Do We Also Have Eyes Which Do Not See?

When Jesus said, "Lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest" (John 4:35), His disciples really had trouble understanding what was being said. They were in Samaria and the apostles, because of their Jewish background, had never seen that Samaritans had

souls. Jews avoided, as much as they could, any contact with this mixed race in Samaria. Jesus' use of the word "already" shows that He saw Samaria as a field ready Is it possible that the Spirit would be given to as many as the Lord to be reaped for God.

These apostles had to be shocked at the words of Jesus, but in just a few months they saw what Jesus saw. They saw souls, even those in Samaria. Just before His ascension, Jesus gave His plan to evangelize the world using these words: "You shall

be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). It appeared that some heard these words this time and understood them.

The church began in Jerusalem and when persecution arose, the Bible shows that they went to Samaria. When the Samaritans believed and obeyed the gospel, these apostles then knew His plan that involved from Jerusalem to Samaria. The apostles were part of the beginning of the church and before them were the white fields of Samaria. What happened? Luke describes the response using the word "multitudes." The apostles seemed to have understood His great commission. They sent Peter and John to them that they might lay hands on these new Christians so that they might receive the Holy Spirit.

However, their view of white fields was limited. Some of those early Christians went to Antioch in Syria, and some Greeks, likely proselytes, became Christians (Acts 11:19-20). But most in the church still did not see the white fields. It is

> true that Peter said on Pentecost that the promise of called, but he failed to see that it included those who were far off-the Gentiles.

> It was the miracle of the Spirit coming on the household of Cornelius that started opening their eyes. God had shown that He accepted any person in every nation who feared God and did His will (Acts

10:34-35). The great commission of Jesus was to preach to every creature. The church was so slow in seeing this.

What is the application of what we have just said? It is for each of us to lift up our eyes. We have no right to pre-judge others before we teach them! We are now focusing on mission work here at Palm Beach Lakes. Remember that world evangelism begins at your front door and goes around the world. Is it possible that we are not seeing our white fields? As you walk away from the church building, you are in His mission field!



When Christ Returns (Part 1) — It Will Be Glorious

It is for that day

that we eagerly

wait.

The second coming of Christ is a subject that ought to thrill your soul! Have you played out in your mind what that day is going to look like and what is going to happen? There is much about that day which we do not know, but there is also much that we do know. Over these next several articles, let

us consider what the Bible teaches us about this great day.

The second coming of Christ is the part of the Bible for which we wait fulfillment. The Old Testament taught, "Someone is coming," and He did. The gospel accounts taught, "Someone is here," and He was. The rest of the New Testament teaches, "Someone is coming again," and it is for that day that we eagerly wait.

The second coming of Christ is a certainty.

Jesus Himself promised that He would return in the hope-filled passage of John 14:1-3. The angels announced His return from heaven during His ascension into heaven (Acts 1:9-11). The inspired penmen of the New Testament focused on it frequently, with the plain promise, "He will appear a second time" (Heb. 9:28). The second coming of Christ will be the culmination of God's eternal and glorious plan to save mankind.

The second coming of Christ will take place at a time that is not known to man. Sometimes man is dissatisfied if there is information that is withheld from him, and so some have tried to find information that has not been provided. The simple truth of the matter is that Jesus taught "no one knows" the "day and hour" of His return "but My Father only" (Matt. 24:36). During His earthly ministry, Jesus Himself did not know (Mark 13:32); therefore, He taught His disciples, "you do not know what hour your Lord is coming" (Matt. 24:42), for the timing will be one "you do not expect" (24:44), like that of a "thief" (24:43; cf. 1 Thess. 5:2).

> The second coming of Christ will take place in such a manner that "every eye will see Him" (Rev. 1:7), when He is "revealed from heaven" (2 Thess. 1:7). "When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and

all the holy angels with Him" (Matt. 25:31), "the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of

God" (1 Thess. 4:16). What a sight that will be! What a sound that will be! John said that "we shall see Him as He is" (1 John 3:2). Oh, what a thought!

