# Words—the Basis of Faith

Paul's words to young Timothy were so descriptive of the trials he would have to face. Those verses in 1 Timothy 4 were given to Timothy because of what was happening. The gospel was soon to be preached to every creature under heaven, and the future of the church was so promising.

Paul warned Timothy that the Holy Spirit of God had

clearly revealed that some would depart from the faith and begin following false teachers and the lies they taught (1 Tim. 4:1). Their teaching was that Christians must refrain from eating certain foods. What was the truth about this matter? The Holy Spirit revealed through Paul that such was false teaching you believe, then the basis of the "pattern of sound words." A pattern for "...every creature of God is good, and nothing is to be refused if it is received with thanksgiving; for it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer" (1 Tim. 4:4-5).

Timothy's task was to take this truth and instruct the brethren. If he did this, he would be a good minister of Jesus Christ, for he had been nourished in the words of faith and had carefully followed them (1 Tim. 4:6). Notice how the truths of God are described. They are based on the words of faith.

Look again at the contrast. Some had left the faith by following those who had departed from the faith. When they spoke, they did not speak the words of truth, but they were "...speaking lies in hypocrisy." Timothy's task was to stay faithful to the truth and instruct his listeners to stay in accordance with the words of faith.

Faith is based on words. If there are no divine words to describe what one believes, then his faith is not based on what God said. We express ideas using words. We express heavenly ideas by using heavenly words. If there are no Biblical words to describe one's faith, then it cannot express an idea

which has its origin in heaven.

There is more to be added to these thoughts. Paul instructs Timothy saying, "Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me" (2 Tim. 1:13). The words of faith become shows what must be done and become the basis of duplicating precisely what was in the pattern. The

reason forbidding the eating of certain foods was false teaching is because such teaching does not follow the pattern. This pattern is expressed in words, sound words.

Now make the application. Timothy was instructed to take the things he learned from Paul and deliver them to faithful men who then could deliver them to others (2 Tim. 2:2). Timothy was to take the words of faith and teach as a pattern to be followed by using sound words. This pattern was then to be given to others. God help us to find the words of faith!



# **Amazed By Amazing Deacons**

The Lord's church is made up of the most wonderful people on the face of the earth! Over the years, I have been tremendously impressed with so many of the deacons of the church, both at Palm Beach Lakes and in other congregations. Deacons have a special, God-given purpose in the church.

The word "deacon" is from a Greek word that means "servant, minister." These men are given specific tasks by the overseers of the church to carry out, in order that the work of the church (in evangelism, edification and benevolence) might be as effective as possible.

Overall, deacons are like anyone else in the church. There are some deacons who are strongly committed to their assigned tasks and give their all to meeting (and even surpassing) their assigned du-

ties. On the other hand, there are some deacons who do the minimum needed for their assigned duty. And, of course, there are deacons in between these two extremes. I want to focus on that first category of deacons. In my lifetime in the church and in 25+ years of fulltime labor, I have been amazed by some amazing deacons!

I have seen amazing deacons who devoted much of their TIME to their task, and they did so willingly and gladly. Time is a precious commodity of which we often complain we "don't have enough." But I've seen deacons who gave and gave and gave of their time to the Lord and His church. They did not begrudge it. They did not seek special accolades for it. They just did it...for the Lord!

I have seen amazing deacons who put forth immense EFFORT to fulfill their tasks, and they do so willingly and gladly. They were not half-hearted or minimalists in their efforts. These men wanted the job done right, knowing that all things

> in the church reflect upon the Lord. They were not doing it for themselves but doing it...for the Lord!

> I have seen amazing deacons SELFLESSLY SACRIFICE, in order to ensure the task was done right. Sacrificing their time has already been mentioned, but in addition, some have sacrificed their own resources (supplies, tools, money, etc.), their family time, their efforts on their own jobs, even

their vacations to see that an assigned task was completed in the very best way it could be...for the Lord!

Most of the time these men work behind the scenes and very few people know what they do or how much they do. But the Lord knows! He talked about these kind of deacons when He said, "For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus" (1 Tim. 3:13). Thank you to so many amazing deacons who work tirelessly...for the Lord!

