Letters in the Sand, Washed Away

many things we

should write in

grave in stones

Pat Boone was not the only singer who recorded it, but he was the one whose version soared to the greatest heights in the late 50s. He sang about how he and his loved one wrote "Love Letters in the Sand" and how his heart was broken as the incoming tide washed those letters away. Think about

this for a moment, and you can see there are many things in our life we need to have washed out.

Sometimes we need to wash away the anger in our lives. Anger itself is not sinful. It is a godly quality. The psalmist said, "God is a just judge, and God is angry with the wicked every day" (Psa. 7:11). However, he also said, "Be angry and do not sin. the sand, not en-Meditate within your heart on your bed, and be still. Selah" (Psa. 2:12). Jesus is the One we long to be

exactly as He was. "He looked around at them with anger, being grieved by the hardness of their heart" (Mark 3:6). So, the next time you see evil, or when someone has wronged you, do not engrave their words in stone within your heart. We are commanded, "Be angry, and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your wrath" (Eph. 4:26). Let the waves of agape love wash away your anger.

Write your "list" of past accomplishments in the sand and let them be washed away. Human nature is to look at oneself and think about what he/she has personally accomplished. Paul did not keep a list of all those he had baptized so that he might tell others about it (1 Cor. 1:16-17). Serve Him every day but avoid the pitfall of pride of glorying about how brightly our lights have been shining. Paul had done so much, but when He looked inward, He said, "Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the

> goal..." (Phil. 3:13-14, ESV). Jesus said, "When you have done all those things commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do" (Luke 17:10). Let the waves of humility wash away past accomplishments.

> Finally, write the sins of the past in the sand. Far too many Christians, even knowing they are forgiven, carry the guilt of past sins and this discour-

ages them. You can never forget past wrongs, but you can let them be overshadowed by the remembrance of that time when God forgave them. He forgives the ungodly when they are baptized, but He forgives the godly when they acknowledge their sins. We should be thankful that He has said, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). Get rid of the burden of guilt, write those wrongs in the sand and let His blood wash them away.

Brethin mind. ren, I want you to think hard on this. Things are backwards today from what they should be, and unfortunately what we see today is that children are leading their parents. Don't believe me? Consider some examples.

A child is born and all of a sudden, "Oh, we can't go to church. We can't go to that church activity. The baby/toddler/ youngling has to eat on schedule or sleep on schedule. We can't interrupt the schedule." A child shall lead them.

A child goes to school and all of a sudden, "Oh, we can't be there for all of the services or church activities. The kid has homework to do or sports or other extracurricular activities." A child shall lead them.

A child becomes a teenager and starts to push back against going to Bible class, going to worship, participating in church youth group activities, etc. "Oh, we don't want to force him. If we make him come, he might turn against God altogether." A child shall lead them.

> A child grows up, becomes an adult, maybe even gets married, and comes back to visit mom and dad on the weekend. "Oh, we won't be at worship tonight or Bible class on Wednesday night. Our kids are home, and we are going to spend time with them." A child shall lead them.

Do you see the problem? Do you see how we are allowing our kids to lead us, INSTEAD of us leading our children? God tells parents to "teach,"

"bring up," "nurture," "discipline," "train" and "instruct" the kids (Deut. 6:7; Prov. 22:6; Eph. 6:4), NOT the other way around, with the kids training the parents! Such leads TO disaster and AWAY from the Lord! Guaranteed!

Look back to the chapter that is often misused. Jesus was coming and "His delight is in the fear of the Lord" (11:3). Is ours? "The earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord" (11:9). If the earth would be, what about our homes? Parents, it's time for us to lead and to stop being led!

