There is no way that the author of a hymn has of knowing just how widely it may be used. In every generation, there are songs which briefly appear and just a few years later they are rarely used. There are other songs which have been around for decades, and there must be a reason for this. There

was no way for Daniel S. Warner to know in 1893 that the song he published would be around over a century and be translated and sung in both Russia and Germany and become part of over forty hymnals. It is not sung as much today as it once was, but the message it con-

My name is in the Book of Life,
Oh, bless the name of Jesus;
I rise above all doubt and strife,
And read my title clear.
(Refrain)
I know, I know, My name is there;
I know, I know, My name is written there.

Jesus describes the new birth by which one becomes part of the family of God. The Spirit of God uses the words of God to convict men of sin, righteousness and of the coming judgment (John 16:8) and brings them to a burial in the waters of baptism (John 3:5). The Lord says that if this does not hap-

pen, he will never enter the kingdom of heaven. However, when one is baptized, he is added to the kingdom his name is "...registered in heaven (Heb. 12:23). There is a divine book that has within it the names of all who have been born again.

At the final judgment that book which contains the names of all the redeemed will be opened. "And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire" (Rev. 20:15). It is these words which lie in the background of the hymn written 130 years ago.

Two witnesses

Can you know that your name is there? The Holy Spirit has revealed how one becomes a child of God in His family. Believers who repent (decide to turn their lives over to Jesus) are lead by the Spirit to be buried in water, into the death of Jesus, as they call upon God to save them (1 Pet. 3:21).

These words of the Spirit bears witness that if one does obey Jesus his name will be written in that book. The sobering question is whether your spirit can bear witness that you have obeyed the words of the Spirit. There are two witnesses needed to establish truth. The witness has been given from heaven, there is another witness and that is that your spirit (your soul). Can you say that you have obeyed the Lord and I know your name is written there? The Bible does not say "to my spirit," but says "with my spirit." The Spirit bears witness with my spirit that I am saved (Rom. 8:16).

Can Jesus See Your Faith?

In Mark 2, we find one of the most exciting and vivid stories in the New Testament. Jesus was preaching in Capernaum, "and it was heard that He was in the house. Immediately many gathered together, so that there was no longer room to receive them, not even near the door" (Mark 2:1-2).

Four men carried a paralytic to the house, but "they could not come near Him because of the crowd" (2:3-4), so "they uncovered the roof where [Jesus] was." Can you imagine seeing that from inside the house? "So when they had broken through, they let down the bed on which the paralytic was lying" (2:4). The Bible says in the next verse that "Jesus saw their faith" (2:5).

What does that mean? Isn't faith something in a person's heart? Does that mean that Jesus was looking into their hearts to see their faith? Not necessarily. It is certainly possible (see John 2:24-25), but we also know that faith is something which God teaches that we "show" to others through our "works" (Jas. 2:17-18). So, when "Jesus saw their faith," He saw four men at work on behalf of their friend, and the paralytic was blessed by Jesus as a result of the faith of his friends.

So here's the question—Does Jesus see your faith?

And when He sees your faith, what does He see?

Does Jesus see your faith in teaching the gospel to others? "Faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead" (Jas. 2:17). You may have faith in the gospel. You may have faith in the need to take the gospel to lost souls (Mark 16:15). But, if your mental belief is not put into action with actual works of teaching the gospel, then your faith is dead.

Does Jesus see your faith in serving your brothers and sisters in Christ? "Faith without works is dead" (Jas. 2:20). You may have faith in the value of the church. You may have faith in the need do good especially to brethren (Gal. 6:10). But, if your mental belief is not put into action with actual works of encouraging and serving the brethren, then your faith is dead.

Does Jesus see your faith in worshiping God every week? "Faith without works is dead" (Jas. 2:26). You may have faith in the blessing of regular worship. You may have faith in the need to prioritize and enjoy assembling with the church and worshiping God every week (Matt. 4:10; 6:33). But, if your mental belief is not put into action with actual and faithful attendance and participation in worshiping God, then your faith is dead.

