Lining Up God's Truths in Proper Order

Inspiration in-

cludes every

book, chapter,

verse, phrase

and word

When the Bible speaks of inspiration it includes both testaments—both are inspired. It includes all sixty-six books of the Bible. It includes every chapter, every verse, every sentence, every phrase and every word. It all is inspired for *all* the scripture is inspired—God breathed (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

One should never read the Bible without realizing how inspiration reaches to the choice of every word.

Another way of emphasizing this truth is to look at the *order* in which the words of the Bible express heavenly truth. When we fail to do this and get those matters discussed in the wrong order, we create problems in our lives. Look at the following examples of the order in which God places His eternal truth.

When Luke described the life of Jesus, he wrote it down in a particular word order. Luke said, "Jesus began both to do and to teach" (Acts 1:1). He first did it! What a contrast this was with the leaders of that day. They knew the will of God, and they were so strict when they taught it. Jesus never condemned them for this action. What was their problem in trying to make converts to Judaism? "Therefore whatever they tell you to observe, that observe and do, but do not do according to their works; for they say and do not do" (Matt. 23:3).

Another place where the order in which items are placed is found in a verse familiar to so many. Jesus said, "He who believes and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16). Christianity is a taught religion and that is why the previous verse said that the gospel was to be preached to every creature under heaven. First there must be teaching, then believing, then baptism. A failure to understand this has brought about the sprinkling of millions of infants and by that action

making them part of "Christianity." The order is wrong. Those infants were not making a commitment to Jesus—they did not even know it happened.

A third illustration, and one that Christians today must remember, is found in the words of Peter on Pentecost. "Repent, and let everyone of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for them remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). Both repentance and bap-

tism are for the remission of sins. However, we seek to get others to be immersed without first teaching them that immersion without repentance cannot save them. Over the years young women have said to their future mates, "I will not marry you until you are baptized." The change those mates should first make is to repent, to change their lives!

As you read His word, read it slowly enough to see the order in which God has placed His truths. There are great treasures awaiting those who do this.

When Christ Returns (Part 4) — Every Person Will Be Judged

As certain as

death and as

certain as the

resurrection of

What an exciting day awaits us, as we are "looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ" (Tit. 2:13). At the time of His return, all the dead will be raised and the earth will be destroyed. What a sight all of that will be! But what will happen next?

"When the Lord is revealed from heaven" and after

"the earth and the heaven [have] fled away" (Rev. 20:11-12), the Lord "will sit on the throne of His glory" (Matt. 25:31) to judge mankind. God has "appointed" Christ (Acts 17:31) as "the righteous Judge" (2 Tim. 4:8), and all judgment will take place "before the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Cor. 5:10).

Scripture teaches that the day of judgment is certain. The English word "appointed" is used twice of this day and from two different Greek words. Just as "appointed" as it is "to die," so is "the judgment" (Heb. 9:27). The Greek word here means "unavoidable, certain, destined." 1 Paul said that God "has appointed a day on which He will yidge" (Acts 17:30-31). The Greek word here means to "set/fix a time." As certain as death (Heb. 9:27) and as certain as the resurrection of Jesus (Acts 17:31) is the day of judgment.

Scripture teaches that all will be judged. "All nations will be gathered before Him" (Matt. 25:32), and He will judge

the "righteous" and the "unrighteous" (Matt. 25:31-46), "the living and the dead" (2 Tim. 4:1), the "small and great" (Rev. 20:11-12). "We shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ" (Rom. 14:10).

Scripture teaches the standard that will be used in judgment. Man will not be judged by opinions, feelings, personal beliefs, church traditions, a preacher's doctrine, etc. The all-authoritative Word of God will be the standard of judgment

(John 12:48), when "the books" are "opened" on that day (Rev. 20:12). "So then each of us shall give account of himself to God" (Rom. 14:12), according to "the things done in the body" (2 Cor. 5:10).

