#### The Certainty and Uncertainty of Death

Consider these words of Paul describing the one enemy we all face and who seemingly is winning the battle in which we are engaged. "The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death" (1 Cor. 15:56). It is a common enemy for every person who has been born on this earth for "it is appointed

unto man to die" (Heb. 9:27). Knowing more about death helps us deal with it. Think of some deaths in the Bible.

- Who died because his brother killed him?
- Who died and was eaten by worms?
- Who died the same day he planned to build a new barn?
- Who died by suicide after losing his "paycheck?"
- Who died because he touched the ark?
- Who died but was not buried for 400 years?
- Who died just after seeing Jesus in heaven?
- Who died in perfect health at the age of 120?
- Who died when she was 12 years old?
- Who died when the roof fell on him?
- Who died with a tent peg in his head?
- Who died immediately after telling a lie (2)?

- Who died by being hanged on his own gallows?
- Who never died (2)?

So how did you do? The answers are: Abel, Herod, Foolish farmer, Judas, Uzzah, Joseph, Stephen, Moses, Jairus' daughter, Samson, Sisera, Ananias and Sapphira, Haman, Enoch and Elijah.

> Very few of the individuals listed above knew the circumstances under which they would die. Very few knew the time of their death. This is the nature of death. We all know that we are appointed to die and after that comes the judgment. Because we do not know when or how we will die, all that matters is that we prepare for it.

Thanks be to God that He, in His wisdom, has given us an understanding that no one in the Old

Testament had. It is in the New Testament where immortality is revealed and brought openly into the light (2 Tim. 1:10). Those saints of old were bound by the fear of death, but the resurrection of Jesus has removed this fear from us (Heb. 2:14-15). The open tomb of Jesus assures us of our own resurrection, and we can pray with greater understanding the prayer Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit" (Acts 7:59).

When you think about death and the grave remember that God who raised Jesus from the dead raises us!



#### Using the Word "Pastor" in the Way the Bible Uses It

Who does the

**Bible identify as** 

the pastors of

the church?

It is very common in religious circles to refer to certain men as "pastors." Denominational groups usually have someone known as "the pastor of the church." Recent news articles talk about what some "youth pastor" did. Some religious schools have a spiritual guidance counselor on campus and

they might refer to that person as "Pastor" so-and-so.

So what is a "pastor"? If we rely on modern usage of the term, various dictionaries define "pastor" as "a minister in charge of a Christian church or congregation" or "the leader of a Christian congregation." Note carefully the understanding of that term today: the pastor is "the leader" (definite article) of the church and is "in charge" of the congregation. But how does the Bible use that word?

The Greek word for "pastor" is *poimen*. The term is found frequently in the New Testament and is only once translated "pastors" (Eph. 4:11). Every other occurrence of the word is translated "shepherd." By definition of the Biblical word, a pastor is a shepherd. Now, who does the Bible identify as the pastors or the shepherds of the church?

The verb form of the word for "pastor" is *poimaino*, and that word is used in two key instances in the New Testament to identify who a pastor is. Look at Acts 20:28 and First Peter 5:2 carefully. Both passages identify the WORK that is to be taken by certain men—they are to "shepherd the flock of God." Both passages identify the POSITION of these men they are "overseers." Both passages are addressed to "elders" (Acts 20:17; 1 Pet. 5:1). What does that indicate?

In God's organizational structure for His church, He designed the church to have no human authority or organization above the local congregation. Each local congregation is

to be overseen by a plurality (always a plurality!) of qualified men (1 Tim. 3:1-7; Tit. 1:5-9), called elders/ presbyters (same Greek word), overseers/bishops (same Greek word) or pastors/shepherds (same Greek word). The plural emphasizes that no one man can exercise oversight over a congregation—there must be more than one elder/overseer/pastor in each congregation. Thus, the oversight and authority

within a congregation is not in "an elder" (or "pastor") but in the "eldership." No elder (or pastor) is above another.

The preacher is not by definition, then, a "pastor." He is not "the leader" "in charge" of the church. He is one of the members (sheep) of the congregation and is subject to the eldership (like all members, including the elders). He is not on a level "above" anyone else or to be "revered" as such (cf. Psa. 111:9); thus, there is no special title (ex: Pastor, Reverend, Father) for him to wear or to be called (Matt. 23:5-12).

"And he died" is found 72 times in the Bible. These words will also be said of you.



#### **New Life in Christ**

What does it look like to be a Christian? Do I have to have special bumper stickers that go next to my kid's honor roll announcement and my pollical affiliation sticker? How do I stand out from the sea of others that make claims of spirituality and general goodness? Before we get into what we

look like, we must understand that a new life doesn't happen able to until after baptism. "So that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4). After that act a new life is required.

Thankfully, the Bible does not leave us without information on this subject. The latter half of the fourth chapter of Ephesians provides distinct direction for us. It first reminds us of what the new life

isn't (Eph. 4:17-19). The old life was one that was characterized with ignorance and a hard heart. Such a one has "given themselves over to sensuality for the practice of every kind of impurity with greediness" (Eph. 4:19).

Those that are in a new life "did not learn Christ in this way" (Eph. 4:20). Those that have "heard Him and have been taught by Him" recognize the difference between old and new (Eph 4:21). We must understand "that, in reference to your former manner of life, you lay aside the old self, which is

being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth" (Eph. 4:22-24). This type of recognition of old verses now requires that changes be made. No more lying (Eph. 4:25). Do not sin in anger (Eph. 4:26 -27). Do not steal. On the contrary, work so that you will be able to provide and help others (Eph. 4:28). Do not sin in

> speech, but rather be known for saying things that edify (Eph. 4:29). Put away all forms of anger (Eph. 4:31). In turn, "be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you" (Eph. 4:32).

> These kinds of changes should ring out as a difference from our former manner of conduct. Those that knew us should be "surprised that you do

not run with them into the same excesses of dissipation, and they malign you" (1 Pet. 4:4). This type of life is one that is notably differenced as light to darkness and salted to unpreserved (Matt. 5:13-16). Now let's answer the question, "What does it look like to be a Christian?" The most obvious answer is we look like Christ. The daily "how to" of that equation is a change of conduct, speech, thinking, and general concern for the well-being of others. If people can see a difference in you, great! If they can't see a difference in you from the sea of people around you, then something needs to change.

And, isn't that true? We aren't usually friends with or hang around people with whom we don't share much in common. After all, "Birds of a feather flock together."

> However, unfortunately, the reality is that sometimes we do hang out with people we shouldn't. We may think that is innocent and "no big deal," but the Bible teaches differently. Paul asked some rhetorical questions to get us thinking: "What fellowship has righteousness

with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? And what accord has Christ with Belial? Or what part has a believer with an unbeliever? And what agreement has the temple of God with idols?" (2 Cor. 6:14-16). The answer to all of these questions is: "None!"

Let us be extremely careful with whom we "yoke" ourselves (6:14), for our "company" can easily negatively influence our "habits" (1 Cor. 15:33). – *DS*
