To Find Truth—Listen to Jesus, not Theologians

Centuries ago, theologians decided that little children are sinners, and therefore they must be baptized so their sins can be forgiven. When one believes this false idea, the obvious conclusion is that an infant who dies in his infancy and has not been baptized (usually by having water sprinkled on him) cannot go to heaven. This is not what the Bible teaches but is what theologians convinced many Christians to believe. Are children who die in infancy doomed to go to an eternal hell?

To see that this doctrine is not found in the Bible, consider the Bible definition of sin which separates one from God (Isa. 59:1-2). How does the Bible define sin? Listen to the words of God. “Sin is the transgression of the law” (1 John 3:4, KJV). Using this definition, the obvious question to be asked is what sin had a newborn baby committed? Has he put some other God ahead of Jehovah God? Has he created a graven image to worship? Has he taken the name of the Lord in vain? Has he dishonored his parents? Is he guilty of being a thief? Has he committed adultery? Has that newborn told a lie or coveted anything? The answer is obvious. What law of God has a newborn broken?

The theologians realized that a helpless newborn could not actively violate God’s teaching, so as they developed

their theology, they came to the conclusion that babies inherit the sins of Adam and Eve. They created a new concept—one not found in the Bible—that a baby’s sin is not an action but an inheritance.

What does the Bible say about this? God so clearly gives us the answer. The Jews in Ezekiel used a proverb about how a father ate sour grapes and his children had that bitter taste in their mouth. God rebuked them saying, “As I live you shall no longer use this proverb in Israel” (Ezek. 18:3). The father’s actions do not determine the destiny of the child. The theologians were wrong! “The soul who sins shall die...The son shall not bear the guilt of the father, nor the father bear the guilt of the son” (Ezek. 18:4, 20). Ancient Jewish theologians were wrong as are more modern “Christian” theologians. The very basis of infant baptism is destroyed.

Babies have no sin, and therefore do not need to be baptized for the remission of sins.

How does Jesus describe the spiritual nature of little children? “Of such is the kingdom of heaven” (Matt. 19:14). To enter the kingdom of heaven we must “...become as little children” (Matt. 18:3). The greatest in the kingdom is the one “...who humbles himself as this little child” (Matt. 18:4). Oh, how our world would be drastically changed if religious people quit listening to theologians, priests, bishops and pastors as they tell their thoughts and just listen to Jesus!

Pray Like a Great Prayer

There are many great prayers in the Bible, meaning we can read some great words that were spoken by righteous persons. But, as we study great prayers, we also discover some tremendous pray-ers, that is individuals who can teach us some great lessons about how to talk to God. Nehemiah is one of those great pray-ers we find in Scripture.

Throughout the book of Nehemiah, this lead character frequently broke out into prayer and then went right back to what he was doing. So, a study of each prayer in the book would be highly beneficial. But, I want to focus on his first prayer in chapter one and see how we can learn to pray like this pray-er.

Nehemiah praised the almighty God. The very first thing Nehemiah did when he approached the Lord was to honor and magnify and revere the “great and awesome God” (1:5). Did the Lord need to hear that? Not nearly as much as Nehemiah needed to say it and to hear himself say it.

Nehemiah extoiled the wonderful works of God. As a part of lauding the God of heaven, Nehemiah exalted the faithfulness and mercy of God toward His children (1:5). Did the Lord need to hear that? Or was it that Nehemiah needed to be reminded of it himself by hearing himself say it?

Nehemiah was surrendering himself to the power and will of God.

Nehemiah confessed sin. Before making his petition to the Lord, Nehemiah openly confessed “the sins...we have sinned against You...my father’s house and I have sinned” (1:6)—using the word “sin” three times. He did not seek to make excuses for his failures, but instead he confessed both sins of commission (“acted very corruptly”) and sins of omission (“have not kept the commandments”) (1:7). While some “laugh” at sin, God desires for us to “lament and mourn and weep” when we turn against Him (Jas. 4:9).

