Miracles, Wonders and Signs

On Pentecost, Peter talked about "miracles, wonders and signs" which Jesus did as evidence that He was truly the Son of God (Acts 2:22). These words can be used to refer to the same event, but each of them emphasizes a unique aspect to those events. Take a moment to consider them.

They are described as miracles for they are not natu-

ral events which can occur and can be explained by mortals. They are far above this level and demand a super-natural explanation. When Jesus cured the cripple man the response was so graphic. "So that all were amazed and glorified God, saying, 'We never saw anything like this'" (Mark 2:12). There was no natural explanation that any mortal could give. It was SUPER-natural!

These miracles are described as wonders. This word emphasizes the impact they had on those who saw them. It was truly a sense of "wonderment." When Jesus stilled the tempest, the apostles "...were greatly amazed in themselves beyond measure, and marveled" (Mark 6:51). It was God's way of calling attention to His Messenger in an awesome way.

They are called signs because they bring another message when they happen. As seen above, they gave confirmation to the One who did them. They bear witness, and they testify. They are a message from heaven authenticating the one who performed them. This is why the apostles were empowered for each miracle, as sign of authority from heaven.

What is remarkable is that those in the first century understood some signs but failed to see the most important one. When they asked Jesus to give them a sign, He pointed out a grave situation in their lives which had an eternal consequence. The color of the clouds helped them decide about the

> coming weather. We express it this way in America, "Red sails at night, sailors' delight. Red sails at morning, sailors taken warning."

> Jesus rebuked them saying, "Hypocrites! You know how to discern the face of the sky, but you cannot discern the signs of the times" (Matt. 16:3). Think of the hundreds, perhaps thousands, they had seen Jesus heal, but they ignored these signs of the

time when the Messiah was in their midst.

This is why He refused to give the "performance" they asked for. They had seen the myriad of signs already given. He then called their attention to the ultimate sign—His resurrection after being in the grave for three days and nights. How did they respond to this event? They ignored it like they did all the other miracles, wonders and signs. Imagine being them on the Day of Judgment. However, do our lives show that we too can by faith see these signs and ignore them?



The Design of Your Face

Did God make you? Did He really? Some people don't believe it. They cannot bring themselves to accept that the God of heaven created everything in this universe, including every living creature. However, if we spend some time examining the evidence around us, we will see that there is literally

tons of testimonial proof to establish His creative genius and power, and one doesn't have to go any further than just looking at his face in a mirror. Consider just a few simple elements of design.

God put eyebrows over your eyes (not under or beside) to slow the sweat from getting into your eyes. God put eyelashes on your eyelids to prevent little particles from getting in your eyes. God put eyelids over your eyes to protect your eyes and

to keep them cleansed and moistened. God put two eyes in your head to give you range of vision and depth perception. And that's not even considering the minute design elements of your eyes themselves.

God put your nose in the very center of your face so that you would naturally point your nose and face toward fresh air to breathe. God put a bridge over your nose to keep gravity from taking water into your nose inadvertently. God put little hairs in your nose to keep little particles or insects out. And that's not even considering the minute design elements of your respiratory system.

God put your mouth below your nose, so that you could smell your food. God put your mouth below your eyes (instead of above your eyes or on the sides of your head), so that you could see to put food in your mouth and still be able to eat and see things around you. God put your tongue and teeth inside your mouth, instead of outside your mouth. God

> put your tongue inside your teeth, and put your teeth in top and bottom rows for biting and chewing. And that's not even considering the minute design elements of your digestive system.

> God put your ears on the sides of your head in order to give you directionality and range of hearing. God put two ears on your head to give you stereo hearing. God put your ears in a peculiar shape to

naturally capture and funnel sound into your ear canal. And that's not even considering the minute design elements of your ears themselves.

Just look in the mirror. Your face itself has hundreds of elements of design that prove it must have been designed. It was not an accident. Everything is perfectly sized, numbered and positioned to perform its God-given function and to work together to give you the sensory perception to live and thrive. There is no doubt—God did that!

Science has never been the real enemy of God. God was the one to put the laws of nature in order and set the principles in motion. Being the Creator of all things, He created science. However, the enemy of God is one that denies His existence and therefore denies the evidence (Rom. 1:25). Re-

The creation of the ions "out of nothing" was proof that something can

something. Others in the science realm argue that there was

come from nothing, but it wasn't nothing. There were electrons, and there were photons. Not to mention the equipment that made it happen. At the end of the day absolute nothing begets nothing. People are still grasping at thin nothing trying to explain away the existence of God.

God is the only thing we know to be eternal (Rom. 1:18-20). He claims to have created the world

and gave us a beginning (Gen. 1:1). It is His creation that speaks of His great and awesome power (Psa. 19:1-6). We don't want to find ourselves in the position of questioning God as Job did. "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Now gird up your loins like a man, And I will ask you, and you instruct Me" (Job 38:2-3)! The evidence for the existence of God is rock solid, and we must not waver in our convictions. We must teach them to our children and our children's children (Deut. 4:9-10). Stand firm in the knowledge of our God and His creation. Stand firm in His great love.

How could they reject Him?

Jesus made this very simple statement, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved" (Mark 16:16). It boggles the mind today that people would then claim that being "baptized" is not necessary to "be saved."

How does that follow? It doesn't!

Just as in Jesus' day, people see what they want to see, hear what they want to hear, and believe what they want to believe. May we open our eyes, ears and hearts to His truth always, without getting ourselves in the way! -DS

Do we trust that He really knows?

After the resurrection of Jesus, the disciples of Jesus took time to go fishing. However, John 21 tells us that they fished all night and "caught nothing" (21:4). These guys were professional fishermen (at least we know that Peter, James and John were). Maybe they were showing the other disciples their expertise in "how to fish." But, that morning, they had noth-

ing.

Jesus appeared to them on the shore and told them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat," and the catch was so large that they were "not able to draw it" into the boat (21:6). Can you imagine being one of the disciples? "How

did He know? Wait, we fished every side last night!"

Too often today people want to question the word of Jesus and think they "know better." They might say, "I know that's what the Bible says, but I feel in my heart..." It doesn't matter who you are, what you know and where you have expertise! Jesus is the all-knowing Lord (1 John 3:20). 


