## Rejecting the Counsel of God

The first psalm describes the character of those who are blessed by God. "He does not walk in the counsel of the ungodly." The implication of these words is that if one does walk in the counsel of the ungodly, he is cursed. The psalmist has in mind walking in the counsel of ungodly men and the blessedness of those who walk in the counsel of the godly men. Think of how this is magnified when we think of the importance of walking in the counsel of the godly One. The New Testament speaks often about this.

The counsel of God is revealed in the Bible. Paul described the breath of this counsel when he said, "I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). Messengers of God must speak the truth (1 Pet. 4:11); they must speak the truth in love (Eph. 4:15); and they must speak the entirety of God's will. Even if men reject what is taught, the messenger is still innocent. Paul said, "I am innocent from the blood of all men, for I have not shunned. . ." (Acts 20:26).

The counsel of God cannot be changed by any person on earth. David said, "Forever, O Lord, Your word is settled in heaven" (Psa. 119:89). The English Standard Version emphasizes the word settled. "Forever, O Lord, Your word is firmly fixed in the heavens." God has revealed His counsel in His words and

decrees the blessing of those who follow it. It is remarkable that men so often choose to reject His counsel.

The New Testament affirms this truth even more emphatically. It speaks of the unchangeable character, the immutability, of His counsel (Heb. 6:17). Those who seek to change His counsel are condemned by God. Paul reveals how the curse of God awaits every man, every angel and even Paul himself if they perverted the gospel he had preached (Gal. 1:8-9).

This counsel of God is spoken of by the Holy Spirit in His discussion of the greatness of John the Baptist and the message he brought. He said that all the people who heard John, even the tax collectors, . . . justified God, having been baptized with the baptism of John." What about those who were not baptized by John? "But the Pharisees and lawyers rejected the will (the Greek word is counsel) of God for themselves, not having been baptized by him" (Luke 7:29-30).

Let me urge you to devote time in your life to read about His will, His counsel in your life. When every Bible is burned up with the fires of heaven consuming the earth, there will be one copy that remains to be used by the Judge of all mankind to measure our lives (Rev. 20:12). That counsel is firmly fixed in heaven, it is immutable. To reject its teaching on any topic, even the baptism revealed by Jesus, is to reject the counsel of God. Think about this!

**When every copy of the Bible is burned up, one copy will still exist to judge us!**

## The Bible Is Hard to Understand? (Part 2)

While some have suggested over the years that the Bible is hard to understand, perhaps we should see what the Bible has to say about that. Luke wrote about the life of Christ to a man named Theophilus so that he "may **know** the certainty of those things in which [he was] instructed" (1:4).

Jesus Himself said, "You shall **know** the truth" (John 8:32). In the Old Testament, Moses wrote of gathering "all Israel" together "every seven years." At that time, the leaders were to "read this law before...men and women and little ones...that they may **hear...learn...observe...and that their children...may hear and learn**" (Deut. 31:9-13). The Bible states that it can be and it was understood. We saw in the last article that God is the one who gave us both the Bible and our minds, and He said that our minds could understand the Book that He gave us (Eph. 3:3-4; 5:17).

So, if the Bible is capable of being understood, what can a person do to understand the Bible? Let's make a list.

1. Truly believe in God (Heb. 11:6).
2. Truly believe that the Bible is God's Word (2 Pet. 1:20-21).
3. Trust the Word of God (1 Thess. 2:13; Psa. 119:42).
4. Show reverence for the Word of God (Psa. 119:10-11, 97).
5. Have a love for the truth (2 Thess. 2:10; Prov. 23:23).

6. Have a desire to know the truth (John 7:17; Matt. 5:6).
7. Have a willingness to study (Acts 17:11).
8. Put true diligence into your study (2 Tim. 2:15).
9. Expect to understand it (Eph. 3:3-4; 5:17; 2 Tim. 3:14-15).
10. Pray about it (1 John 5:14; Matt. 7:7-8; Jas. 1:5; 4:2).

Now that you've made these pre-reading preparations:

1. Read it.
  2. Keeping reading it. Don't stop.
  3. Compare various reliable translations (KJV, NKJV, ASV, NASB, ESV).
  4. Skip over any parts that you don't understand. Come back to those later.
  5. Read it over and over. My grandfather told me that he read through the Bible 50 times and saw things the 50th time through that he had not seen before.
6. Use the easy-to-understand parts to help shed light on the not-as-easy parts. Let the Bible be its own commentary.
7. Mark in your Bible, especially noting in the margin other verses in the Bible that help to explain that verse.

