

## **Covid and Churches Without Elders — Part Two**

to wait for a

"program" to

Where there are no elders to provide leadership, congregations are often directed simply by having the men of the church to "oversee" the church. The problem is that in such meetings there are many men who have not reached spiritual maturity and often do not have the church foremost in

their lives. As matters are discussed, these men can speak and keep the church from going where the spiritually mature know it should go. The "vote" and influences We do not have of the immature rule the church.

This can so easily happen now as Covid seems to be behind us. It is time, or soon will be, that we all remember what it was like two years ago and return to what we once did to develop the churchmeeting twice on Sundays, midweek Bible studies,

VBS, church dinners, gospel meetings, singings and so many other activities. Let me urge every male member in congregations without elders to take these matters very seriously.

We may think that until these decisions are made there is little we can do. The rest of this article will seek to address what every member—young and old, male and female can do right now to help the church recover. We can all focus on those who have not yet returned and ask God to help us.

I am not talking about programs to make it happen. I

am calling on each of us to help those who once came to come back to the church. Think of those who once worshiped, even if only one time each month, who no longer are there. What can we do? What influence can we have on them?

Remember the words of Paul as you deal with them. "You who are spiritual restore such a one in the spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted" (Gal. 6:1). Put yourself in their place and use words of kindness and

> concern, not words of shame and guilt, in all you say. Each one will be different so there is not one unchanging way to bring them back. Pray that God will give you wisdom—and divine wisdom speaks of gentleness and kindness.

> Why not go to their house, or when you see them elsewhere, and invite them to come to your house to share a meal? Let them be reminded by this

association of what they may not even know they had missed. Invite just a few of their closest friends to be there. The major topic of the evening is not their coming back. Listen carefully to what they say about how they dealt with Covid, and let them know they are being missed and how deeply you feel about them. Jesus was compassionate and put Himself in our place to bring us to the Father. This is only the beginning place, but every one of us can do this, compassionately. Can you think of the next steps that would get them back?



### The Example of Some Preachers Today—Don't Follow It!

Some preachers think they are "all that." They think the church revolves around them. They think they are the master of the sermon preparation and delivery. They think they should be invited to speak in other congregations and on lectureships. They arrive at those places as if they are a celebrity and

expect wonderful accolades and royal treatment.

Perhaps (again, perhaps) if (again, if) there was anyone who could view themselves in that way, maybe it would be the apostle Paul. Think about all of the grand accomplishments of this man of Godthe thousands of converts made, the dozens of congregations established, the debates he won, the boldness he displayed, the life he sacrificed. He deserved to be recognized, right? He deserved to be

invited to speak at great church events, right? He deserved to roll into town and have the brethren "ooh" and "aah" over his every word, right?

Well, you know Paul. He wouldn't accept any of that! His enemies tried to accuse him of such self-commendation. and there were times when he had to defend himself, because accusations like that against Paul were actually accusations against Christ Himself and the work and message with which Paul was charged. But pay attention to how Paul responded.

Paul wanted his brethren to know that his confidence was "through Christ toward God." For, he said, "Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think of anything as being from ourselves, but our sufficiency is from God, who also made us sufficient as ministers..." (2 Cor. 3:4-6). Paul recognized that he was not "sufficient" to accomplish anything that he had accomplished but that it ALL came "from God." And note that he said God had made him "sufficient" as a "minister," which is

also translated "servant." He was just a servant.

He affirms it again in the next chapter. "For we do not preach ourselves" (it's not about us!), "but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your bondservants for Jesus' sake" (2 Cor. 4:5). Again, he refers to himself as a "bondservant." Then, he says, "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of

us" (4:7). The treasure is NOT us! The treasure is "the gospel" (4:4). We are just the jars of clay that carry it and share it. We are nothing!

This is reminiscent of another place, where Paul said, "Neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters..." (1 Cor. 3:7). Who is Paul? He would (and did) say, "Not anything." He called himself "the least of all the saints" (Eph. 3:8).