Four Mistakes About the Christ

While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, saying, "What do you think about the Christ?" (Matt. 22:41-42). On another occasion, Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do men say that I, the Son of man, am?" (Matt. 16:13). This is an important question. Consider opinions ex-

pressed regarding the Christ. "Is this not the carpenter, the Son of Mary, and brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon? And are not His sisters here with us?' So they were offended at Him" (Mark 6:3). "Now King Herod It is imperative heard of Him, for His name had become well known. we know who And he said, 'John the Baptist is risen from the dead, and therefore these powers are at work in him.' Oth-Christ is. ers said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is the Prophet, or like one of the prophets'" (Mark 6:14-15). "And when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed it was a ghost, and cried out" (Mark 6:49). "Therefore when Jesus perceived that they were about to come and take Him by force to make Him king, He departed again to the mountain by Himself alone" (John 6:15).

People have many ideas about Christ. Some are right, others are wrong, and many are incomplete. There were some mistakes made in the passages above and some lessons we can learn from them. What did these men discover about Jesus? They spoke of His proximity and humanity—"Is this not the

carpenter?" They spoke of His power—"Therefore these powers are at work in Him." They spoke about the mystery surrounding Him supposing Him to be a spirit. They also referenced His sovereignty that they would make Him king. They made the mistake of limiting Him by their own opinions. They failed to see Christ through the eyes of Scripture. Every criticism of Christ is a revelation, not of Christ, but of the person who makes the criticism. Man limits Christ's power in their

lives by the limitations of their concept of Him. Christ is just as great in our lives as we allow Him to be. Christ should be seen in light of His relationship to His Father and His mission. Christ should be seen in light of Scripture. Christ should be seen in light of His mighty works. Christ should be seen in the lives of Christians. When Christ is finally seen as He is, we, with Thomas say, "My Lord and my God" (John 20:28). Paul would say, "I know whom I have be-

lieved and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day" (2 Tim. 1:12). Jesus prayed, "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (John 17:3).

Let us continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus the Christ. With that proper understanding, we are equipped to share a correct image of who Jesus is. It is clear that human opinions don't matter. Only a true knowledge of our Lord and His work matters.

How close to evil can I get?

The child of God must have nothing to do with evil! There is no place of any kind where evil is permitted in our lives! Consider how much the book of Proverbs has to say about this.

First, the wise man warns and condemns everyone who "desires evil" (Prov. 21:10), "devises evil" (12:20; 14:22), "seeks evil" (11:27), "pursues evil" (11:19), "brings about evil" (16:30) or "rewards evil for good" (17:13). This should not surprise us!

But, the wise man also calls upon followers of God to make sure that their walk is distinct.

Note the clarity and potency of these declarations: "DEPART from evil" (3:7; 14:16; 16:6, 17), "do not DEVISE evil" (3:29), "do not WALK in the way of evil" (4:14), "REMOVE your foot from evil" (4:27), "HATE evil" (8:13), "do not be ENVIOUS of evil men" (24:1), "do not FRET because of evildoers" (24:19). "A prudent man FORESEES evil and HIDES himself" (22:3; 27:12). No wonder Paul tells Christians, "Abstain from EVERY form of evil" (1 Thess. 5:22). Are you? — DS

Don't make it harder than it is!

Do you know any Christians who make being a Christian "harder than it should be"? Some folks look at living the Christian life as a "hard" thing to do (and certainly some things are "difficult," Matt. 7:14), but most of the time what folks are doing is making it "harder" in their heads than it actually is.

Folks say things like, "The elders want me to go to church three times a week. I'm not sure how I'm going to do that." Or, "I can't keep up with this Bible reading schedule. It's way too much, so I need to take a break." Or, "I don't get to go out with my friends, because they're going places that I'm not supposed to go and doing things

that I probably shouldn't be doing."

Friends, so much of this is just a matter of the heart. "As [a person] thinks in his heart, so is he" (Prov. 23:7). "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21). When you throw your heart into living for Jesus, things like this stop being "hard" and start being "fun," "desired" and "preferred." Is all-out living for Jesus your "preferred" lifestyle? — DS


