The writer of Hebrews could so easily see the dangers faced by those Jewish Christians. The nation that killed God's Son turned its wrath on the church almost from the day it began. Jesus had warned them about the trials that were coming. Obviously, they persecuted those Gentiles who had be-

come followers of Jesus, but their persecution was even more fierce on the Christians addressed in this epistle.

They had begun their walk with Jesus and faced many trials which came their way. Hebrews chapter ten describes this: "After you were illuminated, you endured a great struggle with sufferings...you were made a spectacle both by reproaches and tribulations." The author then adds, "You became a companion of those who were so treated" (10:32-33).

How did they emotionally respond to all of this? "You joyfully accepted the plundering of your goods" (10:34). Earthly possessions are meaningless when viewed from the eternal truth about our existence. They could so easily give up that which was temporal. "Knowing that you have a better and an enduring possession for yourselves in heaven."

Living faithfully on this earth for many years is so difficult. We understand the faith of those who are martyrs for the cause of Christ. At that last moment they reached deep within their souls and their faith sustained. What we may have done is overlooked the depth of the faith of those who face not a momentary trial, but serve Him for years and years. We rightly honor the faith of martyrs, but perhaps it takes a deeper faith to serve Him for years and years.

When this letter was written their devotion was weakening. Look again at this chapter and the admonition given to them. "Therefore do not cast away your confidence, Living faithfully which has great reward. For you have need of enduron this earth for ance, so that after you have done the will of God you

soul has no pleasure in Him" (10:35-38).

Now make the application in your life. How long have you been a Christian? Where is your faith in Him compared to what it once was? Remember

"Six Days" Is Not Complicated

In a variety of ways, certain skeptics of the Bible attempt to take some of the simplest teachings of the Bible and complicate them to mean something they do not, and they seek to use their so-called "scholarship" to convince individuals that their conclusions are sound. This is true of a variety of Bible

teachings, but consider for a moment the days of creation.

On the very first page of the Bible, readers learn about the creation of the universe and everything in it. The Bible plainly teaches that all of this transpired over a period of six days. Unfortunately, those who consider themselves "to be something" take the simple and argue that it is not so simple. Attempts have been made to identify the "days" in Genesis 1 as long eons of time and not actual 24hour, literal days. But read the text for what it says.

In verse 5, God defines what a day is. "So the evening and the morning were the first day." The Bible uses these words numerous times in a literal way just as we use them today. A "day" is made up of two parts: evening (a time of "darkness") and morning (a time of "light"). A simple, unbiased Bible reader will understand this to be a 24-hour day.

Verse 5 also begins to number the days—"the first day," "the second day" (1:8), "the third day" (1:13), etc. Except in areas of figurative, prophetic language, when "day" is preceded by a numeral in the Old Testament, it is always a 24hour period. God was numbering the days for us.

In verse 14, God distinguished the word "days" from the word "years." If the "days" of creation were actually "years" (as some suggest), then what does the word "years" mean? These words are used in the very same way that we use them today. If not, the passage is nonsensical.

> If there was eons of time after the creation of the grass, herbs and trees on the third day, how

did those plants and vegetation survive the years upon years of darkness (with no light) and the eons of time before insects were created to pollinate them? They could not have survived. The text in Exodus 20:8-11 is God's clear

commentary on the creation. It is so easy to understand. "Remember the Sabbath day" (a 24-hour period). "Six days you shall labor," for six 24-hour periods. "The seventh day is the Sabbath," which is a 24-hour period. Having used the word "day" three times with a literal, 24-hour meaning, God then says, "For in six days the Lord made" everything. Those were six, literal, 24-hour days. The Bible makes that very plain! Only man could try to make that complicated!

There are no eons of time in the literal, 24-hour days of creation! The Bible makes that so simple to understand!

Paul, in his address to the Areopagus, spoke of the need for all men to repent and that a day has been appointed for judgment; those statements came with the assurance or proof in the resurrection of the Christ (Acts 17:30-31). We overlook the gift of having an assurance from God. We want assur-

ances when it comes to things we buy or promises made. With God, these assurances are a blessing.

We can come to realize this assurance as Christians. It is produced by faith as we "draw near with a true heart in full assurance" (Heb. 10:22). It is made complete in hope. "Show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end" (Heb. 6:11). It is confirmed by love. "Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and

in truth. By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him" (1 John 3:18-19). It is the effect of righteousness. "And the effect of righteousness will be peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever" (Isa. 32:17). It is made abundant in an understanding of the Gospel, "that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, to reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ" (Col. 2:2).

We are not just given assurances about judgment. God has made assurances about many things. We have the promise of our election (1 Thess. 1:4), our redemption (Job 19:25), our adoption (1 John 3:2), our salvation (Isa. 12:2), of eternal life (1 John 5:13), the great love of God (Rom. 8:38-39), union with God and Christ (Eph. 5:30), peace with God (Rom. 5:1), the preservation of God (2 Tim. 1:12), answered prayer (1 John 3:22), comfort in affliction (Psa. 73:26), support in death

(Psa. 23:4), resurrection (Psa. 17:15), and a crown of life (Jas. 1:12). We can rely on these promises "without wavering, for he who promised is faithful" (Heb. 10:23).

There have been others who relied on the divine assurances of God. David spoke of his assurance that God was guiding him to glory (Psa. 73:24-26). Paul was confident in God's deliverance and

preservation during his trials. "The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed and bring me safely into his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen" (2 Tim. 4:18).

Every saint should strive to arrive at this assurance to make your calling and election sure (2 Pet. 1:10-11). We should do all we can to "hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end" (Heb. 3:14). "Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward" (Heb. 10:35). Rest and take comfort in the assurances the God has granted to us.




