Are We Seeing the Signs of the “End of the World?”

This is the third article on the signs of the end, and you are encouraged to read the first two as they form the background of this one. (They are readily available on the church’s website). Many are convinced that all that is happening right now points to the end, and Jesus will come very soon to bring the final judgment on the earth.

The details of these signs given by Jesus are found in the first three books of the New Testament in Matthew 24, Mark 13 and Luke 21. Jesus spoke of the coming judge on the sinful Jewish nation (Matt. 23:34) and then told of the coming destruction of the temple. He then went to the Mount of Olives. Very few are aware of the audience when Jesus gave these signs. One will never understand these signs without recognizing those who heard about the signs.

Read Mark’s account very carefully. “Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked Him privately, “Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled” (Mark 13:3-4). Four men were the ones who were given these signs. Why is this important? *They were the ones who would see the signs!*

Who did Jesus say would see these signs? Look at the

text where I have capitalized the pronouns. Jesus said, “But when YOU hear of wars and commotions...for these things must come first...nation will rise against nation...there will be great earthquakes in various place, and famines and pestilences; and there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. But before all these things, they will lay hands on YOU, and persecute YOU, delivering YOU up the synagogues...YOU will be brought before kings and rulers...YOU will be betrayed by parents and brothers...and they will put some of YOU to death...but when YOU see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation is near...so YOU also, when YOU see these things happening know that the kingdom of God is near. Assuredly, I say to YOU, this generation will by no means pass away till all things take place” (Luke 21:9-32).

Read the Bible. Always let the Bible explain the Bible. Let Jesus tell you...

Let Jesus tell us who would see these signs. They were to be seen (all these signs) in that generation! Who was to see them? Peter, James, John and Andrew! Now if they saw all these signs and are all dead, these signs cannot point to WWI or WWII, or Korea, Vietnam, or the battles in Iraq and Afghanistan, or the threat of Russia or China in our day!

Read your Bible rather than books written by televangelists (who have made millions doing this). Read the Bible. Let the Bible explain the Bible. Let Jesus tell you who would see the signs. Next week, we will look at the great tribulation.

The King Was Always Focused on His Kingdom

Do you know anyone who always talks about the same things in every conversation? It gives you clear insight into what is most important to that person. What would you say that Jesus talked about continually and was most important to Him? It is not hard to figure out.

After Jesus was baptized, the Bible indicates that He went out working miracles and “preaching the gospel of the kingdom” (Matt. 4:23), telling the multitude, “I must preach the kingdom of God to the other cities also, because for this purpose I have been sent” (Luke 4:43). He talked to Nicodemus about the only entrance available into “the kingdom of God” (John 3:3-5). The Sermon on the Mount gave repeated attention to attitudes, conduct and conditions related to “the kingdom of heaven” (Matt. 5:3, 10, 19, 20; 6:10, 13, 33; 7:21). Jesus told parable after parable describing the nature of His coming kingdom (Matt. 13:1-52; 18:23-35; 20:1-16; 22:2-14; 25:1-30). He sent out the twelve apostles (Matt. 10:7; Luke 9:2) and the seventy disciples (Luke 10:9) to preach about the coming kingdom.

Jesus told His followers that the kingdom was coming. From the early days of His ministry, He proclaimed, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matt. 4:17). He prom-

ised to “build” His church and to “give...the keys of the kingdom of heaven” (Matt. 16:18-19). To further pinpoint the timing, Jesus announced that “there are some standing here who shall not taste death till they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom” (Matt. 16:28) and “see the kingdom of God present with power” (Mark 9:1). He went on to explain to His apostles that such would happen “in the city of Jerusalem” (Luke 24:49), “not many days from now” (Acts 1:5).

It was His reason for coming! It was His reason for dying!

When one reads through Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, he will read the word “kingdom” 127 times. That’s nearly one-and-a-half times in every chapter. Does that tell you how important the subject was to Jesus?

