Profound Truth in Four Words

Remembering

One of the marks of the inspiration of the Bible is how such profound and eternal truths can be stated in such simple terms. This is not to say that it does not contain teachings that are like milk and other teachings like meat (Heb. 5:12-14), but God has made truth so that even one who has limited

education can understand deep truth in simple words. Consider the following truth contained in just four words.

God

The opening verses of the Bible set the tone for all that follows. "In the beginning God..." How can one look at the world around us without seeing that it was not caused by a massive, randomly uncontrolled explosion? "The heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament shows His handiwork" (Psa.

19:1). There is an intricate design to the universe, and its origin, and ours, is found in one word—God.

God Loves

Every attribute of God is infinite. There are no limits to measure the height, depth or width of any of them. His very nature is to love His creation. His care is seen in the feeding of every bird and the glorious beauty given to every flower. Do you want to see His love? Then do what Emmanuel said when He was on the earth, "Look at the birds in the air...your Father feeds them" (Matt. 6:26). His love is seen in the showers which water the earth and in light and warmth of our sun. "For He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust" (Matt. 5:45). He shows His love every day to even those who curse Him. God loves!

God Loves You

So many are ridden with guilt about the mistakes and blunders they have made. They feel that they have done so much wrong that God has no place for them. Think again about those words about the sun and rain. They come equally on the just and the unjust. After Jesus told us to look at how God feeds the birds, He asks, "Are you not of more value than they?" You may not see your value because of all of your mistakes, but He still does! Remember His prayer about forgiveness for those who were crucifying

Him, yet He still loved them! In spite of all we have done in the past, He still loves us and gave His son to prove it!

God Loves You Always

Finally, remember that His love is unchanging. Think of the worst day you every lived and know He still loved you at the end of that day. Find the joy that awaits you today when you remember that "...nothing shall be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ" (Rom. 8:39). Remember these four simple words about eternal truth: God loves you always.

It's All a Matter of Authority (Part 4)

We have seen that Jesus Christ has ALL authority (Matt. 28:18; Acts 3:22-23) and that His all authority resides in His Word, which will judge us in the last day (John 12:48-50; Rev. 20:12). That means that no manmade doctrine, no church-originated teaching, no personal feelings or opinions

will be the standard of judgment on that day. When Jesus left, He sent the Holy Spirit, who guided the apostles "into ALL truth" (John 16:13). They had every bit of Both their spotruth given to them to share with the world.

So, where does the Bible itself come in? their written Someone might agree that Christ has all authority, that His authority is in His spoken Word and that the word were given only, but the word "Scripture" is also used of the Holy Spirit told the apostles "what" to "speak" (Mark to them by God 13:11), but did that end up in the Bible? The reality is that both their spoken word and their written word were given to them by God. Look at the words carefully.

2 Timothy 3:16 clearly states, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God..." The Greek word for "inspiration of God" literally means "God-breathed." Now, what was Godbreathed? "Scripture." The Greek word is graphe—look at the word. The word means "a piece of writing, that which is written." It was not just their spoken word that was given by God, the written word was given by God!

2 Peter 1:20-21 tells us again. The text states that "that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation." No prophecy of what? Scripture! This is the same word. So, nothing that was "written" was of "any private interpretation" by the penmen. So where did it come from? "For prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit." Everything that was being written in Scripture ("written in Scripture" is almost redundant) was given by the Holy Spirit!

> Did this include the Old Testament or the New Testament? The word "Scripture" is used to refer to both. One could argue that the passages referenced above were limited to the Old Testament New Testament. Paul quoted from both the Old Testament (Deut. 25:4) and the New Testament (Luke

10:7), and he called both of them "Scripture." Peter made reference to "all [Paul's] epistles" and likened them to "the rest of the Scriptures" (2 Pet. 3:16). Paul recognized and clearly communicated to his readers, "The things which I write to you are the commandments of the Lord" (1 Cor. 14:37).

So, pick up your Bible. The 39 books of the Old Testament and 27 books of the New Testament were all and equally inspired by God, thus the all-authority of Christ is found within those 66 books. Let's make one more point next week.

