The Day Satan Was Cast Out of Heaven

Satan was not

"cast out" in a

war in heaven

before the world

was created

There may be details in the last book of the Bible that we struggle to understand, but the message of Revelation chapter twelve so vividly describes, in figurative language, the conflict between heaven and hell and the battle between Satan and Christians. That message is so easy to understand. Take

time to read this chapter, and let God assure you that there is no question we will win the battle.

Verse four depicts Satan (described as a dragon) standing before the woman, who was in labor and ready to give birth to her son, as soon as he was born. Who was this son?

We know who this son is. The next verse tells us that he was to rule all nations with a rod of iron. The Bible leaves no doubt as to the identity of

this child. Let God tell you who this son in the second psalm. "You are My Son, today I have begotten You...Ask of me and I will give You the nations...You shall break them with a rod of iron." Acts 4:25-27 guotes this psalm and emphatically applies it to Jesus. Jesus is the child born in Revelation twelve whom Satan sought to destroy as soon he was born (Matt. 2).

The text says that "...the Child was caught up to God and His throne" (v. 5). What happened when He ascended into heaven? In figurative language, there was war in heaven with the armies of Satan fighting the armies of God. Satan was cast down to the earth. He "no longer" (v. 8) had access to the presence of God as he did when he brought accusation against Job. Note carefully that this war did not happen before the creation of Adam. It happened when Jesus ascended. When Satan was cast out he tried to destroy the saints-those "...who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ" (v. 17). The book of Acts describes this.

> How was Satan defeated by the resurrected Jesus? Jesus became a mortal that through His death "...He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil...and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage" (Heb. 2:14-15). Jesus destroyed Satan. He did not annihilate him but took from him the fear of death that all men since Adam had struggled with.

His open tomb released all mankind from that fearful bondage.

Jesus' life and death brought a revelation of our immortality. "Now has been revealed by the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Tim. 2:10).

When John saw Jesus on the island of Patmos, Jesus said, "I am He who lives, and was dead...and I have the keys of Hades and Death" (Rev. 1:18). Our Savior destroyed Satan when He took from him the keys to the grave!



Be Still and Know

We are living in uncertain times. We are living in dangerous times. We are living in troubling times. It seems that everywhere we turn there is something disastrous happening. It is enough to get you down and to keep you down. With all that's going on around us-from our families, to our local

communities, to our nation, to the whole globe-what can we do? How can we keep from being distraught?

Be still...and know that God is still God. God has not surrendered His throne. He is still "the ruler over the kings of the earth" (Rev. 1:5). He is still the God of "love" (1 John 4:8), "peace" (Phil. 4:9), "all grace" (1 Pet. 5:10), "patience and comfort" (Rom. 15:5) and "hope" (Rom. 15:13). No matter what happens, put your trust in that!

Be still...and know that right is still right. The world is doing its dead level best to confuse those who know what is right and who stand for what is right. Over 2,700 years ago, God said, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!" (Isa. 5:20). Those people are still living among us in the twenty-first century. Nevertheless, never doubt that the "commandments" of the Lord are "right" every time (Psa. 119:172), without fail, without exception. No matter what happens, put your trust in that!


Be still...and know that truth is still truth. We are told that we are living in a post-truth era and that truth today is subject to "the eye of the beholder" of whatever that truth is. However, God's truth is immutable (Matt. 24:35; 1 Pet. 1:23 -25), just as God is (Heb. 6:18-20). Folks may try to twist and turn it to fit their agenda, but remember that "the truth of the Lord endures forever" (Psa. 117:2). No matter what happens, put your trust in that!

Be still...and know that eternity is still real. It is so easy to take our eyes off of the "eternal," place them on the "temporary," and as a result, "lose heart" (2 Cor. 4:16-18). When that happens, work twice as hard to "Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Col. 3:2). Remember that "the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he

who does the will of God abides forever" (1 John 2:17). No matter what happens, put your trust in that!

Be still...and know that Christians still win in the end. You may not feel like you are winning. Around the world it may appear that Christians are on the losing side. But don't put your trust in appearances (2 Cor. 5:7). Jesus has already crushed the adversary (Heb. 2:14). Satan has already lost! Faithful Christians will be victorious (2 Tim. 4:7-8). No matter what happens, put your trust in that!