Then, consider that Jesus spent 40 days on the earth after His resurrection. These were His “last 40 days” to say whatever He wanted to say and to prepare His disciples for His departure. So, what did He spend 40 days talking to them about? “The things pertaining to the kingdom of God” (Acts 1:3).

The kingdom was vitally important to Christ! It was His reason for coming! It was His reason for dying! That’s why His followers continued in the book of Acts to preach, reason and persuade “concerning the kingdom of God” (Acts 8:12; 19:8; 28:23-31). This begs the question: How important is the kingdom to us? Do we talk about it? Is it our reason for living?

Do Not Lose Heart

It is within the realm of possibilities for Christians to get discouraged. Godly people throughout the Bible have struggled with living in a corrupt world. As we seek to live in accordance with a standard that elevates our living and raises our spiritual focus heavenward, there will be conflict. In that conflict, the fervor of our resolve is tested. Conflicts come through others, physical ailments, and random acts of chance. It is not “if” you will ever be discouraged, but “when.” What can we do to prepare ourselves so that we do not go down even to despair?

We need to start with an active prayer life. Christ equated fervent prayer with not losing heart (Luke 18:1). Most often, the first sign of losing heart is being haphazard in our prayer life. We fall out of habits, or we allow other circumstances to distract. In contrast, a strong Christian life is characterized by fervent prayer. “Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints” (Eph. 6:18). “Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving” (Col. 4:2).

Another deterrent to losing heart is being active in doing good. “For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap

everlasting life. And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart” (Gal. 6:8-9). If we can keep our focus outward on the work at hand, it keeps our minds moving forward. We are preparing for a spiritual reward. It is to that end that we should be striving. Even Christ “for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God” (Heb. 12:2).

Finally, we need to recognize that the things of this life are temporary. “Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal” (2 Cor. 4:16-18). In doing this, we keep a perspective that buffers our hearts and minds from being overwhelmed. This “light affliction,” Paul says, is nothing to compare with the “eternal weight of glory” that is provided for us.

How do we buffer ourselves from losing heart? Keep an active prayer life, continue in doing good to all men, and maintain the proper perspective on life. These are a few among many things that help hedge against losing heart.

The children will follow

When you look at a child’s face, can you sometimes see the resemblance to their parents? Maybe their eyes or their mouth reminds you of their parent’s eyes or mouth. As you know, it is not just the physical features that they will mirror, but their behavior will follow suit as well.

This is especially noticeable in the church setting. The children that you see carrying their Bible to church are ones who are emulating mom or dad. You may be surprised to consider that children’s conduct and involvement in worship almost always parallels precisely their parents. If parents pay attention, participate, take notes and enjoy worship, as a general rule, you’ll find their children do, also. But, if parents have their heads down the whole time (looking at their phone or reading a book or doing something else) and do not really engage in the worship service, as a general rule, you’ll find their children will do the same.

Parents, you are THE major influence in the spiritual direction of your child. Take it seriously. – DS



Some have already turned aside

When Paul wrote his first letter to Timothy, he was very concerned about the spiritual condition of “some” brethren. He stated that “some” had “strayed” from “faith” in Christ (1 Tim. 1:6). More than once, he lamented that “some” had “strayed” and even “rejected” “the faith” (6:10, 21; 1:19). He not only looked at such in the recent past, but he pointed to the future when “some will depart from the faith” (4:1). Paul placed a great emphasis on “the faith” in this letter (1:2, 19; 3:9, 13; 4:1, 6; 5:8; 6:10, 21), noting the seriousness of someone turning from it.

If you want to grasp the seriousness of someone turning from “the faith,” read this parallel expression: “Some have already turned aside after Satan” (5:15). “The sway of the wicked one” is powerful (1 John 5:19). He turns followers of Christ aside, even when we may least expect it.

Three things to do: (1) “Take heed” to ourselves (1 Tim. 4:16). (2) Seek those who have strayed and admonish them to come back (Gal. 6:1; 2 Thess. 3:15). (3) Pray (Gal. 6:2, 10). – DS