Jesus saw their faith! What did He see in their faith? What does He see when He sees your faith?

Overcoming Discouragement

We can make a

Discouragement is a very real danger—a weapon that Satan wields very proficiently. Discouragement has the potential to destroy us, thus Paul warned about it (Gal. 6:9). The following are some suggestions that should help us overcome this threat.

Focus our eyes on heaven. Life is meaningless without God (Eccl. 1:2). Our eyes need to be focused upon the goal of our life. Setting our minds on things above keeps us looking up (Col. 3:2). Jesus, for the joy that was set before Him, endured the pain and shame of His death (Heb. 12:2). This helps us shipwreck of our keep things in perspective.

Counting our blessings is more than just a of despair. song. Don't allow a few negative things to monopolize our attention. No matter the adversity we face, there are many reasons we can still thank God. To mope and complain after all that God has done for us is a sign of ingratitude (Phil. 4:4, 11).

Look outward rather than inward gets the focus off whatever we are struggling with. "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive'" (Acts 20:35). A truthful paradox is to bear another person's load will lighten your own. Much of our discouragement can be dispelled by obeying God's command to be a kingdom of servants. We were created for good works (Eph. 2:10).

Remember that God demands faithfulness, not success (Rev. 2:10). Self-appointed goals often bring feelings of discouragement and failure. It is our job to plant and water, and God gives the increase (1 Cor. 3:6). We run the race, fight the fight, and labor for the goal of the next life and to be rewarded by our heavenly Father (2 Tim. 2:4-6; 4:7-8).

We know the outcome of the story. The book of Revelation emphatically tells us that when all is said and done we, who have trusted in Christ, are souls on the rock victorious! Because we know that we will attain the mountaintops, why then worry when we find ourselves in some rather deep dark valleys, for we know that it is only temporary (Rev. 12:11; 14:13).

> Let us not be so discouraged that we forget what lies ahead. "Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus (Phil. 3:13-14). Yes, things happen that can be discouraging. We must not let it be an occasion for Satan to get a foothold in our hearts and blind us from the promises of our Lord. We can make a shipwreck of our souls on the rock of despair.

Faith in God makes ALL the difference!

In Joshua 2, the Bible reader is introduced to a character named Rahab. The uniqueness of her name may be part of the reason that we automatically identify her with her past livelihood—she was a harlot. Of the eight times her name appears in Scripture, five of those times she is called "the harlot." Why is this Old Testament character mentioned with favor in the **New Testament?**

She is not mentioned in Scripture because she was a harlot. She is mentioned in Scripture because of what she became—a woman of faith. Her saving faith was not merely a mental assent to some facts, but an obedient faith that

stepped out from her upbringing and from her fellow countrymen and demonstrated an active trust in the God of heaven.

We learn from Rahab that the sins of our past do not have to define us. If you truly "believe that [God] is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (Heb. 11:6), that faith will lead you to a submissive obedience that will reward you eternally (cf. Heb. 11:31; Jas. 2:25). Do you have a true faith in the true God? - DS

God is worthy of our praise!

The short Jewish hymn of Psalm 100 is filled with ever-flowing joy and goodness. The psalmist bids the worshiper to "make a joyful shout to the Lord," to "serve the Lord with gladness," to "come before" Him "with singing," to "enter His gates with thanksgiving" and "with praise."

> There are an infinite number of reasons that we should do this, but the psalmist focuses on three things regarding who God is and three things regarding what God is. Meditate on these for a moment, as you consider how worthy our God is of praise and thanksgiving.

He is worthy because of WHO He is: (1) He is God; (2) He is our Maker; (3) He is our shepherd. He is worthy because of WHAT He is: (1) He is good; (2) He is merciful; (3) He is truthful. Now, please, stop. Go back and read those again. Consider each one of them. Then, tell God how worthy you think He is of your praise and thanksgiving. This truly ought to bring a "joyful...gladness" to our hearts every day! - DS






