# Seeing Souls, Not Just Seeing People

I remember as a young missionary the words of another missionary in New Zealand. We were discussing how to better find individuals to teach and how to lead them to Christ. It was hard to find those interested in the Bible in New Zealand as we tried to do our work. He then said something I will never

forget. "Dan, are you still seeing souls?"

The world is lost and every person you meet is a soul, but sometimes we fail to see those souls. Christ died for the lost, and our responsibility is to take the gospel to the lost. There is a vast difference between seeing people and seeing souls.

sic illustration is Jesus talking to the Samaritan woman at the well. She was amazed that a Jew would even speak to her. She asked Jesus why he would even ask her to give him a drink from the well. Her reason? "The Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans" (John 4:9).

Jesus was so different from the rabbis of His day. One description of them is found in Robertson's Daily Bible Study. He says, "A rabbi might not even speak to his own wife or daughter in public. There were even Pharisees who were called 'the bruised and bleeding Pharisees' because they shut their eyes when they saw a woman on the street and so walked into walls and houses!" Jesus was not like them. His apostles were so amazed that Jesus was talking to a woman of Samaria but did not ask Him about His actions (John 4:29).

Jesus saw souls, and He saw the soul of the woman of Samaria. The apostles saw her leave to return to the city, not knowing what she did when she came into the city. She told those there to come to the well suggesting that she had found the Messiah. The text then described how those in the city

> believed her and were coming to the well to investigate for themselves.

Do you know what Jesus said to the apostles as all of this was happening? "Lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for har-Unlike us, Jesus always saw souls. The clas- you in a different vest" (John 4:35). The apostles could have seen those coming from the city, and all they saw were Samaritans, a people with whom the apostles had no deal-

> ings. Do you know what Jesus saw? He saw souls! When they arrived at the city, they too found the treasures of Jesus. He saw the souls and spent two full days teaching them.

What about us? Do we see the souls of rude servers in a restaurant? Do we see the souls of those around us as we wait in a doctor's office? Do we see the souls, or do we only think of how bad we are being treated?

The next time it happens, "Life up your eyes to the harvest." It will change how you deal with others.

# A Baby in a Dumpster — Nothing New About That!

On January 7, 2022, a newborn baby was found still alive in a dumpster behind a shopping center in Hobbs, New Mexico. The baby was wrapped in a dirty towel and was inside two plastic bags with trash. The newborn baby boy (although it's not clear if the baby had yet self-identified as a male) had

been thrown in the dumpster six hours earlier by his mother, with his umbilical cord still attached. Three individuals went to the dumpster that Friday evening looking Why does our for items of value and heard the newborn crying.

This event in a small town in New Mexico on a random Friday evening has captured national attention. WHY? Why does our nation care about a baby being found little baby being found in a dumpster?

Think about these "interesting" details of the story: (1) the people who found the baby are being praised as "good Samaritans" who "saved the baby's life"; (2) the 911 dispatcher eagerly wanted to ensure the baby boy was still alive and breathing; (3) police rushed the baby to a hospital; (4) the baby was airlifted to a different hospital in Lubbock, Texas; and (5) the mother has been charged with attempted murder and child abuse. Think about those five things.

Why do I say these are "interesting" details? If only the mother had aborted the baby just 24 hours earlier, (1) no one would have found the baby alive, (2) no 911 dispatcher would have been involved, (3) the police would not have been notified, (4) a hospital staff would not have cared, and (5) the mother would not be charged with murder and child abuse. What a difference 24 hours made!

Here's the harsh reality: Babies, by the thousands, were thrown in dumpsters every day for years, wrapped in plastic bags. And no one seemed to care. Currently, the abor-

> tion clinics may grind the bodies or incinerate them. And, again, no one seems to care. So, WHY care now? What difference does 24 hours make?

> Amazingly, there still seems to be a conscience in this country (or faint resemblance of one). Here's the obvious reality that no one seems to want to admit: A baby is JUST AS MUCH AS BABY AND ALIVE inside the womb as outside the womb! The

Bible says that a "baby leaped in her womb" in Luke 1:41, and then "a baby [was] wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger" outside the womb in Luke 2:12. IT'S SAME WORD! God "knitted together" every baby in the "mother's womb," when the baby "was being made in secret" by Him (Psa. 139:13 -16). Is there any blood more "innocent" (that ought to be protected!) than the blood of an unborn BABY (NOT fetus) safely nestled inside a mother's womb (Prov. 6:16-17)?

Life is precious! May we never forget it!

Without a true understanding of Jesus, everything unravels.

Paul tells us of "the wealth that comes from the full assurance of understanding, resulting in a true knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ Himself, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. I say this so that no one will delude you with persuasive argument" (Col. 2:2b-4). Peter wrote, "Seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excel-

lence" (2 Pet. 1:3). In these passages, we clearly see what we risk if we are not truly informed. We risk a spiritual "wealth," "all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge," and "everything pertaining to life and godliness." There couldn't be anything more important for an individual trying to live a righteous life.

Then the question must be asked, "How do I make sure I am fruitful in this knowledge?" Peter

answers that for us. "Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith supply moral excellence, and in your moral excellence, knowledge, and in your knowledge, self-control, and in your self-control, perseverance, and in your perseverance, godliness, and in your godliness, brotherly kindness, and in your brotherly kindness, love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they render you neither useless nor unfruitful in the true knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Pet. 1:5-8). If you want all the blessings that come from true knowledge, we have been instructed how.


