Bible Questions & Answers

It Had to Be His Garment

Last week we focused on the faith of the woman who pushed her way through the crowd which surrounded the Savior as He traveled to heal Jairus' twelve-year-old daughter. She had spent all she had and the only hope she had could only be found in Jesus. The instant she touched His garment

her health was restored. This week we focus on the garment.

There was nothing special about the garment He wore. It was like all other garments, but this one belonged to Jesus and that changed everything. might be as good It is not true that one garment is as good as another!

Look at parallel applications of the truth that any ordinary thing associated with Jesus is elevated above all other items.

Have you ever considered how many books are printed each year? It is estimated that 2.2 million new titles are published worldwide each year. That's not how many books are published but how many titles. If you stacked the new books being published next to each other, at the present rate of production you would have to move at ninety miles an hour just to keep up the end line. The words of Solomon are so true. "Of making many books there is no end" (Ecc. 12:12).

It depends of what standard of judgment you use, but all books have a value. It may be said that "One book is as good as another" until you included the Bible. It alone is written by the Creator of the world. One garment may be as good as another, but when you add the garment of Jesus to this number, such simply is not true. In the same way, one book may be as good as another, but when you add the Bible to this number, such simply is not true.

There are over 45,000 distinct Christian denominations in the world. It is likely true that one of them is just about as good as another, until you add the church Any one thing Jesus built to this number, then it all changes.

Jesus promised to build His church (Matt. 16:18). He never gave any mortal the right to change it (Gal. 1:8-9; Rev. 22:18-19). It was designed to be eternally unchangeable (Eph. 3:21). It began on Penadd God's things tecost, and in the two millenniums since that, mortals have created 45,000 churches. Every one of

these churches begun by man may be as good as any other church until you add His church to this group.

The woman knew it had to be His garment. How our world would be changed if we believed it has to be His book! How our world would be changed if we believed it has to be His church!

Take this concept and apply it to every aspect of our Christians lives: His garment; His book; His church; His way; His truth. Oh, how it would change our world. Let it change yours!

The Work of Preachers, According to Paul

as any other

thing, until you

the church, love

the people, love

the truth and

love elders.

On his Third Missionary Journey, Paul paused to meet with some special friends—the elders of the church in Ephesus. They all sat down and discussed the work of the church and prayed together. From Paul's words on that occasion, we learn much about the work of a faithful preacher. Con-

sider these qualities and responsibilities of God's evangelists:

- 1. He is to live a consistent life, in accordance with the way of the Lord—"in what manner I always lived among you" (Acts 20:18).
- 2. He is to serve "the Lord with all humility," regardless of trials and circumstances (20:19).
- 3. He must not hold back anything that is "helpful" for others to hear and know (20:20).
- 4. He needs to teach "publicly and from house to house" (20:20).
- 5. He is to be consistent in message to every person, regardless of who they are or what their background is (20:21).
- 6. He must look beyond things that happen to him (or could happen to him) and evaluate what is truly "dear" and of "value" to him (20:22-24).
- 7. He must prioritize "the course" and "the ministry" that he has as a minister of Christ to proclaim the gospel (20:24).

- 8. In preaching "the gospel," he must give emphasis to "the kingdom of God" (20:24-25).
- 9. He is responsible for "declaring...the whole counsel of God," without leaving anything out (20:27).
- 10. He must love the church, love the people, love the truth and love elders (20:28-31).
- 11. He should work closely with elders to encourage them, assist them and warn them of dangers inside and He must love outside the church (20:28-31).
 - 12. He must have a deep care for the purity of the gospel and the protection of His church (20:28-31).
 - 13. He must always point people to God and His Word (rather than himself), for therein alone is spiritual strength and eternal life (20:32).
 - 14. He must be a hard-worker and a self-starter, with a strong work ethic and control over worldly passions (20:33-35).
 - 15. He needs to be especially mindful of those who are struggling spiritually and may be overlooked (20:35).
 - 16. He is to remind all of "the words of the Lord" (20:35).

Now, you may say, "I'm not a preacher. This has nothing to do with me." May I encourage you to go back and read the list. Most of these things apply to everyone of us!

Servants of God

Being a servant has never been a popular concept. It was Christ that turned that idea on its head. He washed the feet of twelve men that were already fighting amongst themselves about who was the greatest and who would rule on the left and right of Jesus in His kingdom (John 13:5;

Mark 10:37, 42). Being a servant was something that He had been instructing them during His ministry on earth.

"Calling them to Himself, Jesus said to them, 'You know that those who are recognized as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them; and their great men exercise authority over them. But it is not this way among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant; and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to

give His life a ransom for many'" (Mark 10:42-45). Jesus clearly achieved this. He "emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Phil. 2:7-8). Since the servant is not greater than the Master, where does that leave us (John 13:16)?

The apostle Paul leaves us a great example of what it means to be a servant in this present age. Being in a position

where he could have demanded authority, he was often found using names to humble his status, "Paul, a bondservant of Christ Jesus" (Rom. 1:1; Phil. 1:1; Tit. 1:1). It's that servant heart that is on display in his second letter to the Corinthians. He begins by stating what a servant doesn't do, "giving no cause for offense in anything" (2 Cor. 6:3). The reason is so that the message wouldn't be discredited. The spreading of the gospel is more important than our comfort and our per-

ceived rights. He then begins to speak about how a servant of God can be exhibited to those around them. It was in everything that he did (6:4). Those negative things that happened in his service were proof positive that he was a true servant of God and not men (Gal. 1:10). This is what he lists: "in much endurance, in afflictions, in hardships, in distresses, in beatings, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in hunger" (6:4b-5). There are

other things that must be as well: "in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, in the word of truth, in the power of God; by the weapons of right-eousness for the right hand and the left" (6:6-7).

If we are going to be servants of God in Christ, then we must be taking a hard look at our service. What are we doing to spread the gospel and what is it costing us? Are we willing to lay down everything in service to Him?

It's ok to not have all the answers, as long as we know...


Sometimes things happen and we want to know, "Why?" We look and search and dig and wonder and fret and worry about the "Why?" We get so desperate sometimes that we start to make up reasons and explanations in our minds to satisfy our search for "Why?" Oftentimes (and almost always) those reasons and explanations are not well-founded and cause us to settle our thoughts on some conclusions that have no (or very little) basis.

We would do well to remind and convince ourselves that it is ok to not have all the answers (i.e., all the reasons) when bad things happen.

Unfortunately, the truth is that "time and chance happen to... all" (Ecc. 9:11). It does NOT mean that God is not there (Heb. 13:5). It does NOT mean that God does not care (1 Pet. 5:7). Rather than dwell on what we do not know, let us dwell on what we do know: God is (Heb. 11:6). God knows (Matt. 6:8). God loves (Rom. 8:31-39). God cares (Phil. 4:6-7). God can (Eph. 3:20-21). God will (Rom. 8:28). Let us trust Him (Prov. 3:5-6)! – DS