"Adorning the Doctrine"

There are groups and professions that we might think ill of due to bad experiences we have had. Classically lawyers and used car salesmen are high on that list. We might all have other professions we would add to the list. There are some that would add religious people to the list. It's not hard

to see why. Many have been hurt by the words and actions of people supposedly behaving on behalf of God. Did you know that there is a lot of instruction in the New Testament that would help us avoid or mitigate that stigma?

In writing to Titus, Paul addresses several societal groups with specific instructions about behavior (Titus 2:1-10). To Titus he specifically mentions that his speech needs to be "fitting" of the healthy teaching of the Bible (2:1). To the older men he prescribes temperance, dignity, sensibility (2:2). To the older women he advises reverence, not to gossip, to teach what is good and encourage the younger (2:3). To the young women he counsels to love their families, be sensible, and pure (2:4). The young men he charges to be sensible, good examples with good deeds, and pure (2:5). To the bondslaves he instructs to be subject, not argumentative, and not pilfering (2:6).

Throughout this section of Scripture, we are given

several reasons why this behavior should be put into practice. "So that the word of God will not be dishonored" and "so that the opponent will be put to shame, having nothing bad to say about us" (2:5, 8). There is another reason listed by Paul. He says, "so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in every respect" (2:10). The imagery of adorning the doctrine of Christ is interesting. It has the idea that those who practice these things decorate or cause one to look favorably on the doctrine of the N.T. How would one do that?

Do people look favorably on Christianity Here are some things not to do with the doctrine. We should not add to it or take away from it (Rev. 22:18-19). We should not compromise on the teaching in any way (Gal. 1:6-7), like living a "Sunday only" type of Christianity. It should guide our conduct in all things. There are some things we can do to adorn the doctrine we have been entrusted with.

Remember that we are a royal priesthood (1 Pet. 2:9). Live as though our lives are a sacrifice to God (Rom. 12:1-2). Be doers of the word (Jas. 1:22). People need to be able to see good examples (1 Pet. 2:21).

As we think about this concept, we need to remember the influence we have on people. They should leave our presence speaking well of the church and Christ. If we have done anything that would be a stumbling block for one to come to Christ, then Christ says woe unto us (Luke 17:1-2).

Face to face

The apostle John wrote the two shortest letters in the New Testament—what we call Second John and Third John. They may be short, but they are mighty and loaded with many golden nuggets, such as the way he closes both books. He said to both the elect lady and Gaius, "I have many things to write to you. I did not wish to do so with paper and ink, but I hope to come to see you shortly." What could be better

than getting a hand-written letter from the aged apostle? Read his wish: "I hope to...speak face to face."

There is something special about seeing our brethren face to face. A letter is great. A phone call can be even better. But under the guide of inspiration, John wrote that "face to face" is the best of the best, and in that "our joy may be full."

How often are you "face to face" with your brethren? How often do you share meals, coffee or just a "stop by to visit for a few minutes"? How much do you long for Sundays and Wednesdays? How often are you face to face? -DS

"Pay to the Order of"

Think about the practice of "writing a check" in relationship to Christ's death. The Bible depicts the death of Christ as a payment that was made on our behalf. Consider this for a moment.

When writing a check, you must put a date on it. When Christ

wrote the date, He said, "The hour has come" (John 17:1). For "Pay to the Order of," He was not making payment "to" us or "to" the devil. The sacrifice was directed "to" the Father (Heb. 9:12-14), as propitiation for sins. In the amount box, Jesus wrote in, "My blood" (Matt. 26:28). On the amount line, He wrote out,

"Give His life a ransom" (Matt. 20:28; Eph. 1:7). On the memo line, He simply wrote, "For you" (Eph. 5:2; Gal. 2:20). He waited three days and signed it with "the empty tomb" (1 Pet. 3:21). Seeing that a check must have a bank on which the funds are being drawn, Jesus used the only bank that is "rich in mercy...great love...exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness" (Eph. 2:4-7). Of course, the check cleared! Now He's waiting on you to accept His payment...every day! – DS