The Bible is full of examples of the faithfulness of man. We have some examples that are more prominent and famous. There are also examples that are more obscure. These seem to represent more of the common godly person. Epaphras is one that was faithful and fierce in his service but was not

prominent in the pages of the New Testament.

Epaphras is mentioned in two books of the New Testament, Philemon and Colossians. In Philemon Paul writes, "Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus, greets you" (1:23). It is clear that at the writing of this letter Epaphras was also imprisoned, assumingly for the crime of being a Christian. This speaks of his conviction in his service.

In Colossians, we are given a little more information about him. "Because of the hope laid up for you in heaven, of which you previously heard in the word of truth, the gospel which has come to you, just as in all the world also it is constantly bearing fruit and increasing, even as it has been doing in you also since the day you heard of it and understood the grace of God in truth; just as you learned it from Epaphras, our beloved fellow bond-servant, who is a faithful servant of Christ on our behalf, and he also informed us of your love in the Spirit" (Col. 1:5-8). From this passage we can discern a few things about the work of Epaphras. Paul talks about them having heard the gospel, understood it, and that it is bearing fruit. The worker behind these efforts was Epaphras. We have no record of Paul going to Colosse. However, Epaphras could have heard the message while Paul was in the region of Phrygia, either in Ephesus or Antioch of Phrygia. So Epaphras heard the message and preached it in his hometown. Then, at some point he goes to visit Paul in Rome when he was subsequently

imprisoned.

At the end of his letter, Paul mentions Epaphras again. "Epaphras, who is one of your number, a bondslave of Jesus Christ, sends you his greetings, always laboring earnestly for you in his prayers, that you may stand perfect and fully assured in all the will of God. For I testify for him that he has a deep concern for you and for those who are in Laodicea and

Hierapolis" (Col. 4:12-13). From this we learn that Epaphras is from Colosse. He is prayerful for the church, wanting them to "stand perfect" and "fully assured in the will of God." Paul testifies of the deep concern that Epaphras has for the churches in Colosse, Laodicea and Hierapolis. These other cities are neighboring cities to Colosse. It is possible that he took the Gospel to those cities as well or he had worked extensively with them. It is clear from these brief glimpses of Epaphras that he was a determined worker in the kingdom. May we strive to have the same level of conviction and service.

"For His mercy endures forever"

41 times in the Old Testament, you will read the expression, "His mercy endures forever." Perhaps not surprisingly, 33 of those 41 times are in the book of Psalms. And one of those psalms, which has 26 verses in it, contains that marvelous expression 26 times.

At the end of every verse in Psalm 136, the psalmist exclaims, "For His mercy endures forever." Is that overkill? Is that a bit redundant? Certainly not! The psalmist reflected on the supremacy of God, on the power of God, on the wisdom of God, on the creation of God, and he came to one conclusion: "His mercy endures

forever." The psalmist then reflected on all that God had done in leading and protecting Israel and came to the same resounding conclusion: "His mercy endures forever."

Take time to consider the majesty of your God! Take time to consider all that your God has done for you, is doing for you and has promised to do for you! Is there any better explanation for everything in your life than, "His mercy endures forever"? -DS

Take a minute to refresh and remember

Do the latest news reports have you worried about what's going on? Are the stresses of your job becoming more unbearable? Is there family tension that is causing you to feel increased levels of anxiety? Are your personal finances not enough to meet increased expenses? Are you stressed, anxious, worried, overwhelmed, maybe even a bit panicked?

> For 60 seconds, take a pause. Take two deep breaths. Shut out everything. Shut off everything. Think of two ways that God has blessed you just today. Think of two simple (30-second) ways you could make a positive difference in someone else's day (who may be experiencing

similar life issues). Talk to the Lord in simple terms, "Lord, I need you. I want you. I love you. Please, help me." Remember that with the Lord, there is "relief," "mercy," "favor," "good," "gladness," "peace" and "safety" (Psalm 4).

Is everything still going to be "going wrong" after these 60 seconds? Perhaps. But "put your trust in the Lord" (4:5) and He will "lift up the light of [His] face upon [you]" (4:6). -DS


