## **God Challenges Us to Think**

God gave you a brain—use it! Our world has been changed in so many ways simply because we have used the intelligence we have to look around and see things as they are and then to make changes to improve our circumstances. We have the ability to think, to understand, to comprehend and

To simply define faith as some emotional feeling which has been passed down from our forefathers and as something we have because it is part of the culture into which we were born is to fail to understand faith in its truest sense. Faith is not based on feelings. Faith is not a

leap into the dark. If that is all there is to faith, then faith is foolishness, and our intelligence demands it must be rejected. Faith is built on historical events recorded by those who heard the voice of God give the first written words of an ancient book and recorded not just the words, but the manifestation of the power of the One who spoke those Ten Commandments.

The true God challenges us to not have a blind faith. The God of that ancient book has challenged men to think. He gave mankind reasoning ability and throughout the years has pleaded with them to think. When mankind ignored Him and began to make gods of wood, stone and precious metal He challenged them. In one paragraph, He rebukes those who failed to think. "Idols are silver and gold, the works of men's hands. They have mouths, but they do not speak; eyes they have but they do not see; they have ears, but they do not hear; noses they have, but they do not smell; they have hands, but they do not handle; feet they have, but they do not walk; nor

> do they mutter through their throat" (Psa. 115:4-7). What is God saying? I gave you a brain, use it and I will help you find the living God who speaks, sees, hears, smells, handles and walks among you!

> He challenges you to use your brain. We are no longer having to deal with inanimate statues of a god. However, there is still that ancient book which challenges us to think. It claims that God has

come in human form and walked among us. Yet, our world has ignored the claim, without ever looking at the evidence. They have not read the one book which gives evidence of the fact that Jesus lived and died and gave proof of His Deity. Faith in Him is not a leap into the dark. It is not an emotional conclusion reached based of feelings. There is the evidence! There are His miracles. There are His eternal words. There is the empty tomb. Look at the evidence. Use the brain He gave us. If Christianity is not reasonable it should be immediately rejected. He challenges you to examine the evidence.



## **Iesus and the Old Testament**

Sometimes when someone is reading through the Bible, they may think that Jesus is "a New Testament character who doesn't really have a strong presence in or connection to the Old Testament." However, after they spend more time in both the Old Testament and the New Testament, hopeful-

In Luke 4, He talked about Elijah, the widow of Zarephath and Naaman the leper (4:25-27). He also talked about Jonah (Matt. 12:39-41), the burning bush (Luke 20:37), the brazen serpent (John 3:14), and too many others to name. Jesus believed everything that was

Jesus wrote the Old Testament. Jesus was not merely a student of the sacred text; He was its author. The apostle Peter wrote about the Old Testament prophets, "who prophesied of the grace" that was coming, and "searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow" (1 Pet. 1:10-11). Did you notice that? Who was involved in leading the prophets in their writings? "The Spirit of Christ" was.

Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament. Early in His ministry, He said that He had come "to fulfill" the Law and the Prophets (Matt. 5:17), and at the end of His ministry He assured that "all things must be fulfilled which were written in

> the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me" (Luke 24:44).

> Jesus is the purpose of the Old Testament. Paul asked, "What purpose then does the law serve?" and then answered, "It was added because of transgressions, till the Seed should come to whom the promise was made...the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ" (Gal. 3:19-25).

Jesus took away the binding law of the Old Testament. In doing the will of God, He came to "take away the first," in order to "establish the second" (Heb. 10:9), by "having nailed [the first] to the cross" (Col. 2:14).

Jesus is the divine communication of God throughout Scripture. John wrote of Jesus: "In the beginning was the Word" (John 1:1). Jesus is the full revelation of deity to the world, through the Old Testament and the New Testament. May we stand in awe of His eternality and His revelation.

## **Peter's Final Address**

These are the closing verses of the second book bearing Peter's name. "You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard so that you are not carried away by the error of unprincipled men and fall from your own steadfastness, but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and

Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory, both now and to the day of eternity. Amen" (2 Pet. 3:17-18). In these verses, we are given a warning, a why and a how.

The warning consists of four words, "be on your guard" (2 Pet. 3:17). This comes on the heels of Be on guard! another warning about those, "untaught and unstable distort, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures, to their own destruction" (2 Pet. 2:16). The last warning of the book is in the context of properly understanding the scriptures. The inability to properly read or the deliberate distorting of the scriptures leads to one's destruction. It is for this reason that Peter says, "Knowing this beforehand, be on guard." If you knew that someone was going to attack you or break into your home, would you be ready? Would you warn your family and friends about the potential of them being a victim of the same kind of crime? Maybe you would forward an email or Facebook notification? We would do any and all of those things knowing that there was imminent danger. We need to think about it as seriously in regard

to the scripture (Matt. 10:28).

Peter is very clear about the why or reason. We need to be alert and ready for those that would distort the scriptures and potentially lead us down the wrong path. He says it this way, "so that you are not carried away by the error of unprincipled men and fall from your own steadfastness." There are two things that are important to notice. One, it is possible to teach error. Just because you believe something to be true,

that does not make it true. There is a correct way to teach and understand the scriptures, and there is a way that is destructive. Second, it is possible to fall from our place of steadfastness. Our actions, specifically our teaching, can cause us to fall out of a right relationship with God.

It is always nice to be given a road map for a solution. How can we be on guard? By "grow[ing] in the grace and knowledge or our Lord." When a person prepares themselves to be ready to detect a counterfeit coin or bill, they don't study all the fakes. They study and memorize every detail of the original. That is the power of the passage we read in the Psalms. "Your word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against You" (Psa. 119:11). We don't have to know all the false teaching that is out there. We just need to know the original well. Be on guard and armed with truth to fight against the distorted versions that are being taught to-day.

## When unbelievers object

If someone doesn't believe the Bible and doesn't want to hear what you might have to say about it, that's ok. That's on them. But wouldn't a simple "No thank you" from them suffice? I don't understand the vitriolic aggression that some are taking against Christians and Bible truth today. I would think that they would just walk away and leave us alone.

Look at what Jesus experienced in Nazareth after reading the Scriptures. "So all those in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath, and rose up and thrust Him out of the city; and they led Him to the brow of the hill on which their city was built, that they might throw Him down over the cliff" (Luke 4:28-29). What a violent rejection of truth! Note carefully that Jesus simply "went His way" (4:30). He didn't retaliate or even try to force them to hear Him. He just, metaphorically, shook the dust from His feet and moved on (Mark 6:11). What a lesson for us today! People will reject our evangelistic efforts today, but their rejection is actually of Him (Luke 10:16). It's ok to be silent and to move on. – DS

### Comparing yourself with others

We do it all the time. Or, so it seems. We measure ourselves against other people. We do it from a young age—"I'm almost as tall as mom." And we keep on doing it throughout life—"We don't have as much money as them...We are doing better in our marriage than them...I'm going to church more often than him..." The list goes on and on.



Is this a wise thing for us to do? Is this a healthy thing for us to do? Is this a productive thing for us to do? Perhaps, in some cases, there may be some motivation in comparing ourselves to others, but this is a practice that does us more harm than good. No doubt that is why the New

Testament says, "But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise" (2 Cor. 10:12).

Our standard is the Lord (1 Pet. 2:24). Our pattern is the New Testament (2 Tim. 1:13). The one we are trying to please is the Lord (Heb. 11:6). Let us compare ourselves to Him! -DS
