## The Word Was Preached With Accompanying Signs



Who has not heard of the story of Jonah and his three days and nights in the belly of the big fish? It is one of the most amazing events in the scriptures and even many non-believers know about it. We sometimes focus on Jonah's preaching as the only reason the men of Nineveh repented in sack-

cloth and ashes. What else caused this pagan city to repent?

It was more than just the message he delivered. He walked the streets of that massive city giving them the message God had given to him. "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown" (Jonah 3:4). The message was from God, but was there any way that any person could know that God was the revelation of real source of the message?

The answer to this question is found in Luke 11:30). "For as Jonah became a sign to the Ninevites, so also the Son of Man will be a sign to this generation." Jesus said that Jonah was more than just a preacher to the Ninevites-he was a sign. We noted in last week's article that a sign is far more than an event which happens. It is a sign from God, and it has no earthly explanation.

How Jonah was a sign is not specified. Those sailors who tossed Jonah overboard and seeing the storm stop immediately saw truth and worshiped God. When that storm first came, they threw their cargo into the sea and reversed their course to return home (Jonah 1:13). There was no need to continue the journey. Is it possible they arrived, and their words prepared the way for Jonah? Is it possible that Jonah's appearance showed he had been in that fish? Or was it some other way? Jonah was not just a preacher; he was a sign!

The miracles performed by the early Christians were a sign they were more than just "preachers." Jesus said that

> those who believed and were baptized would perform miracles (Mark 16:16-18). After Jesus ascended, "...they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the words through the accompanying signs" (Mark 16:20).

Why were there miracles in the exodus from Egypt? God was confirming His words with accompanying signs. Why did Jesus perform miracles? God was confirming His words with accompanying signs.

The Bible said that those signs would cease (1 Cor. 13:8-10). While we might think that more would believe today if they saw signs, think of the words spoken to the rich man in Hades. He wanted a miracle to be shown to his brothers. Was he right? "If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, they will not be persuaded though one rise from the dead" (Luke 16:31). A failure to understand how God used signs can lead one to believe "lying wonders" today (2 Thess. 2:9).



### **Please Respect the Elderly**

Oh, how I wish this article could get into the hands of everyone under the age of . What age would you put in the blank representing those who need to read about respecting the elderly? Let's go with this arbitrary number—Oh, how I wish this article could get into the hands of everyone under

the age of 65. Friends, we are in desperate need of greater respect in our land. There is a massive dearth of proper respect for all people, but especially for those who are older. Let's consider this matter.

How many of us have been guilty of showing disrespect toward those who are "elderly"? (You decide what "elderly" is.) Perhaps they are moving too slow—at the store, in the checkout line, on the road. Perhaps they can't see or hear you very well. "Hah? Whatd'ya say?" Perhaps they are forgetting

things that they should remember or used to know. Perhaps they are saying the same thing over and over. Perhaps they are saying things that you wish they wouldn't, which maybe is annoying you or embarrassing you. Perhaps they're not respecting your space or your time or your efforts. How do we respond? Are we respectful? Are we disrespectful?

There is an interesting and short (only two verses) episode in the life of the prophet Elisha, which occurred right after Elijah ascended into heaven and Elisha took his place (2 Kgs. 2:23-24). As Elisha "was going up the road" to Bethel, "some youths came from the city and mocked him, and said to him, 'Go up, you baldhead! Go up, you baldhead!'" Can you imagine children mocking an older man like that? Oh? You can? The next verse is even more memorable: "So he turned around and looked at them, and pronounced a curse on them in the name of the Lord. And two female bears came out of the woods and mauled forty-two of the youths." If we learn

> nothing else from this episode, it is the danger of not showing respect for those who are older (or bald).

> Both the Old Testament and the New Testament gave instructions (i.e., commandments) to God's people on this matter. "You shall rise before the gray headed and honor the presence of an old man, and fear your God" (Lev. 19:32). "Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders... and be clothed with humility" (1 Pet. 5:5). Of course,

this applies to relationships both inside and outside the church. For those relationships inside the church, Paul instructed, "Do not rebuke an older man, but exhort him as a father...older women as mothers" (1 Tim. 5:1-2).