Scripture teaches that the day of judgment will be a day of separation and sentencing. "He will separate them one from another" (Matt. 25:32-33). One's final destiny is already known upon death,

based upon what he has "done in the body" and how that compares to God's Word (2 Cor. 5:10; John 12:48; cf. Luke 16:19-31). The purpose of the day of judgment will be to reveal "the righteous judgment of God" (Rom. 2:5) and to pronounce final sentences. There are only two possible sentences on that day: to the righteous, eternal life (Matt. 25:23, 34, 46); to the unrighteous, eternal punishment (Matt. 7:23; 25:41, 46).

On that day, "every knee shall bow" (Rom. 14:11) and "eternal" sentences pronounced (Matt. 25:46). Are you ready?

The Fruit That Delights

I have a fond childhood memory of picking fruit with my grandmother. We would drive over to the next valley that was full of orchards. In the spring, descending the hills down into this town you could see miles of flowering trees. In the late summer, the flowers were replaced with green leaves and

fruit. We picked cherries, plums, and peaches. Having seen the trees from a distance with the promise of their sweet delights, we would run out into the orchard with our buckets. Finding the ideal tree loaded with fruit we would climb up into it and start picking. We usually would eat until we were full then start filling the bucket.

The fruit tree and fruit has been used to teach many concepts in the New Testament. Fruit was something everyone understood. Even today most of us are not tied to an agricultural community, but the truths taught with fruit are still understood and communicate heavenly truth. That is why God commands that we have it (Matt. 3:8; Luke 3:7). Godly fruit is in connection with the salvation of others. The gospel bears fruit (Col. 1:3-8). The word is the seed (Matt. 13:3). There is the need to harvest a crop for eternal life for the fields are ready for the harvest (John 4:35-36). Paul's goal was to obtain this fruit (Rom. 1:13). There is the fruit of repentance (Luke 3:8). The fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-25). We

are also instructed about the fruit of righteousness (Phil. 1:9-11). The blessings of having these types of fruit means that the opposite is also true.

Distinctions will be made based on the fruit that people produce. Only those that bear fruit will enter the kingdom (Matt. 7:20-21; 21:43). People will be known by their fruit (Matt. 12:33). Not having fruit will result in being cut down and cast into the fire (Luke 13:1-9). Those that "participate in the

unfruitful deeds of darkness" will not inherit the kingdom (Eph. 5:3-7, 11-12). For that reason, we are told that if we have certain qualities, "you will be neither useless nor unfruitful in the true knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Pet. 1:3-11).

There are things that need to happen in our lives for good fruit to grow. It is associated with dependency on Christ (John 15:4-5). We need to live pure and blameless lives, one that is pleasing to God (Phil. 1:9-11; Col. 1:9-12). In doing so, we are recognized for who we are (Luke 6:43-45). We are true disciples of Christ (John 15:8). We will be in the kingdom (Matt. 21:43). There are eternal rewards for those that endured the work (2 Tim. 2:3-7). Fruit will be credited to our account (Phil 4:14, 17-18). We need to make sure that we are producing the kind of fruit that will bring about that eternal reward. As one expects to find fruit in the orchard, God expects those delights from us also.

If only you would think like me

But, in matters of opinion, ask yourself, "Am I 'walking in love'? Am I trying to 'pursue peace and edify another'? Am I unnecessarily causing 'offense'?" (Rom. 14:15, 19, 20). In matters of opinion, it's ok if others don't think exactly like me! – DS

How is it that so many Bible readers can believe such very different things about the Bible? It is hard to follow the line of reasoning sometimes, as individuals on two different sides of an issue try to use the same Bible to argue different positions. How is that possible?

Often it has to do with to whom or what they're listening. Paul wrote, "Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits" (1 Tim. 4:1). Deceiving teachers cause some to depart from the faith. This was the exact warning in other epistles, when the apostle warned

about being "deceived" by "smooth words" (Rom. 16:18), "empty words" (Eph. 5:6) and "persuasive words" (Col. 2:4).

Be careful! The words of some preachers and teachers are not "sound words" (2 Tim. 1:13), but their "smoothness" and "persuasiveness" may deceive you to think they are "sound words." And, help others to, "Take heed what you listen to" (Mark 4:24). – DS
