#### If You Could Ask God One Question

The name Larry King may not be well known among younger people, but for decades he hosted a nighttime talk show on CNN. He was born in Brooklyn to Orthodox Jewish parents who had immigrated to America. He died Saturday, January 23, and left an estate of over 140 million dollars. He

truly was an icon of broadcasting on radio and television, conducting over 50,000 interviews.

If you could talk Recently, I saw a clip where someone asked Larry King an interesting question. "If you could talk to God and ask to God, what one question would you ask Him?" Before giving his amazing answer, let me ask you the same question. If you could ask God just one quesquestion, what tion, what would you ask Him? Probably a lot depends on your background and what is happening in your life right now. Think about it for a moment and before reading the next paragraph decide what it would be.

Larry's answer? I doubt that you would ever guess what he said but think about his background. His parents were Orthodox Jews, who believed that a Messiah would come someday. There is every chance that this was a vital part of his upbringing. When asked what his one question to God would be, he answered without any hesitation. "I would ask God did He have a son?"

Wow! Do you see how important this question is? It strikes at the heart of the relationship everyone should have with God. The question reaches far beyond Orthodox Judaism. The answer to this question strikes at the foundation of all religions in all ages.

If God had a Son, then the way to God is not through Judaism of any sort. If God had a Son, the way to God is not through Buddha or Mohammed. If God had a Son, the way to

> God is not through "Christian" religions started by mortals who rejected the church that Son built on this earth. One cannot acknowledge that God had a Son and then reject in any way what He said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

How would God answer the question? He would it be? has already given it. Centuries ago, those who stood beside the Jordan River would have heard that voice from heaven. "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 3:17). Then, on a mountain in Galilee that same voice was heard by men when He said, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!"

> Do you know the answer to the question? Have you honestly looked at the evidence? What was it that God said on the mountain? "Hear Him!" There is no single question more important. Are you listening to the Son of God?

## I'm responsible for where I drop those blocks

"I've got a right to do what I want to do!" How many have ever said that? How many Christians have ever said that? But, give this some thought. Even if something is not necessarily a sin, does that mean I've got a "right" to do it? One question I must always ask myself is: "What impact will this decision have on others, especially upon my fellow Christians?"

In the first-century church, something as simple as whether to eat certain meats was causing a rift in the church. Christians were certainly at "liberty" (1 Cor. 8:9) to eat any meat provided by God (1 Tim. 4:3-5)—it was their "right." But they needed to be aware of how their actions looked to others. Paul said, "Do not destroy with your food the one for whom Christ died...nor do anything by which your brother stumbles" (Rom. 14:15, 21).

Fellow Christian, the choices we make are seen by and affect each other. Let us "resolve...not to put a stumbling block or a cause to fall in our brother's way" (Rom. 14:13). – DS

#### The deeper you go, the higher you'll go

As Paul was encouraging the church in Colosse in "the stead-fastness of [their] faith in Christ" (Col. 2:5), he urged them to focus intently on what they had "received" (2:6)—i.e., "been taught" (2:7)—regarding "Christ Jesus our Lord" and to "so walk in Him" (2:6). He did not want their faith to waver, so he appealed to them to have their faith "firmly rooted" in Christ

(2:7). They needed to work to grow their faith deeper and deeper in Christ. Superficial faith wasn't enough. Because Paul knew that the deeper and more firmly their faith was "rooted" in Christ and in His Word, the stronger and the higher they would be "built up in Him" (2:7). There is a direct correlation between one's

depth in God's Word and one's height in faith and service.

Have you leveled off in your faith and service? Are you not any higher today than you were last year or even a few years ago? Your height in faith and service is tied directly to your depth in His Word. The deeper you go and the longer you stay there, the stronger and higher you'll go in serving Him! – DS