Nehemiah quoted Scripture. Nehemiah had studied God’s Word, knew God’s Word and trusted God’s Word (cf. Lev. 26:33; Deut. 4:25-31; 28:64; 30:2-5). He pleaded with God to fulfill the promises that He had made to those who “return” to Him and “keep” His commandments (1:8-9). We need to know and believe God’s Word so strongly that we are willing to ask God to fulfill His promises to us.

Nehemiah humbled himself. From beginning to end of his six-sentence prayer, Nehemiah was surrendering himself to the power and will of God. Five times he said, “I pray.” Six times he called himself and/or Israel the Lord’s “servant(s).” He begins and ends by talking about how “great” the Lord is, and twice he pleads, “Please let your ear be attentive.”

Nehemiah was a great pray-er in the Bible. He gives us a great example of how we too can grow as pray-ers.

A Stroll Through the Proverbs

Have you ever known a wise person, someone who seemingly makes all the right choices? Even in difficult circumstances they are the voice of reason. We have been given instruction on how to be that kind of person. The book of Proverbs is full of timeless wisdom to help us in our daily lives.

Much of the book is written in the format of a father sharing wisdom with his children. “Hear, my son, your father’s instruction and do not forsake your mother’s teaching; indeed, they are a graceful wreath to your head and ornaments about your neck” (Prov. 1:8-9). In this first section of the book, wisdom is personified as one crying out to the simple. Wisdom pleads to be heard. Yet, when it is not heeded and the hearer comes to harm, there is no sympathy. Wisdom takes the stance of “it’s too late” and “don’t come crying to me” (Prov. 1:20-33).

The book also contains verses that share with us those things that are better—better choices and better situations (Prov. 3:14; 8:11, 19; 12:9; 15:16, 17; 16:8,16, 19, 32; 17:1; 19:1, 22; 21:9, 18; 22:1; 25:7, 24; 27:5, 10; 28:6). For example, “Better is a little with the fear of the Lord than great treasure and turmoil with it” (Prov. 15:16). Often we find ourselves thinking, “it would be better if...” In these passages we

truly get to see what would be better and makes choices in our lives that lead to those better outcomes.

The book of Proverbs also gives us information about things that hinder us in our quest for wisdom. While there are several, here are three that are often mentioned. The first is the sluggard (Prov. 6:6-9; 13:4; 19:24; 20:4; 21:25; 22:13; 24:30; 26:13-16). Being a sluggard or lazy is counterproductive to wisdom. Knowledge and its use come with work and experience. The second item that counters wisdom can be your own tongue (Prov. 12:19; 15:2,4; 17:4; 18:21; 21:6, 23; 25:23; 26:28). Whether it is lying, speaking perversions, or just opening your mouth at the wrong time, the tongue can get us into a lot of trouble. Word to the wise—if you’re not sure, don’t speak. The last in the trio of hinderances is playing the fool (Prov. 10:23; 12:15, 16; 13:16; 14:16; 15:5; 17:10, 21, 28; 18:2, 6, 7; 26:11; 29:11). Over and over the fool is berated in Proverbs for his folly. The fool is the counter to the reason why the book was written. A father does not want this child to be a fool and even speaks to the hurt that a foolish son brings upon his parents. It is no wonder that so much is said warning the reader to stay out of the path of the fool.

I would challenge you to read through the Proverbs of Solomon again. Bind the wisdom found there upon your heart. There by you will be a blessing to all who know you.

However, there was one group (the nobles of the Tekoites), who “did not put their shoulders to the work” (Neh. 3:5). In the midst of a great spirit of unity and accomplishment, some were too lazy to work, and God took note.

No doubt, rebuilding the wall was grueling work. Thus, it was described as “putting their shoulders to the work.” Most folks would rather do anything else but that, and apparently these nobles found something else to do.

Friends, when it comes to the work of the Lord today, are you putting your shoulder to the work? Do your brethren see you laboring right next to them, or have you found something else to do? – DS