Unfortunately, many elderly folks could be reciting Dangerfield's old catchphrase, "I don't get no respect!" As children of God, let us "esteem others better than ourselves" (Phil. 2:3-4), and let us especially include in that responsibility our treatment of those who are older.

Let's consider some biblical examples of those displeased with God. Maybe we can come to learn that God's will for man is right no you will keep My matter how we feel about it. commandments.

Moses was displeased because of the responsibilities placed on him (Num. 11:10-11). David

was displeased because of God's absoluteness in killing Uzzah (2 Sam. 6:1-8). Naaman was displeased because he valued his own opinion, "Behold I thought" (2 Kgs. 5:1-14). The rich young ruler was displeased because he wanted to hold onto the world and its goods (Matt. 19:16-22). Those that crucified Jesus were displeased because of His portrayal of holiness (Matt. 27:22-23).

Many are displeased with God's mandates about: the home (Eph.5:22-33); marriage (Matt. 19:1-12; 2 Cor. 6:14); children (Eph. 6:4); worship (John 4:23); and personal responsibility (Phil. 2:12). There are many other things that are not written in this article, but these are written that you may see the general displeasure mankind has with God. Hopefully we do not find ourselves named among that number.

God knew that some would be displeased with the divine order and would wish to change it. So, He commanded men not to change it (Deut. 4:2; Gal. 1:8,9; Rev. 22:18,19).

When Jesus taught about prayer, He included praying that God's will be done, not our own (Matt. 6:10). In what should be properly considered the Lord's prayer in John, Jesus prayed that men might come to know God. "This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (John 17:3). Paul wrote concerning the will of God as "that which is good and acceptable and

perfect" (Rom. 12:2).

If you love Me,

Do you love God? Are you pleased with Him? "Know therefore that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God, who keeps His covenant and His lovingkindness to a thousandth generation with those who love Him and keep His commandments but repays those who hate Him to their faces, to destroy them; He will not delay with him who hates Him, He will repay him" (Deut. 7:9-10). Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments" (John 14:15).

#### Got your belt?

When you consider "the whole armor of God" with which the Christian is to arm himself, the first piece identified by Paul in Ephesians 6:14 is "the belt of truth" (ESV). The NKJV says, "Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth." The NASB says, "...having belted your waist with truth." The soldier's belt truly held everything together. Without it, he could not engage.

As Christians, we are to "fasten," "gird" or "belt" our waist with "truth." Without God's truth, we are not equipped for spiritual conflict. God's truth purifies (1 Pet. 1:22), sanctifies (John 17:17), makes us free (John 8:32) and keeps us anchored in the doctrine of Christ (Eph. 4:14-15), keeping our minds on target (1 Pet. 1:13) and keeping us from being entangled with the affairs of this world (2 Tim. 2:3-4).

How do we gird ourselves with truth? Study it (2 Tim. 2:15). Love it (2 Thess. 2:10). Know it (John 8:32). Walk in it (3 John 3-4). Obey it (1 Pet. 1:22). Do not stray from it (Jas. 5:19). So, do you have your belt of truth on? Is it bound tight? – DS



After belting your waist with God's truth (note that His truth holds everything together), God calls upon us to ensure that we have armed ourselves with "the breastplate of righteousness" (Eph. 6:14). A breastplate was designed to protect the center mass, particularly a soldier's heart. If the enemy could penetrate there, all hope was lost.

> In order for our breastplate to do its job of protection today, we must "hunger and thirst for righteousness" (Matt. 5:6). Do you? It cannot be just a passing taste. We must "seek first...His righteousness" (Matt. 6:33). Do you? It cannot be a close second. We must not just coast

along, but we must "pursue righteousness" (1 Tim. 6:11). Are you pursuing it? To be accepted by God, we must faithfully and diligently "work righteousness" (Acts 10:35). Are you?

So many things are after our hearts today! What can protect them? The righteousness of God! May God help us to "hold fast" to it (Job 27:6)! - DS


