Let the Holy Spirit Change You

How the Holy Spirit changes us from our former life into a mirror image of Jesus is misunderstood by so many. The Bible nowhere teaches that the Spirit works directly on our hearts to make me a more spiritual person. The Spirit does change us, and the Bible clearly shows how this happens.

It is true that the Spirit is part of our walk with the Lord. It is true our growth as a child of God involves change and Paul describes it this way: "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed" (Rom. 12:2). The words that follow the word "transformed" show how this is done. It is not done simply by submitting to the Spirit, but it involves "the renewing of your minds." The Spirit is involved in this renewal, but we are not passively waiting for it to happen. So few really understand how the Spirit is involved.

Paul describes the renewal in his second letter to the church at Corinth. "The weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ" (10:4-5). Look carefully at what is said. The way we win the battle against evil involves casting down the "arguments" of Satan we confront using the knowledge of

God and changing our thoughts. We are actively involved in bringing all thoughts to submission through obedience to Jesus. We are not passive as this change happens. We control our thoughts, and we are the ones who use the knowledge of His will. We actively are determined to obey His will.

Paul's letter to Titus speaks of this in these words: "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit" (Tit. 3:5). In Romans, he says we are transformed by the renewal of our minds, and in this book, he says the Holy Spirit is part of that renewal.

However, the clearest description of the Spirit's work in changing us is found in the last verse of 2 Corinthians 3. We come to the Bible as one comes to a mirror with our hearts open and submissive to God. In the Bible we see the image of Jesus. We are "...beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord." We see His glory. This is how the Spirit transforms us in the glory of Jesus to become like Him.

Do you want the Holy Spirit to transform you? It will never happen unless you actively study Jesus' words and make His words your words. There is no transformation by the Spirit without diligent study of the Bible!

Where's the Instrument?

One of the first questions that often runs through the mind of a first-time visitor to the church of Christ is, "Where's the instrument?" Asking such a question is understandable, as it is very common to find mechanical instruments in many church assemblies today. Is there a simple explanation for this? There certainly is. The mechanical instrument of music is in the same place as other things that have not been authorized by God. Consider these examples.

The instrument is in the same place as Noah being permitted to use cedar wood in building the ark. God specified gopherwood as the wood for constructing the ark (Gen. 6:14). By specifying gopherwood, God automatically excluded all other woods, without needing to say another word about it.

The instrument is in the same place as a Jew being permitted to observe the Sabbath on Tuesday rather than Saturday. God specified the seventh day as the Jewish day of rest called the Sabbath (Ex. 16:26; 20:10). By specifying the seventh day, God automatically excluded all other days, without needing to say another word about it.

The instrument is in the same place as someone from the tribe of Judah being permitted to serve as a priest under the Levitical system. God specified the Levites as the tribe

from which priests would come (Num. 8:14-19). By specifying Levi, God automatically excluded all other tribes from the priesthood, without needing to say another word about it.

The instrument is in the same place as Oreos and milk being permitted to be used in the Lord's Supper. God specified unleavened bread and fruit of the vine in the remembrance of the Lord's body and blood (Matt. 26:17, 26-29). By specifying unleavened bread and fruit of the vine, God automatically excluded all other foods from the communion, without needing to say another word about it.

God automatically excluded all other music from worship

Apply this same Biblical principle to music in New Testament worship. In reading the New Testament, the only music that God ever specifies (and, therefore, authorizes) for worshiping Him today is singing (Acts 16:25; Rom. 15:9; 1 Cor. 14:15; Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16; Heb. 2:12; 13:15). The music that is specifically authorized is "singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19). Man has no authority to add to or take away from what God authorizes (Rev. 22:18-19). Therefore, by specifying singing in New Testament worship, God automatically excluded all other music from worship, without needing to say another word about it.

After authorizing singing, God specified that "all" we "do" must be done "in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Col. 3:16-17). Singing is authorized. Mechanical instruments are not.

Sin in 4D (Part 2)

There have been people “memeing” and murmuring about WWII. In connection with the recent pandemic that has gone endemic and other uncertainties, people are wondering what’s about to happen. They are looking at things as signs to a future calamity or doom, twisting the book of Revelation as though it would have further revelations for today. We get wound up as a people sometimes and miss the biggest battle and issues that we face today. The most destructive power in the world is sin. You’ve seen its work. We have seen it destroy households, kill generations, topple kingdoms, and crush hope.

We need to be careful because sin will destroy your good name. Wisdom says, “A good name is to be more desired than great wealth, favor is better than silver and gold” (Prov. 22:1). What do you think of when you think of names like Cain, Jezebel and Judas? You might be able to think of other names in history or your life that you have seen be ruined by sin.

Sin can also destroy your body. Paul specifically warns against immoral sexual acts. “Flee immorality. Every other sin that a man commits is outside the body, but the immoral man sins against his own body” (1 Cor. 6:18). It is obvious that there are sins that are destructive to the body. Many of the trials and

struggles that people face are because of sin. Addictions are at the top of the list in this category.

Sin has a destructive effect on us emotionally. There are those inner conflicts of guilt. “But I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death?” (Rom. 7:23-24). For this reason the Psalmist wrote, “How blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered!” (Psa. 32:1-3). How many people do you know that are suffering emotionally from the sins of others? In our sin-saturated society, the field of psychiatry is flourishing as never before.

Sin will destroy the local congregation of the Lord’s church. It was destructive to the church in Corinth as we read about the things that they were struggling with (1 Cor. 6:11). Jesus told the church in Laodicea, “I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot; I wish that you were cold or hot. So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth” (Rev. 3:15-16). Pride (3 John 9-10), worldliness (1 Cor. 5), lukewarmness (Rev. 3:14-22) and division (1 Cor. 1:10) are sins which will destroy a local church. We need to be alert and on guard against sin and its destructive nature. Even just a little is enough to hurt.

How to have a spectacular marriage

As Paul transitioned into the great marriage passage in Ephesians chapter five (in which he addresses specific matters to the “wives” and specific matters to the “husbands”), he first emphasizes Christians are to be “submitting to one another in the fear of God” (Eph. 5:21). For the instructions to husbands and wives to work, you must be willing to put your spouse above yourself (cf. Phil. 2:3-4). Now, THAT will make your marriage spectacular! – DS

If you goofed off in the game, you were immediately benched and ran suicides alone in practice the next day. But the team loved and respected him, and every player wanted to please him.

Some people look at God as a no-nonsense God. They see a God who has laid out His rules and expectations, and they imagine that God finds pleasure in punishing those who violate His will. However, such is FAR from the case (2 Pet. 3:9; Matt. 23:37). You see, it’s similar to the situation with our coach. Once we spent time with him and got to know him, that’s when a bond was formed and we wanted to rise to his expectations and excel at them FOR HIM. Isn’t that the same (shouldn’t that be the same) with God? Do you long to just make HIM happy? – DS