### **Do Not Worry**

At some point we may have thought about how the wicked can have so much. Why does it seem that those that live in complete disregard for God and His judgments can live in abundance and ease? We read passages that speak to the prosperity of the righteous and the wicked being cut off and

wonder, "When will I prosper?" (Psa. 1:3-4). The remedy for this kind of thinking is mentioned three times in Psalm 37. "Do not fret because of evildoers" (Psa. 37:1). "Do not fret because of him who prospers in his way" (Psa. 37:7). "Do not fret; it leads only to evildoing" (Psa. 37:8). Verses 7-11 of this Psalm give us a glimpse into the overall message. **When will I prosper**?" (Psa. 1:3-4). The remedy for this kind of thinking is mentioned three times in **"For loves j does n** 

"Rest in the Lord and wait patiently for Him" (Psa. 37:7a). "Rest" means to be silent and still,

to take a time out. "Be still and know that I am God" (Psa. 46:10). We don't like waiting. We are no longer conditioned to wait. Waiting on the Lord is a big theme in the Old Testament. It is mentioned twice in this psalm (v. 7, 34). A patient waiting and confidence in the Lord is what is being encouraged. If we are not good at waiting, we are worse at being patient in waiting. Paul reminds us, "But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it" (Rom. 8:25). "Do not fret because of him who prospers in his way" (Psa. 37:7b). When someone says, "Don't worry about it," we normally re-

spond with, "Oh, I'm glad you said that. I was about to worry there for a second." In this psalm, our worry is put into context. It is going to be worse for the wicked. We are instructed to "cease from anger" because one result of unbridled worry is anger. How many of you get angry watching the news? Things happen that we have no control over, and we wish it was different. It's the same for those that see the wicked prosper and worry about it. There is nothing we can do about it. That is

> God's work, not ours. "Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not give the devil an opportunity" (Eph 4:26-27). This is again why we are encouraged not to worry. "It leads only to evildoing" (Psa. 37:8b). Often we try to "fix" things, and it makes it worse. Abraham said, "Tell them you're my sister; they might kill me" (Gen. 12:13). Sarah said, "Have a child with my servant girl. What could possibly go wrong?" (Gen. 16:2).

In this psalm, we can take comfort in the contrast of the wicked and righteous. Evildoers will be cut off and will be no more. The righteous will inherit the land and delight themselves in abundant prosperity. We must learn to rest in the Lord and patiently wait on Him. "Depart from evil and do good, So you will abide forever. For the LORD loves justice and does not forsake His godly ones; They are preserved forever, But the descendants of the wicked will be cut off. The righteous will inherit the land and dwell in it forever" (Psa. 37:27-29).

#### Brother or sister, please don't turn!

Sometimes our faith weakens. Sometimes our trust wavers. Sometimes our confidence wanes. Sometimes our priorities shift. Sometimes our devotion fades. Sometimes our desires change. And, when that happens, sometimes we fall from where we need to be. We may even "turn."

God was the one who used the word "turn" to describe the action that a mind/heart takes, which is followed by the body/life. While one may "turn TO" God (Acts 26:20; 1 Thess. 1:9), he can also "turn AWAY" or "turn FROM" God (1 Tim. 5:15; 2 Pet. 2:21). This is not merely a matter of turning from the church or "from the truth" (Tit. 1:14), but turning away "from Him who called you in the grace of Christ" (Gal. 1:6).

Brother or sister, our loving Father "called you in the grace of Christ." The grace of Christ led Him to give "Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us from this present evil age" (1:4). Please, please don't turn from Him! And if you are on that verge, please turn back! You are loved! – DS



James 1:19 is certainly a verse that each of us ought to memorize. It is one of those verses that we need to hide in our heart, so that we sin against the Lord less (Psa. 119:11). There is much to emphasize in the verse, including where we often focus—be "slow to speak" and "slow to anger." But before those two instructions is this—"be quick to hear."

> Would you say that you are "quick to hear"? That is not saying, "Be quiet." That is necessary and productive, but it is not equivalent to "hearing." Someone can be quiet without hearing the other person. "Quick to hear" is not saying, "Just wait your turn. Wait until the oth-

er person stops talking." Again, that is necessary and productive, but it is not equivalent to "hearing." If I am thinking about what I am going to say while the other person is talking, that is not "hearing."

Truly "hearing" someone involves active listening, giving eye contact, thinking about what is being said, showing respect. Question: Are you "quick" to do all that? -DS
