# **Knowing the Lord as Your Personal Savior**

The "wise and

prudent" do not

comprehend the

cross and obedi-

ence to Him

How often have you heard these words of Jesus in Bible classes and sermons? "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28). They touch our hearts, but they may become even more powerful when we look at the words preceding His invitation.

Before giving His invitation, He spoke to the Father. "I

thank You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that You have hidden these things from the wise and prudent." The things He mentioned were the eternal truths He came to reveal. They were hidden from those described as wise and prudent. The wise and the prudent would be the ones you might expect to be given such vital truths, yet Jesus thanked God that it had not been given to those respected by society

as being above all others. It may at first seem strange, but if Jesus was thankful for this, shouldn't we also be thankful?

Jesus continued His thought when He said the Father had "...revealed them to babes." Obviously, the babes are not infants, but those individuals to whom it was revealed were so different from the wise and prudent. Paul describes this truth in this way. "For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many noble, are called" (1 Cor. 1:26). There was no way to comprehend those prophecies about how God would come in the flesh and the Creator of the universe would suffer crucifixion. When He actually came there was no human wisdom, even among the wise and prudent, that could comprehend it.

Jesus said even more about this before giving His great invitation. "No one knows the Father...except the Son, and the one to whom the Son wills to reveal Him" (Matt. 11:27). To whom does Jesus reveal the Father? He has been

> revealed Him to "babes" who by human standards are so far removed from being wise and prudent. Jeremiah described those who would be the recipients of the New Covenant. "For they shall all know Me, from the least to the greatest" (Jer. 31:34).

We must never forget that as we respond to His great invitation we come to know God. It is that revelation from God that enables us to so easily un-

derstand the crucified Creator! That which the world by its wisdom will never comprehend is the very basis of how we come to the Savior and know Him!

Christendom often asks, "Do you know the Lord as your personal Savior." Is there any way we can know that we really know God? Here is God's answer to that question. "By this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments" (1 John 2:4). Coming to Him involves knowing His will and doing what He says. "Babes" fully understand this.



# The "Sleep" of Death?

What does it mean when the Bible talks about death as "sleep"? Does it mean that the person who dies goes into a state of unconsciousness? Does it mean that the soul itself enters a state of sleep until the return of Jesus? Or is it talking metaphorically about the body as being "asleep"? Let's ex-

amine the Scripture to understand this matter.

The Bible does speak about death with the word "sleep." Jesus said that Jairus' daughter was "not dead, but sleeping" (Matt. 9:24), and later He said about Lazarus, "I go that I may wake him up," when Lazarus was "dead" (John 11:11-14). Paul wrote "concerning those who have fallen asleep" (1 Thess. 4:13). But is this addressing a physical sleeping? A sleep of the body? A sleep of the soul?

When the prophet Daniel foresaw the time of the resurrection, he wrote, "And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting contempt" (Dan. 12:2). Note that the "sleep" is taking place "in the dust of the earth." This is an obvious reference to the body, as are the passages from the lips of Jesus above. But the soul is not in the ground.

The Bible describes what transpires at death. James said, "The body without the spirit is dead" (Jas. 2:26). So, it is the body that is dead, not the spirit. Death of the physical body results when the life-giving spirit (Gen. 2:7; 7:22) departs from the body. This coincides precisely, for example, with the death of Jesus, when He said, "Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit," and then "He breathed His last" (Luke 23:46). The soul of Jesus went to Paradise (Acts 2:27-31), where He had told the thief they would be together (Luke 23:43), but His body went into the tomb (John 19:38-42).

The spirit is still very much awake and alert in his/her new environment.

Thus, at death, there is separation. The body (made of "the dust") "will return to the earth as it was, and the spirit will return to God who gave it" (Ecc. 12:7). The body is dead. Is the spirit still conscious? Yes! Very much so! This is demonstrated plainly in two passages. In Luke 16, two men died in verse 22, but in verse 23, both men (along with Abraham) were still conscious and completely aware of

their surroundings. The same is true in Revelation 6, when John saw (in verse 9) "the souls" of Christian martyrs who had been beheaded, and those souls (in verse 10) were conscious, speaking, and aware of their surroundings and their past life.

The word "sleep" is simply used as an idiom for death in Scripture (like we might say, "He passed away"), but it is only used of the body (which is often lying in a position of rest) and not of the spirit (the person himself). The spirit is still very much awake and alert in his/her new environment. Scripture does not support the doctrine of "soul-sleeping" after death.

# A People After God's Own Heart



"I have found in David the son of Jesse a man after my heart, who will do all my will" (Acts 13:22b). This beautiful compliment, "a man after My own heart" is one that should characterize every person who wears the name of Christ.

David loved the word of God, "Oh how I love your law!" (Psa. 119:97). This psalm, if not written

by David, it certainly expresses his sentiment found elsewhere. We find one who has a great love for God's word (Psa. 119:47-48) He loves God's word because it protects him from sin, revives him in trials, and gives him peace of mind (Psa. 119:11, 50, 165). How do we respond to God's word? Do we hide it in our heart? Do we find it to be a source of comfort in times of affliction? Does it give us peace of mind? If

not, we should give heed to the instructions of David (Psa. 1:1-3). We should look to God's word in all things.

David loved to pray, "I will call upon Him as long as I live" (Psa. 116:1-2). His love for prayer was based upon the fact God had answered him before (Psa. 116:1-2). It was based upon the fact that God had greatly blessed him (Psa. 116:12-13). It was based upon the fact that prayer brought God close to him (Psa. 145:18). How is our love for prayer? Have we found it to be a source of peace "which surpasses all under-

standing"? (Phil. 4:6-7). Do we "pray without ceasing"? (1 Thess. 5:17). If not, then let us learn to depend upon prayer for our preservation (Psa. 32:6-7).

David loved to praise God, "seven times a day I praise You" (Psa. 119:164). He praised God because of His righteous judgments, His greatness and His loving kindness (Psa. 95:1-7). David was determined to sing praises as long as he lived (Psa. 104:33). Do we love to praise God? Do we delight in singing

praises to God in song? Do we take time to praise God in our prayers? David has words to encourage our praise of God. "Praise the Lord! For it is good to sing praises to our God; For it is pleasant and praise is becoming" (Psa. 147:1).

David hated every false way. "I hate every false way" (Psa. 119:104). His hatred was based upon his understanding of God's word (Psa. 119:104). His

hatred affected his selection of activities and friends (Psa. 101:3-4, 6-7). What is our attitude toward falsehood? Do we compromise? Do we recognize that we are involved in a "battle" over the souls of men, and are not to think lightly of that which is false? (2 Cor. 10:3-5). David wasn't perfect, but he softened his heart in repentance to God. We must not compromise on sin. These are a few examples of a man after God's own heart. We should strive to live in such a way that the same is said of us, a people after God's own heart.

#### "I don't have to be part of the church!"
