When your own family members let you down, say things that hurt, forget to do things they promised to do, ignore your efforts to show kindness, dump everything on you and expect you to handle it all, fail to Are you kidding? do their part with household and family needs, act one way at home and a completely different way at church, don't seem to trust you, make selfish decisions...be nice anyway!

When your friends—even some friends that

you thought were your "good friends"—disappoint you, make choices that slight you, treat others better than they treat you, are not always consistent, seem to be hot or cold around you without explanation, talk about you behind your back, choose to hang out with others instead of you, befriend some folks you don't particularly like, forget special days or special events, seem to ignore your messages...be nice anyway!

When your coworkers lie about you, cheat to gain an advantage over you, laugh at you, cuss you out, take credit for God and Our Tears

The Bible has much to say about our tears when with broken hearts we come to Him.

Isaiah had just told Hezekiah that he was about to die, and the righteous king immediately prayed to God. Before Isaiah got outside the palace, God came to him and told him, "Thus says the Lord, the God of David your father, 'I have

heard your prayer, I have seen your tears; surely I will add to your days fifteen years'" (Isa. 38:5).

Here's a Bible quiz to help us see how easily we overlook great truths

In the psalms, David cried and prayed to God. "All night I make my bed swim; I drench my couch with my tears" (Psa. 6:6). "Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry; do not be silent at my tears" (Psa. 39:12). "Put my tears into your bottle; are they not in your book?" (Psa. 56:8). David then described God's response, "For you have delivered

my soul from death, my eyes from tears, and my feet from falling" (Psa. 116:8).

Oh, the joy of knowing that God sees our tears. Look at those questions again and see God's involvement in them. Then, pray fervently knowing just how much He cares.

When your own church family members-the very ones who should know better-seem to avoid you, have been rumored to spread gossip about you, are obviously acting hyp-

> ocritical, say things that cut you to the core, try to act like they were "only joking" when they hurt you, don't invite you to something when they've invited "everyone else," seem to refuse to respond to your efforts to contact them, dishearten you, don't do what you think they should do...be nice anyway!

When people in the world mistreat you, mess up your food order, cut you off in traffic, cut you in line at the store, take forever to check out at the store, lie about you online, steal from you, lose something that belongs to you, find satisfaction at your misfortune, refuse to do even the smallest thing to help you, insult you, exploit you, capitalize on your mistakes...be nice anyway!

Are you kidding? Be nice anyway? Why? First, it is what Jesus would do! Second, it is actually what Jesus did! Third, it is what the Bible teaches us to do (Rom. 12:14-21)! Fourth, it is the only way to go to heaven (Matt. 5:11-12)!

Do Not Harden Your Heart

The Bible is full of examples, both good and bad. The New Testament writers were inspired to use those examples for our learning (Rom. 15:4). There is a section of Scripture in Hebrews chapter three that highlights an attitude that would keep us out of heaven.

"Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of

you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living God" (Heb. 3:12). The writer of Hebrews uses the examples of the children of Israel wondering in the desert as an example of what it means to fall away from God. There were three things mentioned that they did. They hardened their hearts, they went astray in their hearts, and they didn't know God's ways (3:8, 10). These are not hard to find in the peo-

ple of today. Even in Jesus' day people had the same problem. Quoting from Isaiah He said, "For the heart of this people has become dull, with their ears they scarcely hear, and they have closed their eyes, otherwise they would see with their eyes and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart and return, and I would heal them" (Matt. 13:15). It is clear that this is a human problem. From the beginning, people have struggled with this. The writer of Hebrews shares with us how this hardening happens—"you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin" (3:13b). The reason why this is a human condition is because sin is a problem we all have to face. Choosing to follow and believe in God is not because there is a lack of evidence. Those that spoke directly with God and saw His wonderous works didn't always obey. Those in the wilderness believed that God existed, that He was a real entity. However, they did not obey. Belief alone is not enough to get us into heaven. Every time we choose sin over obedience, we have hardened our hearts a

> little more toward God. "For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins" (Heb. 10:26). You can harden your heart to the point that you would never return to the sacrifice for you sins.

> What can we do to keep our hearts from hardening? Stay away from sin as much as possible.

"Work out your salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:12b). We also have this encouragement, "But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called 'Today,' so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have become partakers of Christ, if we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end" (Heb. 3:13-14). There is a sense in that we need to help one another not get to the point of having a hardened heart toward God. In doing so we "hold down" or "seize onto," as this word suggests, the assurance we had at the beginning of our faith in God.



God comforts the downcast

Here is how Paul described his state of mind in Second Corinthians chapter 7. He had had "no rest" (7:5). Sound familiar? He was "troubled on every side," as "outside were conflicts" and "inside were fears" (7:5). Truly, Paul felt "downcast" (7:6). Have you been there before?

But notice how verse 6 begins. While Paul was troubled, the next verse says, "Nevertheless God..." Think about that in your life. When you're dealing with "no rest," "trouble on every side," "conflicts" and "fears," NEVERTHELESS GOD! There is something (yea, SOMEONE) in your life Who is a steady, reliable, fortifying constant!

"Nevertheless God, who comforts the downcast, comforted us by the coming of Titus" (7:6). The word "downcast" indicates one who is "low on the ground." And when you are "low on the ground," God is there (always!) to pick you up and comfort you, through His Word, through His promises, through His presence and through His people! Don't ever forget that! – DS



As long as I "mostly" follow the Lord or "nearly always," that's good enough, right? Consider the stark contrast in Numbers 32. Joshua and Caleb "wholly followed the Lord" (32:12), and they were the ones permitted to enter the Promised Land. But "the Lord's anger was aroused" against those who had "not wholly followed" Him (32:10-11). "Not wholly" following the

Lord is equated in this text with doing "evil in the sight of the Lord" (32:13), being "sinful" (32:14) and "turning away from following" the Lord" (32:15). The text emphasizes three times how such behavior "aroused" and did "increase still more" the anger of the Lord (32:10, 13, 14). 500 years later, the Lord had

not changed His perspective, when "Solomon did evil in the sight of the Lord," which is then equated with the fact that he "did not fully follow the Lord" (1 Kgs. 11:6).

What does God expect of us today? Is "mostly" following Him good enough? He calls us to "walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him..." (Col. 1:10). We must give Him our all (Luke 10:27)! -DS
