Truths Which Motivated Paul

The history of the life of David is recorded in three Old Testament books, but it is in the book of Psalms that we begin to understand the heart of David. His heart is so important because it is so much like the heart of God (1 Sam. 13:14). There is somewhat of a parallel to David in the life and writings of Paul.

It is in the book of Acts we learn so much of the details of the life of the great apostle, but there are historical events revealed in his epistles. In a similar way, the heart of Paul is revealed in his letters, and they often give us insight as to the spiritual depth of his devotion to God and the truths of God showing the nature of his heart in serving God. Consider the following to see some of these truths.

“I AM PERSUADED that neither death nor life...nor things present nor things to come...shall be able to separate us from the love of God” (Rom. 8:38-39). Do you wonder how he could give up so much and endure such suffering? Do you struggle in your trials and seek motivation for all that is around you? Write these words from Paul on your heart. Be fully persuaded that there is nothing on this earth, neither in the demons of hell, which can keep God from loving us.

I AM NOTHING. “Though I have the gift of prophecy,

and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, **I am nothing** “(1 Cor. 13:2). Imagine having complete understanding of all things and having all faith. Paul emphasizes something far greater than these and that is love. It was not that he was just persuaded of God’s eternal love. Written deeply on his heart was his responsibility to place love above all of these. Write these words on the depths of your soul as you seek to imitate Paul as he imitated the Lord (1 Cor. 11:1).

Read Paul’s doctrinal discourses, also find those truths which show his heart

“I...AM PERSUADED that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day” (2 Tim. 1:12). The life of every person on this earth is committed to something. We are investing all of our time and energy to self, to sin or to things much higher. Paul looked at every decision he made as an investment and knew the Lord would never forget them. You may, like Paul, have to turn the other cheek to those around you. You may have to bless those who are cursing you and to make decisions about what you must give up to follow Him. Think about these choices as being registered in a heavenly book which some day will be opened. Trust God to remember it all, even to as small a matter as a cup of cold water.

As you read Paul’s doctrinal discussion in his writings, remember to discover hidden truths which show his heart.

It’s All a Matter of Authority (Part 6)

The sixty-six books of your Bible are the all-authoritative Word of God (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 1 Cor. 14:37). They were given by the Holy Spirit, who moved inspired penmen to write the very words He delivered (2 Pet. 1:20-21; 1 Cor. 2:10-13). In the Bible, we have “all things” that are given by God and “all things” that are necessary to serve God (2 Tim. 3:17; 2 Pet. 1:3; Jude 3). So, what is my responsibility to this ALL-inspired, ALL-sufficient, for ALL-time delivered Word?

First, let us consider what we are NOT to do with God’s Word. It seems strange that we would even need to address what “not” to do with the Bible, but the ways of man required God to give some very explicit instructions and warnings (in both the Old Testament and the New Testament).

We must NOT “add to” God’s Word (Deut. 4:2; 12:32; Prov. 30:6; Rev. 22:18). It is perfect in every way (Psa. 19:7). It is not “missing” anything and does not need our “help” with the addition of our thoughts, opinions, traditions, etc.

We must NOT “take away from” God’s Word (Deut. 4:2; 12:32; Rev. 22:19). How daring and arrogant would it be to suggest that a command of God does not need to be kept or that a specified condition of salvation is not required. We are not God and have no right to put ourselves in the place of God!

We must NOT modify, substitute or pervert the will of God (Gal. 1:6-9). Neither the apostles nor the angels had the authority to change any part of God’s Word (Gal. 1:8)! What mortal today can have such a right (1:9)? Those who presume to do such will be “accursed.”

We must NOT elevate our own doctrines or traditions above God’s Word!

We must NOT elevate our own doctrines or traditions above God’s Word. That is why it is so essential to understand that the 66 books of the Bible are ALL-inspired, ALL-sufficient and ALL-time delivered. Jesus gave an extended and explicit warning to those who advance their traditions in place of or alongside His Word. In so doing, they “lay aside the commandment of God,” “reject the commandment of God,” and “make the word of God of no effect” (Mark 7:8, 9, 13). There are eternal consequences for doing such (Matt. 15:13).

We must NOT go beyond what is written (1 Cor. 4:6). Some translations say not to “think beyond” what is written, for when we do, we do not have God (2 John 9).

We must NOT speak beyond that which is written (1 Pet. 4:11). One will be judged by the words he uses (Matt. 12:36-37), and anyone who teaches will be subject to a “stricter judgment” (Jas. 3:1). How dangerous to speak where God has not spoken or to speak differently than God has.

