

When the Fountain for Sin Was Opened

After being in Babylon for seventy years, the Jews had returned to rebuild Jerusalem and restore the worship of God in the new temple they had built. Jehovah sent His final three Old Testament prophets to finish delivering that covenant, and then for the next 400+ years He was silent. The last three

books of the Old Testament are filled with great truths.

Zechariah, the longest of these books, ends with many references to the coming of Jesus. He speaks of Gethsemane and that night when evil men would strike the Shepherd and the sheep, the apostles, would be scattered. "Awake, O sword against My Shepherd, against the Man who is My compan- living prophets in ion, says the Lord of hosts. Strike the Shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered" (Zech. 13:7; Mark 14:27).

He speaks of Pentecost and the outpouring of the Spirit. "And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced" (Zech. 12:10). They pierced our Savior's hands, feet and side, but the coming of the Spirit caused their cries of "Crucify Him, crucify Him" to be turned to tears of mourning on Pentecost. Their cries became petitions reflecting their grief at what they had done. They cried out, "Men and brethren what shall we do" (Acts 2:37)?

Some remarkable truths are revealed in chapter thirteen. "In that day a fountain shall be opened for the house of David and for the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness" (v. 1). They killed His Son, and His response was to open a fountain of blood to wash their sins away! Our God is One who longs for all men to come to repentance.

Look at the next verse. "It shall be in that day, says the Lord of hosts...that I will also cause the prophets and the unclean spirit to depart from the land." In one brief There is no sentence God shows that demon possession would come to an end when He opened the fountain for longer any need sin. There is no need for exorcists in our day because for exorcists or

demon possession came to an end.

God was about to end the Old Testament prophets. When Malachi wrote his book, God would become silent and there would no longer be proph-

ets. When the fountain opened for sin, New Testament prophets would come again, but there would be an end to these prophets. When they had finished their work, God would again become silent. "I will cause the prophets to depart from the land." The opening of the fountain brought new prophets, but the end of their work was foretold. The faith has now been revealed once and for all (Jude 3). When God had given all that pertains to life and godliness (2 Pet. 1:3), He stopped sending prophets. We have all the truth in the book they left for us.



Pardon Me, But That's Not in the Bible

There are many modern-day proverbs that would surprise some people to find out that they are not in the Bible. For example: "Cleanliness is next to godliness"; "Spare the rod, spoil the child"; "Better to remain silent and be thought a fool than to speak and to remove all doubt." These are popular

maxims today, but if you look them up in a Bible concordance, you will not find them in the Bible.

Similarly, there are many popular sayings that folks use to try to offer comfort today that would surprise some people to find out that they are not in the Bible. For example: "God will not give you more than you can handle"; "Heaven gained another angel"; "It's all part of God's plan"; "Everything happens for a reason." These are often used as Biblical

counsel for those who are hurting, but if you look them up, you will not find them in the Bible.

Likewise, there are many doctrines today that would surprise some people to find out that they are not in the Bible. The doctrine of "salvation by faith only" is not in the Bible (Jas. 2:14-26; Mark 16:16). The doctrine of saying "the Sinner's Prayer" to be saved is not in the Bible (Matt. 7:21; Luke 6:46). The doctrine of "once saved, always saved" is not in the Bible (2 Pet. 2:20-22; Gal. 5:4). The premillennial doctrine of the rapture is not in the Bible (Mark 13:32; 1 Thess. 4:14-17). The "join the church of your choice" doctrine is not in the Bible (Eph. 4:4; Matt. 16:18). The doctrine of "all worship from the heart is acceptable to God" is not in the Bible (Matt. 15:7-9; John 4:23-24). The doctrine that promotes women preachers in the church is not in the Bible (1 Tim. 2:11-14; 1 Cor. 14:34-35). The doctrine of baptism washing away all previous marriages and divorces is not in the Bible (Matt. 19:9; 1 Cor. 6:9-

> 11). There are so many manmade doctrines today that sound good, but if you look them up, you will not find them in the Bible.

> So, with so much being said and believed today that is not in the Bible, what should we do? We should determine to speak where the Bible speaks. The Bible says, "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God" (1 Pet. 4:11). This can

only happen by spending time in the Bible and saturating our hearts and minds with Holy Writ (Psa. 1:2). We must know what the Book says (John 8:32). We should determine to not say things or believe things that the Scripture does not support (Gal. 1:8-9; Rev. 22:18-19). Even if something "sounds good," we must hold it up against the light of God's Word (Psa. 119:105). Finally, we should help to correct those who pass off certain sayings or beliefs as if they are from God. The Scripture is there "for correction" (2 Tim. 3:16-17), as long as we use it accurately (2 Tim. 2:15) and lovingly (Eph. 4:15).

Paul said this, and Timothy understood the application. In 1 Corinthians 9, Paul is defending his right to be paid for his labor in the kingdom. In this context, he mentions an often misunderstood passage.

"For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I may

win more. To the Jews I became as a Jew, so that I might win Jews; to those who are under the Law, as under the Law though not being myself under the Law, so that I might win those who are under the Law; to those himself a slave to Jewish synagogues or teach Jews if he was not cirwho are without law, as without law, though not being without the law of God but under the law of Christ, so that I might win those who are without law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak; I have become all things to all men, so that I may by all means save some. I do all things for the sake of the gospel, so that I may become a fellow partaker of it" (1 Cor. 9:19-23).

Some have used the idea of "becoming all things to all men" with great liberty. Paul clearly mentions being "under the law of Christ." He is not saying that he acted outside the boundaries of the gospel. He is referring to doing the things he could to make his presence and speech more acceptable to these different groups. He did not want to do anything that would hinder the message of the gospel.

Timothy understood this because of what happened in Acts 16:1-3. Here they were introduced to Timothy, and Paul wanted him to come with them on their journey. They know his father is a Greek, so they have Timothy circumcised before they leave. Paul said in 1 Corinthians 7:19, "Circumcision is nothing, and uncircumcision is nothing, but what matters is the keeping of the commandments of God." Poor Timothy! What is

> happening in Act 16? He is becoming all things to all men. He would not have been able to enter into the cumcised. To the Greeks, this was a strange mutilation of the body and culturally frowned upon. He did it for the sake of the gospel. So, the ordeal that Timothy endured was a direct application to making yourself a slave to others.

We need to consider our actions in evangelism and personal work in this light. If I could change a few things about how I present myself (WITHOUT COMPROMISING THE LAW OF CHRIST), then I might become more effective in gaining access into a particular group. It would be for the sake of the gospel. Paul is doing all he can to be able to have an opportunity to present the gospel. He has made himself a slave to others in their need for the gospel. What is misunderstood and overlooked is Paul's devotion and humility to serve others.

My Bible scholar against your Bible scholar






