An Unheralded Woman of Great Faith

There is room in

His kingdom for

and all treated

If we are not

faithful,

He is still

faithful!

The popularity of Jesus early in His time on the earth was so immense. The multitudes followed Him and everywhere He went more were added to the number. Some came out of curiosity, others to be fed by Him with loaves and fishes, but some out of genuine concern for their personal need.

As He was walking to the house of Jairus, whose twelve-year-old daughter was dying, the Bible described those who were around Him. Peter told Jesus, "Master the multitude throng and press You" (Luke 8:45). In that throng was one special woman whose faith that Jesus was truly Emmanuel surpassed the faith of almost all of those there.

She was a woman in a society where womwith contempt en were often viewed as property and were treated with contempt. It is so remarkable how often Jesus in His work interacted with women. His regard for all of them stands in marked contrast to the culture in which He lived.

She was a poor woman. She was sick and had spent all of her money trying to find a cure for illness. That society had little respect for the poor. In fact, even the apostles thought the rich would be at the front of all those who entered the kingdom. When Jesus spoke of how hard it was for them to enter the kingdom (remember what He said about the eye of the needle) the apostles said, "Who then can be saved?" (Mark 10:26).

She was an unclean woman. The law of Moses paid special attention to the ceremonial uncleanness brought about by the flow of blood this woman had had for twelve years. It is likely that those around her, if they knew of her condition, would have avoided her in every way.

She was a humble woman. She pressed through that mob around Him and approached Him from the rear, hoping to touch the hem of His garment to find healing without being noticed. Her faith the sick, the poor was realized and immediately she was cured. There were many garments worn in that crowd, but there was something different about His garment!

> She was a woman who told others about what Jesus had done for her. After Jesus had asked, "Who touched Me," she came forward and "...declared to Him in the presence of all the people the reason she had touched Him and how she was healed immediately" (Luke 8:47).

> She was a woman of great faith. Jesus said, "Your faith has made you well, go in peace" (Luke 8:48). There is a place in His kingdom for the sick, the poor and those treated with disdain by others. There is room for each of us.

"This Is a Faithful Saying"

Five times in his letters, Paul used the expression, "This is a faithful saying," and all of them are found in his letters to Timothy and Titus. Of course, all Scripture is comprised of the "faithful sayings" of God, but let us see what we can learn from these five truths that Paul identifies as "faithful."

The first "faithful saying" focuses on the PURPOSE OF THE COMING OF CHRIST. "This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief" (1 Tim. 1:15). Didn't Timothy already know that? Of course, he did! But we all need to be reminded regularly that Christ came into this world, not for Himself, but to save sinners like me!

The second "faithful saying" focuses on the PARAMOUNT WORK OF ELDERS. "This is a faithful saying: If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work" (1 Tim. 3:1). Being an elder is not a high position of honor and nobility. It is not a promotion for successful deacons. It is a position of service, as those who aspire to this "good work" set the work and needs of the church above themselves, indicative of their deep sense of dedication to the Lord.

The third "faithful saying" focuses on the PROFITA-BLENESS OF SELF-DISCIPLINE. While it is true that "bodily exercise profits a little," Christians must "exercise/discipline" themselves "toward godliness. For...godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come. This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance" (1 Tim. 4:7-9). We have many goals in life, but to which one are we constantly and rigorously training in order to reach? May we discipline ourselves toward godliness!

> The fourth "faithful saying" focuses on the PROMISES OF GOD. "This is a faithful saying: For if we died with Him, We shall also live with Him. If we endure, We shall also reign with Him. If we deny Him, He also will deny us. If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself" (2 Tim. 2:11-13). If we are faithful to Him, we shall "live with Him" here and "reign with Him" in eternity. But, if we are not faithful, He is still faithful and will bring upon us His just

consequences. His promises are greater than we deserve!

The fifth "faithful saying" focuses on the PRACTICE OF DAILY CHRISTIAN LIVING. "This is a faithful saying, and these things I want you to affirm constantly, that those who have believed in God should be careful to maintain good works" (Tit. 3:8). We are busy people. God tells us to be busy and to take the lead in engaging in "good works," which He has detailed for us in Scripture and which should characterize His children.

God's faithful sayings should propel us to faithfulness.



Us Versus Them

We've all done this. We make broad brush stroke comments about others. Groups of people are categorized by age, gender, ethnicity, religious beliefs, geographical location, political affiliation, and this list could go on ad nauseam. We can make an By Josh Blackmer "other" or "they" group out of anything that

would distinguish ourselves from another human being. We might more commonly refer to this as pigeonholing, but because of the usual negative connotations with this activity, it is also referred to as demonizing or vilifying. "Those people always do _____!" "They don't have a clue!" "We are better than them!" These and other similar comments or thought processes are poison to any group and are not beneficial to anyone.

There are several inherent dangers in this practice. First, we overgeneralize the other group as though they are one homogenous clan not allowing for individual thought or variants in that group. Second, most often these comments are not studied observations but personal assumptions not based on fact. We often find ourselves being absolutely incorrect. Lastly, if left unchecked, false narratives, lies, rumors, dissention and divisiveness are sown. These assumptions get repeated and spread throughout social groups, towns, cities, states and the country. No group is safe from this practice.

Fortunately, there are things we can do to combat the negative influence of vilification. First, we need to recognize that we've been wrong or have done wrong to someone in the past. In the context of being subject and obedient to ruling authorities, Paul told Titus to remind the Christians to "malign [lit. vilify] no one (this included governing authorities), to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for all men. For we also once were..." (Tit. 3:2-3a). This should help to put perspective in our thinking.

> her statement, and He teaches her another truth. "True worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth" (John 4:23). What she went on to share was not someone's assumptions of who she was or what she needed to do but the truth of the matter.

> Lastly, the responsibility to love our neighbor should keep us from vilifying them (Matt. 23:29; Rom. 13:8-10; 15:1-3). If we can move away from this divisive speech and thinking, we can be a part of the healing so many need, not continued hate.

"Close enough" in doctrine is ok, right?

Aguila and Priscilla take him aside, and they "explained to him the way of God more accurately" (18:26). Being "right" about "most things" didn't make him "right" in the eyes of God. He needed to be corrected.

Be careful who you listen to. Make sure they speak the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Otherwise, your soul's salvation is in jeopardy (1 Tim. 4:1-3; 2 Tim. 4:3-4). - DS

No "watch and wait" in the Golden Rule
