I Am the God of Abraham

The faith of Abraham is emphasized throughout the Bible. You cannot think of this great man without marveling how his faith impacted every decision of his life. We have faith because we read the Bible (Rom. 10:17), but Abraham did not have one! Yet look at how God had revealed Himself to this

"father of the faithful" and given him the depth of understandbuilt a built a built a thought of God in this same way. We would be

Abram Knew God As the Most High God

"Abram said to the king of Sodom, 'I have raised my hand to the Lord, God most High...'" (Gen. 14:22). The pagans had their gods, but the God of all gods was Jehovah. There is none higher and the Most High said we are to have no other gods!

Abraham Knew the God of All the Earth Would Do Right

When God revealed to Abraham about the judgment about to come on Sodom and Gomorrah, Abraham had such a close relationship with Him that he confronted God. Not on the basis of how great Abraham was, but on the basis of the nature of the Most High God. "Far be it from You to do such a thing as this, to slay the righteous with the wicked... Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right" (Gen. 18:25). Lives are changed when we see the holiness of God.

Abram Knew God was Worthy of Our Worship

When he entered the Promised Land, "There he built an altar." Then when he came to Bethel, "He built an altar to the Lord, and called on the name of the Lord." He came back to Bethel, "And there Abram called on the name of the Lord." When he went to Hebron, "Abram...built an altar to the Lord." He took Isaac to the top of the mountain in Jerusalem, "And built an altar there" (Gen. 12:7, 8; 13:4; 13:18; 22:9). You could

have followed Abraham by following the smoke which ascended from his altars!

When he met Melchizedek, a priest of God Most High, Abram gave tithes to him (Gen. 14:18-20). How blessed we would be if we too understood that God is worthy of our worship and seeks our gifts.

Abraham Knew That God Was Eternal

Abraham came to Beersheba, "...and there called on the Lord, the Everlasting God" (Gen. 21:33). God was not someone who was part of Abraham's life when it fit into his lifestyle. God was eternal. He is the One who was, and is, and is to come (cf. Rev. 4:8). Abraham understood that He is I AM before this name was given at Mt. Sinai.

There is More

This is only the beginning. Read Genesis to know the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. He is *your* God!



The Bible Says That Global Warming Will Destroy the Earth

There is a lot of talk today about socalled "global warming," or as it seems to be called these days, "climate change." For some people, it has become a religion that involves, essentially, worshiping the earth. Most folks, it would seem, have accepted the premise of "global warming" or "climate

change," without actually examining the evidence themselves. It is reminiscent of the theory of evolution being accepted and propagated, without any solid, verifiable **A reli** evidence to support it.

The evidence shows that over the years the temperatures have gone up and the temperatures have gone down (almost like an intentionally designed cycle). Now, does the evidence indicate that man has ever been responsible for the rise in tem-

peratures when that has happened? (Of course, no one asks if man has ever been responsible for the temperature going down.) Step back and consider just some basic information.

About 72% of the earth is covered by water. It is the waters of the earth (not the land) that are responsible for regulating the temperatures of the earth. So dry land only makes up about 28% of the earth's surface, and if you subtract the desert and mountainous regions of the earth, less than half of that 28% dry land is even habitable. It has been estimated that

10% of the land on earth (which would be less than 3% of the total earth surface) is inhabited, and less than 20% of the world's population (which would be living on less than 1% of the whole earth's surface) lives in industrialized nations. (These numbers are intentionally estimated high.) Of course, industrialized nations making up far less than 1% of the earth's surface is only dealing with the surface of the earth. That has not even taken into consideration the multiple layers of atmos-

phere surrounding the earth, which are designed by God to absorb pollutants and protect the earth.

What's the point? Is it not rather egocentric of humans to believe that they (so small and insignificantly minute compared to the massive volume of the earth) could do something to affect the climate of the earth? Could we then also affect its axis tilt, rotation or gravitational pull? Let's put things into

proper perspective and consider the evidence for ourselves. Unfortunately, man is more interested in worshiping the created things (like the earth) rather than the Creator (Rom. 1:25).

The truth is that the global warming that all men should be concerned about is the "fervent heat" that will come at the end of time and "burn" the earth up (2 Pet. 3:10). One day the earth will be gone, and we will all be in an eternal realm elsewhere. Where will you be? That eternal place of fiery temperatures should be what you're trying to avoid!

Follow the Example

Oh, how much easier things are when you have examples. When you are assembling something from Ikea for example. You saw it in the store. They had an example of a fully mocked-up room, and they showed you how the item could be used. By Josh Blackmer You buy it, take it home, and start the pro-

cess of assembling the item. The instructions are helpful, but

sometimes it is good to see the actual, fully-formed item. To see how it all fits together and how it Seeing someone should function helps in the assembly. In a similar fashion, we have encouragement from the Scriptures to look toward good examples.

Paul writes, "Brethren, join in following my example, and observe those who walk according to the pattern you have in us" (Phil. 3:17). It is clear

that Paul is not touting himself to be deity to be followed, just an example of one who walks with Christ. He wrote to the Corinthians, "Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ" (1 Cor. 11:1). It is simple to see the concept. Reading Scripture gives us knowledge. Yet, seeing it lived out in others helps us to understand the application. This only works because there is a standard. In the above verse from Philippians, Paul uses the Greek word "tupos" for "pattern." It is the idea of a stamp or impression. It is a copy of the original. In the previous verse he wrote, "let us keep living by that same standard to which we have attained" (Phil. 3:16). Translated from Greek, it literally reads, "by the same rule walk, the same thing think" (YLT). The concept of following the example of others carries with it the responsibility for us to make sure those we follow are following the same rule. There are a lot of bad examples out there.

"For many walk of whom many times I told you—and now also weeping tell-the enemies of the cross of the Christ!

whose end is destruction, whose god is the belly, and whose glory is in their shame, who the things on living them out is earth are minding" (Phil. 3:18-19). This is the accusation that Jesus had against Peter, "Get thee behind me, adversary! thou art a stumbling-block to me, for thou dost not mind the things of God, but the things of men" (Matt. 16:23). Peter didn't want Jesus to die for his own reasons. When we try to blend the will

> of heaven with our own fleshly will, we distort the pattern, and we are no longer good examples. We should be quick to discern between those who genuinely want to serve God and those that are serving their own gain.

> It is clear that proper examples can be helpful. We all have the same instructions for life. Yet, seeing someone living them out is a great asset in our Christian walk. Beware of the bad examples around us. Compare them to the pattern given so as to divide between right and wrong. Then, be an example.

graven image or mini-god to us? For some, the earth itself has become a god to be worshiped. For others, it's the remote control. Our phones. Our computers. Our social media. Our kids' ball games. Our jobs. Our prestige. Our money. Our credit cards. Our bucket list.

It is very easy for something to get in the way of our relationship with God. That's the purpose of the second commandment 3,500 years ago. What graven image do you need to take down? - DS