Don't be like some preachers today! Be like Paul! Make everything about Jesus and NOT about you!

The treasure is NOT us! The treasure is "the gospel"!



## The Challenge Before Us

We have all been asked to do challenging things—maybe something that, at the time, didn't seem possible. It could've been an action beyond our perceived abilities, or it was completely new. To get over the immediate apprehension or anxiety of the task, we need to break the action down

into smaller actionable steps. Let's practice this with an imperative from our Lord.

Go

The command to "go" is evident, "Go therefore and make disciples..." (Matt 28:19). We don't have to go very far. The word "go" in this context means "as you are going." This is something that should start in our own households and extend to those "of all nations" (Matt. 28:19). From our back yards to the far country.

#### Go speak

"Teaching them" (Matt. 28:20). We should pray as Paul prescribed, "that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ... that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak" (Col. 4:3-4). Part of that is preparing ourselves to speak, "always being ready" "in season and out of season" (1 Pet. 3:15; 2 Tim. 4:2). We are seed sowers (Matt. 13:1-9). Nothing grows without the seed. A comforting thought is that we don't have to judge the hearts of men before we sow the seed. This sower spread it everywhere, so can we.

#### Go speak My words

Another thing that is helpful is that we have the message already. "Teaching them to observe all that I commanded you" (Matt. 28:20). Like Paul, we can't "shrink from declaring to you the whole purpose of God" (Acts 20:27). We must not

> water down the power of the Gospel (Rom. 1:16). Like anything in the production process, if you put less into it, you will get less out of it. There is a standard of quality and purity that must be maintained.

#### Go speak My words in love

What we say is important. How we say it is important, also. "Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity.

Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person" (Col. 4:5-6). This passage and "speaking the truth in love" should encapsulate the heart of the sower (Eph. 4:14-15). Love won't leave anything out and will make sure the message is conveyed in a way that is most probable of producing fruit.

Breaking this command down to its basic elements gives us actionable steps that didn't seem possible, but He is with us, even to the end of the age.

#### Without it, all my actions are useless

Paul was dealing with matters pertaining to the church and especially to the assemblies of the church in First Corinthians chapters twelve through fourteen, but there are some principles therein that we must apply in other parts of our lives. Paul begins "The Love Chapter" (1 Cor. 13) by emphasizing the absolute necessity of agape love. Think about this for a moment.

In verse 1, Paul says that if I could "SPEAK" wonderful things, "but have not love" when I speak them, it is a waste. In verse 2, Paul says that if I could "HAVE" wonderful abilities, "but have not love" when I utilize them, I am noth-

ing. In verse 3, Paul says that if I could "GIVE" great gifts to others and the Lord, "but have not love" when I give them, it profits me nothing.

Make this application in your life. It doesn't matter way I SAY, if I don't say it with agape love. It doesn't matter what I HAVE, if I don't use it with agape love. It doesn't matter what I do, if I don't saturate it with agape love. This is more than just a marriage thing! This is a life thing! -DS

#### Beholding Jesus on every page of my life

Paul used the word "mirror" twice in his writings. Can you think of where those are? First, he taught that before the New Testament was completed and while the early Christians were relying on prophets and inspired men to teach them God's will, those Christians were actually only able to "see in a mirror, dimly" (1 Cor. 13:12), for they did not have the full and com-

plete ("perfect," 13:10) revelation of God. An old, brass mirror would be kind of limiting.

But, the second time he used the word "mirror" was in contrasting the old covenant and the new covenant (i.e., the New Testament). In learning, understanding and loving the New

Testament, Paul said Christians are "beholding" (through continual practice) "as in a mirror" (clearly this time) "the glory of the Lord," and when they do that, they "are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord" (2 Cor. 3:18).

How often are you "beholding" Jesus in your copy of the completed New Testament? Are you endeavoring every day to be "transformed" into His image? -DS
