# **Don't Touch My Bride**

Imagine that moment in a wedding when the doors in the back of the wedding chapel open and the bride appears. The song chosen especially for this moment begins to play and the mother of the bride stands. When she does, the audience stands and turns to see the bride. She has never been

more radiant, and who could ever forget this moment?

As she begins to take her steps to be joined in holy matrimony, someone steps forward and begins changing her hairstyle. This changes her appearance and neither the bride nor groom likes her new look. Another person comes and changes her jewelry by removing her beautiful earrings and necklace and the way she was replacing them with those of far less beauty and value. It does not end there. To the dismay of all pre-

sent, others change her makeup, her shoes and even the veil.

Your first reaction as you read this account would be that such could never happen. Who could have such disrespect to a bride and groom? Who could ever presume that they were so important that they could ignore what was planned? But, it actually has happened!

God has revealed to us that the church is the bride of Jesus. Paul said to the Corinthians, "I have betrothed you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ" (2 Cor. 11:2). When he wrote to Ephesus, he had spoken about the respect a wife should have for her husband and the sacrificial love the husband must have toward his wife. However, when he got to the end of this discussion he said, "This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church" (Eph. 5:32). The church is truly the bride of Jesus.

Now consider this. Before the world began, the beautiful bride of Jesus was known. God worked for thousands of

> years to prepare for that time when the doors of heaven would be opened and the bride would appear. Then, the bride came.

> God's plan was for the bride to retain her eternal beauty. All authority in heaven and on earth is His and that leaves no room for any mortal to change the adornment of the bride (Matt. 28:18; Gal. 1:6-9). There was no provision for any mortal to

change in any way the beauty of His bride. Even angels could not change it.

The denominational nature of modern Christendom is overwhelming evidence that mankind presumptuously altered the bride of Jesus after she was revealed. Every person should soberly consider if they have in their religious life followed those who alter His bride. God help every person in every denomination to think about this and return to His plan for His beautiful bride.



# No Pain, All Gain

Have you ever had one of those crushing migraines that just would not subside? The only thing you could do was lay down in a dark room and wait it out. What if you never had to suffer the pain of a migraine again?

Have you ever had one of those toothaches that felt like half of your face was going to fall off

(or maybe you wished that would happen)? What if you never had to suffer the pain of another excruciating toothache again?

Have you ever had that endless, piercing back pain that you could not seem to relieve no matter what you did or what position you took? What if you never had to suffer a single back pain ever again?

You get the idea. Think of the worst pain that you have ever experienced (or are experiencing) in your life. This life is so full of pains that we have grown accustomed to wondering, "What's going to hurt today?" What if you woke up one morning and you felt completely new and there was not the slightest pain or discomfort anywhere in your body? Oh, what a day that would be!

You know where this is going. When John was permitted to see a glimpse of heaven, one of the details he could not resist reporting was that in heaven, "There shall be no more pain" (Rev. 21:4). No more! We read that and long for such a day!

Pain is one of the greatest motivators that we know. Pain can stop us from doing our favorite activities. Pain can move a stubborn man who "never goes to the doctor" to go to the doctor. The reason that pain is such a great motivator is that we are searching for "the sweet spot" or "the medical answer" that will stop the pain.

We ache for a place where we will never ache again.

Does that not make heaven the supreme, ultimate of all motivators? There are scores of reasons that we should strive for heaven, but one selfish one may be that we ache for a place where we will never ache again. And if that were not enough, look at the alternative.

Jesus uses the motivating power of pain to drive our ambitions away from hell. Hell is a place where there will be eternal "weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matt. 8:12; 13:42, 50), because there is a "fire that shall never be quenched" and "their worm does not die" (Mark 9:43-48). The pain-filled "torment" of hell will be experienced "day and night forever and ever" (Rev. 14:11; 20:10).

Given the choice between the place of "no more pain" and the place of nothing but eternal pain, which shall you choose? Heaven shall have no pain, but all gain!

Who would ever disrespect the bride and change adorned?



# The Debt of Love We Owe

Have you ever been reading the Bible and something just jumps out at you? Perhaps it was a familiar passage or lesserknown, but the truth it taught in that moment had an impact. This happened to me recently with a fairly well-known passage. I'd like to share this with you and talk about the

implications.

The first part of this verse is relatively wellknown. "Owe nothing to anyone" (Rom. 13:8a). The context of this verse is about taxes and customs. Some have taken it to mean that you can't be in debt in any way including contractual agreements. I'm not sure that is the purpose of this verse, especially once was paid for me. you read the rest of the text. The rest of the verse is "except to love one another; for he who loves his

neighbor has fulfilled the law" (Rom. 13:8b). This is what hit me hard. I was reading a book about the Parable of the Good Samaritan, and the author made this comment about this passage, "Love is the debt that we owe all men" (The Parables of Jesus, Trench). I've known we are supposed to love everyone since a young age going to Bible class, but I've never thought about it this way. I am in debt to everyone I meet to show love. That moved it beyond just a nice sentiment or moral obligation to a social debt. It is also a debt I will never pay off. It has brought the love I show to my neighbor into greater focus.

It is interesting that Paul would begin this letter talking about his indebtedness. "I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise" (Rom. 1:14). He is using this in the context of teaching the gospel to all men. Why is he indebted? It is because of his love for God combined with a love for mankind that he is indebted to share the gospel. That is the primary implication of that debt of love we owe to all. We must share the gospel with them. How can we say we

love anyone and withhold the saving message they need?

# Another implication is our focus. When the lawyer asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor," he was asking, "Who do I have to love" (Luke 10:29). Jesus' parable directed him not to a person that he must show love to but rather who must show love. If we can shift our thinking away from finding the right

person or situation to show love to being the person that shows love, we will be overwhelmed with opportunities to love. Trench went on to say when the sun was created it didn't ask who to shine its light on. God made it to shine on everything. John said it this way, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God" (1 John. 4:7). I hope this has been as impactful for you as it was for me. If you already knew this, great! Now it is time to get out there and do it. Let's work on the debt of love that we owe because of a debt that was paid for us.

> deavor to write key verses of meditation on our heart that pinpoint these fleshly weaknesses of ours, may I also encourage us to see Jesus there as we are tempted (and even as we give in and sin). What is He doing? At least two things.

First, Jesus has His eye on us. When Peter sinned, "the Lord turned and looked at" him (Luke 22:61). Jesus is watching. You could take that fearfully, but there is another possibility. On another occasion when Peter failed his Lord and called out to Him, the Bible says that "immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him" (Matt. 14:31). 


