Some "Lesser" Commandments Are Easily Kept

The greatest

commandment

involves all of

our heart and

soul

ALL-sufficient,

for ALL-time

The words of Jesus just hours before His death had to be so startling to His listeners. Their religious leaders had taught them the importance of giving tithes (10%) of all that the Lord had given to them. The leaders went beyond the obvious gifts like giving the tithe of crops they had planted and harvest-

ed. Based on Leviticus 27:30, they devoted the principle to the spices that were part of their lives.

Jesus said, "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe of mint and dill and cummin..." (Matt. 23:23). All of these were used in cooking, and cummin was also used as a medicine. While wheat and barley involved large sections of the land, the spices were grown in a far smaller place. Think about the spices that you have to use in

your cooking, and you will see how devoted these leaders were in tithing. Imagine counting out all of these "seeds" and giving every tenth one to God.

Before looking at the rest of what Jesus said, do not make the mistake some have in applying these verses today. We hear individuals talking about "majoring in minors," and in the application they conclude the only thing God is concerned about is the "weightier" aspects of what God says and concluding that the "lesser" matters really do not matter at all.

Jesus did not minimize the tithing of spices. In fact, He said that you should not ignore them, you should do them. However, He then addressed the ignoring of the "weightier" matters and called these leaders, "Hypocrites." They substituted attention to the "lesser" items and gave the appearance that they were far more religious than others. He said that the motivation to all their works were done to be seen by men (Matt. 23:5). This is a classic illustration of hypocrisy.

> Look at the "weightier" matters which the leaders had neglected. Jesus said that they had "...neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith." They had devoted all their energies to lesser aspects of what God said (it was easier for a hypocrite to do this), while at the same time ignoring what God said.

The tithe of these spices was external and far easier to do. These "weightier" matters were internal and had to do with the heart and soul of the servant of God. They are not "seed" items because they are "soul" items.

That first commandment, the greatest commandment, involves loving God with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength. Take time to see how this has such great application in our walk with the Lord in the new covenant. Service given to God that is only external is far removed from the greatest commandment. Think about this!

It's All a Matter of Authority (Part 5)

Jesus Christ has ALL authority (Matt. 28:18), and that authority resides in His Word (John 12:48), which was given by the Holy Spirit to inspired penmen, who wrote those words in inspired documents. Those inspired, written documents (66 of them in total) are called "Scripture," and we can have

confidence that when we pick our Bibles that is exactly what we are reading—the inspired, all-authoritative Word of God! Let's note one more thing about Scripture, The ALL-inspired, then both of these verses are proven false. and then, in the concluding article next week, we will consider our responsibility to His authoritative Word.

We learn in 2 Timothy 3:16 that "All Scripture is given by the inspiration of God." All of it! delivered Word Then, in the next verse, we are informed that God is in our Bibles! gave us "all Scripture" so "that" (the Greek word here denotes the purpose) "the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (3:17). Without "all Scripture," man is NOT complete and is NOT thoroughly equipped. But, having "all Scripture" makes man "complete." If we are "complete" (with the inspired 66 books), what's missing? What additional revelation is needed or could be given? The answer is that we are missing nothing and no additional revelation will be given, lest this verse itself be proven a lie.

Peter teaches us this same truth: "...through the

knowledge of Him" which we have revealed to us by the Holy Spirit in our inspired Bibles (2 Pet. 1:20-21), God "has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness" (1:3). Did you see how much we have? All! We have all that we need for "life and godliness"? So, how much is missing? How much will be or could be added later? The answer to both questions is "Nothing!" "ALL" Scripture is given to us by God, we have "ALL" that God said we would need. If I need something more

or something outside of the 66 books of the Bible,

Then, to top it ALL off, the Lord reveals to us that "the faith...was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3). "The faith" is the "the gospel" (Gal. 1:11+23)—the universal, "one" body of truth (Eph. 4:5), given to mankind in God's inspired Word. The adverb "once for all" means "pertaining to a single

occurrence and decisively unique, of what is of perpetual validity, not requiring repetition." The same word is used for the sacrifice of Christ for our sins—"once for all" (Heb. 9:28; 1 Pet. 3:18). Just as Christ's sacrifice has perpetual validity, not requiring repetition or amendment, the same is true of Scripture. There is NOTHING more to be delivered; it is final!

These three keys passages all emphasize the word "ALL." The ALL-inspired, ALL-sufficient, for ALL-time delivered Word is in our Bibles! What a thought! Let's finish next week.

You Are My Portion

Among the people of the earth, the Israelites had a special relationship with God. Even among those in the tribe of Levi had a special service which drew them into a closer relationship with God than their brothers. The descendants of Aaron were to be the priests and the rest of the tribe were to serve

and participate in taking care of the tabernacle (Num. 18:1-2). God provided for them since they were exclusively working in His service. Chapter eighteen of Numbers talks at length about how God was going to provide for the Levites. In it He makes this statement, "Then the LORD said to Aaron, 'You shall have no inheritance in their land nor own any portion among them; I am your portion and your inheritance among the sons of Israel'" (Num. 18:20). This emphasis that God was to be our portion or sustenance is something that is repeated in the Old Testament.

In the Psalms, we see this theme. "My flesh and my heart may fail, But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever" (Psa. 73:26). "I cried out to You, O LORD; I said, 'You are my refuge, My portion in the land of the living'" (Psa. 142:5). Even in the book of Lamentations, "'The LORD is my portion,' says my soul, 'Therefore I have hope in Him'" (Lam. 3:24). This passage was the majority of the text for the song, "The Steadfast Love of the Lord." The word "portion" is con-

nected with the concept of an inheritance or payment. The sentiment that is being communicated is a complete trust in God and in His provision.

This ability to completely trust in God is central to Paul's secret of being content. "Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have

learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:11-13). He can do all things through Him who provides our portion. This is what Jesus was trying to teach on the mountain. "Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you

not worth much more than they?" (Matt. 6:26). Nature teaches us that God is the provider. Every morning we have a reminder of His provision in the sun, which, if it or we stopped spinning, we would all die. Yet, we are not worrying about it because God is faithful.

We are children of a faithful provider. We need to live with the words, "God is my portion," on our lips. How much of what we worry or get anxious about would be dissolved? The secret of contentment is trust in God, the provider.

Access denied

It "keeps on being" this way

It is fun to run across gems in studying the Bible, and when one finds a statement of Jesus tucked away deep inside the book of Acts, it ought to make one pause and process it. Paul gave us this quote from Jesus in Acts 20:35, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

The word "blessed" is the same word found in the Beatitudes in Matthew 5, and the Greek word (makarios) simply means "happy." "It is more happy to give than to receive." Do you believe that? Wouldn't you like the world to believe it? But Jesus said more than that.

There are three verbs in that sentence, and they are all in the Greek present tense, which denotes an ongoing, habitual practice. The verse literally says, "It keeps on being more happy to keep on giving than to keep on receiving." This is not a one-time thing—this is a lifestyle thing. It ought to make us "ongoing happy" to be an "ongoing giver." There are, no doubt, many reasons for that, but at the top of the list is being like our Lord (John 3:16; 1 John 3:16; Eph. 5:2)! — DS
