The Secret of True Happiness in One Word

If you were asked to give a simple answer to the question about the secret of happiness on this earth, what would you say? The best response might be found in an acronym which has been around for decades. It deserves to be repeated because some may have forgotten it; others who have not

grown up in the church may have never heard it; and parents need to be reminded to teach it to their small children. It is based on using every letter of the word JOY True happiness is stumble" (1 Cor. 8:13). See that same attitude toto give the order of priority of true happiness: Jesus first; Others second and Yourself last.

life upon using Jesus first. We must never forget these words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount. "Seek ye every letter of a first the kingdom of God and His righteousness..." (Matt. 6:33). Nor should we forget that the greatest commandment of the Old Testament was, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30). Paul says it this way, "This one thing I do...I press toward the mark of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:13-14). There is no joy until we put first things first.

Others second. Unless we train ourselves otherwise, we will embrace the social norm of nature—survival of the fittest and all that matters is me and my happiness. That second greatest commandment still says, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The reality is that in one sense we are to love them more than ourselves. The Scriptures say, "Let each esteem others better than himself" (Phil. 2:3). The example of Paul's willingness to humble himself and put others first is clearly seen. Paul teaches that one can freely eat any kind of meat but was aware that some did not share this knowledge. What was his response? "If food makes my brother stumble, I

> will never again eat meat, lest I make my brother ward his actions in teaching the lost, "I have made myself a servant to all that I might win the more...to the Jew I became...to those without law I became... to the weak I became..." (1 Cor. 9:19-22).

Yourself last. Dealing with others who are so three letter word selfish is not easy, but each of them has a soul which we must seek to save. David describes winning the souls of others in terms of planting a crop and harvesting it. "Those who sow in tears shall reap in joy. He who continually goes forth weeping shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him" (Psa. 126:5-6). Beyond a shadow of a doubt, we shall sow and reap in joy. This will never happen until we put ourselves last.

> Remember that the secret of true joy in this is so simple. Jesus first, others second and yourself last.



He Knew No Sin, But Why?

There are some amazing things that we read about Jesus in the Bible. It is absolutely amazing to read about His fulfillment of over 300 specific Old Testament prophecies (many of which were completely out of His hands regarding fulfillment). It is amazing to read about the miracles that He per-

formed. It is amazing to read of those occasions when He knew what men were thinking and responded to their thoughts. It is amazing to read of the incomparable impact that He had on the world's population (throughout history to the present).

One of the amazing things that we read about Jesus (and sometimes lose sight of how requisite it is to our salvation) is that He never sinned not once. It may surprise you how often this is

affirmed in Scripture. Jesus was "in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us" (2 Cor. 5:21). Jesus was "separate from sinners" (Heb. 7:26), in that He "committed no sin" (1 Pet. 2:22) and "in Him there is no sin" (1 John 3:5) and "no unrighteousness" (John 7:18). Jesus went to the cross and was offered as "a lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Pet. 1:19; Heb. 9:14). Truly, no one was able to "convict" Jesus "of sin" (John 8:46). But, what is so special about that?

Jesus came to this earth "in the likeness of sinful flesh" (Rom. 8:3), meaning that He took on a flesh and blood body, which is not intrinsically (or inherently) sinful but is able to be tempted by the devil. And He was tempted! He was "in all points tempted as we are" (Heb. 4:15). (1) He was "tempted," which meant that sin must have been tempting for Him. (2) He was tempted "in all points," meaning the devil did not hold anything back. (3) He was tempted in all points "as

> we are," meaning that Jesus faced the same temptations that you face (cf. 1 Cor. 10:13). Yet, He did not sin! He did not give in to temptation even once!

> Don't you know that must have been incredibly hard? Don't you know that He must have been tempted to use filthy language, to call His enemies certain names, to hate those who mistreated Him, to lust after the women who were around Him, to

choose to not do the things that were right for Him to do? The fact that it was tempting indicates how enticing it was to Him. But, why didn't He give in? What kept Him from sinning?

Many answers could be given, but here's something to meditate upon: Jesus fought back every temptation to sin, knowing that if He sinned just once, then He couldn't save YOU! It was all for YOU! He came to be that lamb led to the slaughter for YOU (Isa. 53:7-8), but His sacrifice would only save YOU if He Himself was "without sin"! That is amazing!

God Rescues His People (Part 1)

God rescued His people from Egypt. When Pharaoh refused to let them go, God delivered a series of disasters to loosen his grip. When Pharaoh sent soldiers to recapture the people, God tore a sea in half to provide a way of escape. When these soldiers pursued the people through this same

passage, God covered Pharaoh's army with water. The Red Sea became the ultimate line-drawn-in-the-sand. Don't touch My people. God did all of this so that the Israelites would no longer be slaves. He repeatedly warned them that Egypt was all about oppression, hard-heartedness and false hope.

When the Israelites faced tough times, they for His people. often spoke of going back to Egypt. Over and over again, when the heat was too hot, when an enemy approached, when the food was less than tasty, the people of God looked to one place in particular for help: Egypt. It wasn't that the people necessarily wanted to be slaves again, but they were quite willing to surrender their freedom for the sake of shelter. Just the spices of Egypt alone were enough to cause the Israelites to look over their shoulders, while the marks left by the whips of Egypt were still healing.

God told them, even though Egypt had the things that looked like the answers to all their problems, it was a mistake to look to Egypt for help. "Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help and rely on horses, and trust in chariots because they are many and in horsemen because they are very strong, but they do not look to the Holy One of Israel, nor seek the LORD" (Isa. 31:1)! When enemies approached the gate, the Israelites believed the military forces of Egypt were the answer. But the people of God had forgotten. An earlier version of this same answer was decaying at the bottom of the Red

> Sea. By looking to Egypt for help, they were looking away from God.

> We have also left Egypt. When we became Christians, we were rescued from the slavery of sin. We crossed a Red Sea called baptism, and we continued to struggle on, through a wilderness that can often be difficult and discouraging. And back there, over our shoulder, beyond our decision to die with

Christ, the world waits, eager to enslave us once again. We know this. Even now, we can see the tracks of those who have indeed turned back, returning to a life of comfort and chains.

When their relationship with God had been compromised, the draw of worldly things grew more enticing in their minds, the people turned around to go back to Egypt. God said they "proceed down to Egypt... eek shelter in the shadow of Egypt" (Isa. 30:2). We must stay out of the shadows of the world that entices. God always provides a way for His people.

It's ok to let someone else have the credit

Or, are we like Paul, who did not care if Apollos got credit for something he had done, as long as "God" was the one who received the highest honor (1 Cor. 3:4-9)?



You can go to heaven (Matt. 7:21; Heb. 5:8-9)