Is there more you can do? Certainly. But the best way to understand the Bible is to read it. Don't take someone else's word for what it says. Read it. Understand it yourself. Then, apply what it says to your life.

## Hold On to the Good

At the end of his first letter to the church in Thessalonica Paul gives them this charge. “Examine everything carefully; hold fast to that which is good (1 Thess. 5:21). In that context, he gives them many things that we can examine and hold on to.

Hold on to your leaders. Honor and cherish them (1 Thess. 5:12-13a). Good leaders are a blessing to any congregation and should be appreciated (Heb. 13:17).

Hold on to peace (1 Thess. 5:13b). Who wouldn't want to live in peace? But it is something that must be maintained (Rom. 12:18; 14:19).

Hold on to those who are struggling with their faith (1 Thess. 5:14). The importance of working with and helping struggling brethren shouldn't be understated (Gal. 6:1).

Hold on to a kind spirit or “right-doing” (1 Thess. 5:15). Paul told them not to repay evil but to seek good for all people (Rom. 12:21).

Hold on to happiness and a sense of well-being (1 Thess. 5:16). The command here is to rejoice always. That requires remembering what we can rejoice about (John 16:22).

Hold on to prayer (1 Thess. 5:17). To pray always may seem impossible in the format that we normally see. That

doesn't mean that our days can't be filled with conversations with God (Phil. 4:6-7).

Hold on to gratitude (1 Thess. 5:18). To give thanks to God for all that He has done is easy to do, but we often forget (Psa. 50:14).

Hold on to the spiritual life and its values (1 Thess. 5:19). Are we working on the fruits of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-23)?

Hold on to sound doctrine (1 Thess. 5:20). They received direct revelation from God, yet some rejected it. For us it is written, yet sit often rejected (2 Tim. 3:16)

Hold on to a discerning mind (1 Thess. 5:21a). We must seek to have a Berean attitude in discerning truth and what is right (Acts 17:11).

Hold on to the good (1 Thess. 5:21b). There might be a lot of bad, but we must learn to focus on the good.

Hold on to a hate for sin, not sinners (1 Thess. 5:22). Literally the command is to abstain from evil. Often, we confuse that with people. We need to do our best to help them see the good (Jude 23).

In the last five verses, he speaks about other things they can hold on to: blessing, hope, faith, a sense of value, the fellowship, the charge, grace. What are we holding onto in our lives? Is there anything that we could let go of?

### He was already dead

After a night of anguish, mockery, lies, beatings and fake trials, Jesus was sentenced to execution by crucifixion by the spineless governor Pilate at 6:00 a.m. (John 19:14). He bore His cross to travel from the Praetorium to Golgotha (John 19:17). Apparently, the weight of the cross was too much for His battered, weakened and anemic body to bear, so they laid the cross on Simon a Cyrenian (Luke 23:26). They nailed Jesus' precious hands and feet to the cross at 9:00 a.m. (Mark 15:25), and He was suspended on those iron spikes for six grueling hours, until 3:00 p.m. (Matt. 27:45-50). The Roman executioners came to break the legs of the helpless victims on the crosses (in order to hasten their deaths), but “when they came to Jesus...they did not break His legs” (John 19:33). The reason? “They saw that He was already dead.” Instead, they “pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out” (19:34).

The vile Jews finally got what they wanted. But, in that moment, they (and we) got what they needed. He was already dead! May that thought never get comfortable in our heads!

### “Do you love Me?”

Jesus and the apostle Peter had a necessary and even therapeutic conversation in John 21. Peter had vehemently denied Jesus three times while his Savior and Friend stood on trial. So, in this conversation, Jesus asked Peter three times, “Do you love Me?” (21:15-17). Much is often made about the fact that Jesus used two different Greek words in asking Peter of his love. However, let's simplify this.

Forget the fact, for a moment, that Jesus changed from asking, “Do you *agapao* Me?” to asking, “Do you *phileo* Me?” And just think about this. What would you do if Jesus asked you, “Do you love Me?” What would you do if Jesus asked you three times, “Do you love Me?”

Now, it's not going to be verbal, but Jesus is asking you today, “Do you love Me?” What's your answer? After we sin, Jesus asks, “Do you love Me?” What's your answer? In the midst of our pain and hurt, Jesus asks, “Do you love Me?” When He hasn't heard from us in a while, He asks, “Do you love Me?” What's your answer? Jesus wants to know, “Do you love Me?”

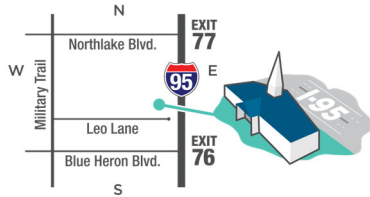