One more thought to go: What are we to DO with God’s all-authoritative Word? Read next week.

Addressing God As the Father

You have probably heard someone praying publicly address God repeatedly as “Father,” “Father God,” or even “Father God just.” Often to the point that it is distracting. I am not being critical. This happens because of nervous habits, or they were taught this. However, a line too far is addressing God as “dad, daddy, papi” or any other informal way we would address our earthly fathers. There is an interesting thought that Peter gives us concerning those that address God as Father.

“If you address as Father the One who impartially judges according to each one’s work, conduct yourselves in fear during the time of your stay on earth; knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, the blood of Christ” (1 Pet. 1:17-19).

There is first a conditional statement that speaks to addressing the Judge of this world as Father. This is possible because of God’s love (1 John 3:1). It is to be done through faith and obedience to Him (John 1:12; 14:23). It is to be done by those that have an obedient relationship with God. This relationship comes with the knowledge that one will be judged

for every action, whether good or bad (2 Cor. 5:10). What logically follows from this condition and knowledge is an expectation in the conduct of the one that addresses God as Father.

Their conduct should show fear toward God in light of the judgment. This word in Greek is what we get our word “phobia” from. It means fear and terror. After talking about the judgment of God, Paul wrote, “Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade men” (2 Cor. 5:11). The idea is to persuade them away from a fearful judgment. The righteous live their lives with a healthy fear of the judgment of the Lord, “for our God is a consuming fire” (Heb. 12:29). The wicked are not so. When Paul wrote about descriptors of the unrighteous, he said, “there was no fear of God before their eyes” (Rom. 3:18). There is no expectation of repentance from this person, just “a terrifying expectation of judgment and the fury of a fire which will consume the adversaries” (Heb. 10:27).

Seeing that God has bought us back, not with the five shekels of silver from the old covenant but the blood of His Son, He deserves our respect and fear. “Therefore, since we receive a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe” (Heb. 12:28). This should be true in our service, in our conduct, and in our prayers.

God is not your daddy.

He knew, He knew, He knew

We have recorded three separate instances in the life of Jesus when He predicted specific details about His impending death. Slowly read these. Consider that He knew all of this ahead of time, and yet He still came, He stayed and He endured it all... for you...and me.

Jesus Himself said, “The Son of Man must **suffer** many things, and be **rejected** by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be **killed**, and be **raised** the third day” (Luke 9:22). Not long after that, He again started telling His disciples, “The Son of Man is being **betrayed** into the hands of men, and they will **kill** Him. And after He is **killed**, He will **rise** the third day” (Mark 9:31). Less than a year later, it is recorded that He was teaching again, “Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and **all** things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be **delivered** to the Gentiles and will be **mocked** and **insulted** and **spit** upon. They will **scourge** Him and **kill** [crucify, Matt. 20:19] Him. And the third day He will **rise** again” (Luke 18:31-33). – DS



“Sweet Hour of Prayer”

I will admit that singing William W. Walford’s “Sweet Hour of Prayer” in worship as a kid was not my favorite song. Praying for a whole hour didn’t sound “sweet” in a little kid’s mind. Over the years (and with a little seasoning of maturity and better understanding of figurative language), the words have much more meaning. For example, when you insert the word

“opportunity” for “hour,” it may help it to make sense. Can I ask you some questions about prayer?

Is the opportunity to pray “sweet” to you? Do you feel drawn to your “Father’s throne” to “make all my wants and wishes known”? Has your “soul...often found relief” in prayer? Has regular prayer helped to “escape the tempter’s snare”? Do you have “strong desires” for the “return” of prayer times in your day? Do you “hasten to the place” of prayer? Do you have confidence the “wings” of prayer “bear” your “petition...to Him” who is characterized by “truth and faithfulness”? Do you “cast on Him my every care”? Think about the words. Do you long and love to pray? – DS

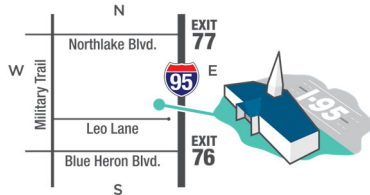

The Bible says...

- 1. Believe that Jesus is the Son of God**
"Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31).
- 2. Repent of your sinful ways**
"Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out" (Acts 3:19).
- 3. Confess your faith in Jesus**
"If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus...you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9).
- 4. Be immersed in water**
