Bible and look at

word used



Sometimes we struggle to find the greatest benefit from reading the Bible and understanding what is being said. It may be because we are reading it too fast and not noticing the impact of individual words being used. An illustration can be found in slowing down and asking why the words "wherefore"

and "therefore" are found and why they are there.

The word "therefore" is found 1,355 times in the NKJV of the Bible. The older King James Version often uses the word "wherefore" instead of the word "therefore." Slow down as you read and after you read the word ask, "What is the word therefore 'there-for'?" What is its meaning? God has made a statement and then has drawn a conclusion based on what He just said or is about to say. The same is true

of the translation of the word "wherefore." When you see it, ask yourself, "'What-for' is this word here? Why is God using this word, and what is He trying to say?"

This way of clearly studying the Bible can be seen in the way Jesus uses the word when discussing the great care God gives to the birds. He then adds, "Therefore do not fear, for you are of more value than sparrows" (Luke 12:7). Jesus used the word "therefore" 92 times in His teachings, and Paul uses the word nearly 150 times in his writings. As you read the Bible and come across these words, take time to look at the context where they are found. Read the verses before these words and the words after them and focus on why God chose to use them. This simple way of reading the Bible will deeply enhance your appreciation for truth.

The fact that these words are used emphasizes the truth that our relationship to God is not based on emotions. There is a Divine reason God chose to use them. For example,

> God did not just arbitrarily give the Sabbath command as some ritual action for the Jews to do. He told them, "Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt...therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day" (Deut. 5:15).

> Paul used the word five times in reference to the use of tongues in 1 Corinthians 11. Slow down as you read and ask each time, "Why is this word

'there-for'?" God gives commands for us to obey, but often shows why He wants us to keep them by using the word "therefore." Paul's writings show this again and again.

Finally, remember that Christianity, properly understood, is so logical. I understand we walk by faith and sometimes do not fully comprehend why God says what He does, but notice the use of these words. Slow down as you read and appreciate His truths and the basis on which it is given. Remember "there-for" and "what-for."



Do We Trust God with the Roles of Persons in His Church?

Have you heard? Apparently God is a "male chauvinist." Or maybe it's that "the Bible is an archaic, out-of-date book." Or perhaps the report that you've heard is that "the church of Christ is stuck in the past" and is only interested in "blind traditions." Have you heard any accusations like these when

the subject of the role of women in the church is raised? Such statements have actually been made, unfortunately.

In our culture today, it is highly unpopular to draw any lines and differentiate at all in the roles that men can have and the roles that women can have in anything. However, the subject of the role of women in the church is not one that can or should be dictated by what "our culture" thinks or says. If Biblical matters were always subject to and shaped by the

culture, then the authority would reside in man and not in God. However, you know that man has no authority in the determination of Biblical truths (Matt. 28:18; Jer. 10:23).

Therefore, let us remind ourselves of some foundational principles. Every word in the Bible is chosen by God (2) Tim. 3:16). Those words represent the final revelation of the will of God (Jude 3), and they supply mankind with everything he needs to know to serve the Lord acceptably in every time and every culture (2 Pet. 1:3; 2 Tim. 3:17). Truly, "the word of God...lives and abides forever" (1 Pet. 1:23). God's truth is "settled in heaven" (Psa. 119:89), and it is not to be changed by any person in any culture (Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18-19).

The distinction of roles for men and women in the church, as detailed in the New Testament, is not difficult to understand. Males are to be chosen as elders and deacons (1 Tim. 3:2, 12), and males are to take the lead in the "everywhere" assemblies of the church (1 Tim. 2:8). "Let a

> woman learn quietly with all submissiveness. I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to be remain quiet" (1 Tim. 2:11-12). Males are to take roles of leadership in the church, including teaching in the assemblies of the church, and women are not to take those roles.

> > God does not identify different roles out of

hatred or chauvinism. God does not have a higher view of or place a higher value upon men than women. They are roles that He has defined for His church to operate in the manner He has designed. But these roles were not cultural and are not subject to cultural changes. God tied these roles all the way back to the creation order and to the woman being deceived and introducing sin into the world (2:13-14).

The difference in roles is not chauvinistic, out of date or a blind tradition, nor can they be shaped by a culture. They are fixed, just as the entirety of God's will is. Do we trust God to know what is best (in His eyes) for His church?

Roles that God has defined for His church to operate as He has designed

generations. "I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter have dark sayings of old, which we have heard and known, and our fathers have told us. We will not conceal **Teach them**,

them from their children, but tell to the generation to come the praises of the LORD, and His strength and His wondrous works that He has done. For He established a testimony in Jacob And appointed a law in Israel, which He commanded our fathers that they should teach them to their children, that the generation to come might know, even the children yet to be

born, that they may arise and tell them to their children, that they should put their confidence in God and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments, and not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation that did not prepare its heart and whose spirit was not faithful to God" (Psa. 78:2-8). It is in this Psalm that the intent of the Shema is outlined in further detail. "Now this is the commandment, the statutes and the judgments which the LORD your God has commanded me to teach you, that you might do them in the land where you are going over to possess it, so that you and your son and your grandson might fear the LORD your God, to keep all His statutes and His commandments which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be prolonged" (Deut. 6:1-2).

Both passages place an emphasis on teaching future generations so that they do not repeat the same wrongs. We have been given that same information to pass down to future

> generations that they too would learn to fear God and keep His commandments. It is imperative that we teach those things. I would ask you this question though. How much of your faith does your child know? Have you told your children of the time you prayed to God earnestly for something and He answered your prayer? Have you told them of the time where a Biblical principle was applied in your life and

you saw the outcome? Have you told them of the changes you made in your life because of God and His mercy? I challenge you to make faith real for your children by sharing yours with them. It is one thing to read about people that lived thousands of years ago. It's quite another for them to see your faith now.

Moses warned the people to do the commands in the land where they were going "so that" future generations would fear and obey the commandments of God. If we aren't obedient to God's word, we cannot expect future generations to be.