The second coming of Christ will be overwhelmingly spectacular! Are you ready for that day? Do you "eagerly wait for Him" (Heb. 9:28)? That will be the day "when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father" (1 Cor. 15:24). Are you in His kingdom? Are you sure? It will be a glorious day! Will it be a glorious day for you?

Job's Friends, Super or Sorry



You've been in that moment. Someone receives bad news or something tragic has happened. What do you do? What do you say? You are left with these questions and others as you try to comfort your grieving friend or relative. The need is so great, we have a heart that wants to help, but often

we are at a loss of the right course of action. When we look to the Scripture for examples of those who lost much, Job is at the top of the list. Even to those in the secular world the name of Job is a byword of great suffering. The lesser-known friends of Job contributed to wrong was when his comfort and sorrow. Let us glean from their example of both the right and the wrong things to do in the face of grief.

It happened that after Satan had taken everything away from Job and attacked his health that he sat in the ashes scraping his skin with a piece of broken pottery. It is in this moment that Job responds to his wife, "Shall we indeed accept good from God, and shall we not accept adversity?" (Job 2:10). This is when Job's friends arrive on the scene. "Now when Job's three friends heard of all this adversity that had come upon him, each one came from his own place...For they had made an appointment together to come and mourn with him, and to comfort him...they lifted their voices and wept; and each one tore his robe and sprinkled dust on his head toward heaven. So, they sat down with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his grief was very great" (Job 2:11-13). This passage highlights all the things that Job's friend did right. They heard, they came, they coordinated the visit, they showed appropriate emotion, they showed solidarity with Job, they stayed seven days and nights, and they didn't talk. Had they left their efforts to this, we would've had a shorter book

and a better example of friends.

Where they went wrong was when they began to speak. Job breaks the silence with a lament in chapter three. Eliphaz is the first to speak and he says, "Remember now, who ever perished being innocent? Or where were the upright ever cut off? Even as I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same" (Job 4:7-8). He tells Job that

it's his fault he is suffering! They even go on to say his children were wicked and that's why they died. They presume to know God's will. God rebukes them, "My wrath is aroused against you and your two friends, for you have not spoken of Me what is right" (Job 42:7). Job rightfully calls them "sorry comforters" (Job 16:2).

What do we learn? Our presence and mourning with those who are mourning is enough (Rom. 12:15). Don't try to find a why. Point them to the God of all comfort (2 Cor. 1:3-4).

Do you "behold"?

Almost 600 times in the Bible, God uses the word "behold." Most of the time we just run right through the word, but have you ever stopped to behold why God is saying "behold"? The word obviously involves seeing something or looking at something but often is a term of interjection regarding something remarkable.

"Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse...Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice... Behold, I will deliver your enemy into your hand...Behold, the eye of the Lord is on those who fear Him...Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord... Behold, the Lord's hand is not

shortened, that it cannot save...behold, the Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of sinners...behold, now is the day of salvation... Behold, I stand at the door and knock" (Deut. 11:26; 1 Sam. 15:22; 24:4; Psa. 33:18; 127:3; Isa. 59:1; Mark 14:41; 2 Cor. 6:2; Rev. 3:20).

When you're reading the Bible and see a "Behold," HOLD on, BE attentive, and BEHOLD what there is to "Behold"! - DS

These might be individuals who "are" Christians, because they have obeyed the plan of salvation in the New Testament, nevertheless there is nothing exhibited in their lives that would indicate to others that they are actually a Christian.

Such a person may "look like" everyone else at work or school, "act like" everyone else, "talk like" everyone else. If they do anything that is "Christian," it may be unknown to the majority of folks and thus appear to be "asymptomatic."

Here's a question: Could you be diagnosed, by people who know you, as a faithful Christian? Is it evident that Christ is in you and the Lord of your life? Think about it. - DS
