God, indivisible..."

Is it possible that we have forgotten that "our citizenship is in heaven" (Phil. 3:20)? Those Old Testament saints understood this. Abraham left the luxury of an easy life in the city of Ur, and he and his family spent the rest of their lives in tents. By faith they saw the promises of God were in the future and **our citizenship is** "...embraced them and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth" (Heb. 11:13).

"They desire a better, that is a heavenly country. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them" (Heb. 11:16). Is it possible that we have lost sight of this fundamental truth and that God is ashamed to be called our God? We must never forget our true citizenship.

Paul says that we are soldiers of the cross and our lives demand that "we must endure hardship" (2 Tim. 2:3). He then describes the focus every Christian must have. "No one engaged in warfare entangles himself with the affairs of this life, that he may please Him who enlisted him as a soldier." Has the turmoil in our lives caused us to get entangled with worldly affairs?

How many Christians are there whose lives have centered on the election? Let me ask you a simple question. Have your posts on social media and conversations with others talked more of the affairs of this world than on the souls of the lost? Are you still seeing souls rather than the political ideas

they hold? Are you one who has lost focus?

So, what do we need to do about all that is happening? Hear the words of Paul again about that which is *first of all* in these matters. "I exhort first of all that supplication, prayers, intercession and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority" (1 Tim. 2:1-2). Remember who the king was Paul had in mind-it was Nero Caesar!

What should we pray about? "That we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence" (1 Tim. 2:3). It makes no difference who won the election, we must pray for those in Washington—of both parties.

The next verse sums it all up. God "...desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." This is heaven's focus on the world, and it *must* be ours. The destiny of our nation does not lie in converting others to our political persuasion, but in converting them to Christ!



### Why Is "Virgin" a Dirty Word?

If your only source of information in the last forty years has been television and movies, then you would believe that there is great shame in being called a "virgin." Teenagers and adults in television and movies snicker at, laugh at, point at, mock, tease, shame and ostracize anyone who is believed

to be (or known to be) a virgin, and usually great pressure is put on that virgin to as quickly as possible lose their virginity. Again, if you've been raised with a steady diet of that kind of "entertainment," then you may also have those same thoughts about virginity. Perhaps you have felt shamed or have shamed another in this matter.

However, I want you to know (not merely think or believe) that an unmarried virgin is held in the highest esteem by the God of heaven! Do you hear that? Do you believe that? Do you trust that? Think about this.

The whole thrust of the Old Testament message is that "Someone is coming." More than 300 specific prophecies are made in the first 39 books of your Bible that foretell of the coming Messiah. One of those prophecies is found in Isaiah 7:14 and finds its fulfillment in Matthew 1:23. "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel." On the very first page of our New Testament, we read about a "virgin." She was not mocked or teased for not having sex yet. Just the opposite! When God sent His angel to the "virgin," the message delivered is striking: "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!...You have found favor with God" (Luke 1:26-30).

Question: Would Mary have been chosen to be the mother of Jesus if she was not a virgin? No! Isaiah 7:14 proves that. She could not have fulfilled God's plan if she wasn't a virgin!

> Now, consider this. Why was Joseph concerned at all when he discovered that Mary was pregnant with a child that was not his? Did it matter to Joseph if Mary was a virgin or not? It most certainly did!

It mattered to Mary that she was a virgin! She had obviously saved herself for her husband. It mattered to Joseph that Mary was a virgin! He was ready to "put her away" when he thought that she was not. It mattered to God that Mary was a virgin! He would not have selected her if she was not. "Virgin" was not a dirty word in the Bible!

God looked down at a virgin girl and used the words "highly favored" and "blessed among women"! Friends, please ignore today's "entertainment" industry! They don't have a clue! Don't be ashamed to follow God's plan and find favor in His sight, even if it doesn't bring favor in anyone else's sight!

It mattered to God that Mary was a virgin!

manded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:19-20). This directive we've been given we see played out so many times in the book of Acts. What is interesting is that it is not something that is reserved for just the Apostles or big names in the Bible. Ordinary men, women, and whole house- were involved in holds were involved in those evangelistic efforts.

Early in Acts we see the majority of the preaching is done by the Apostles. However, a ser-

mon that we have recorded in Acts chapter seven was preached by a deacon in the church, Stephen (Acts 6:5). Before that moment we had no idea who he was. He was a man who stepped out on faith, full of the Holy Spirit began preaching and doing the work. He was a great example of one with the faith of a mustard seed and what God was able to do through him (Matt. 17:20).

After the death of Stephen and the persecution that followed, we have a group of people that leave Jerusalem. When they leave, they don't hide the beliefs that were dangerous to them. They don't stop talking about the very thing that caused them to flee. "Therefore, those who had been scattered went about preaching the word" (Acts 8:4). They were counted among those that put the fear of death aside for the joy of the gospel and continued share the saving message (Rev. 2:10).

> There were families that helped with the spreading of the gospel. Cornelius, one who feared God before he even became a Christian, had his house full of people ready to listen to the gospel (Acts 10:27). "A woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple fabrics, a worshiper of God" was one that shared in the work that took place in Philippi as she implored that Paul and his company stay with her and her family (Acts 16:15). The work that was done

there in that city was also accredited to her account as she was a fellow partaker in the work (Phil. 4:17). When Paul was in Thessalonica he had been staying in the house of Jason. That is where the mob went to find Paul. Not finding Paul, they dragged Jason out (Acts 17:5-6). We don't read of him shrinking from his faith after this. He was probably a part of helping Paul escape from the area.

Evangelism is something we can all do. Even with our families. We are armed with faith and the powerful gospel.

#### Taking offense at everything

Some people just get offended at anything and everything. Have you noticed? They are reminiscent of one of Jesus' disciples. Perhaps you've heard of him. His name was Judas.

During the last week of Jesus' life, Mary of Bethany came and anointed Jesus' head and feet with a costly fragrant oil worth a

year's wages. Judas was indignant and scolded Mary for wasting something so valuable, which could have been sold and given to the poor (Mark 14:3-9; John 12:1-8).
