

Heated Up and Boiling Over

Have you ever

consider that a

The scabs and

scars of the

The words of Paul so vividly describe heaven's view of how we should respond after we have given our lives to God. He talks about the fact that Christ "...gave Himself for us, that he might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous of good works" (Tit.

2:14). We are special to Him, and our response is that we should work for it with zeal.

The Greek word for zeal is used to describe water that is being heated and then reaches the point where it begins boiling vigorously. It might have at one time been cold, then it became lukebeen heated up but now it is boiling over. Paul uses this word to describe his devotion to Judaism and then repeatedly used it to describe his service to God.

There is no story in the Bible which shows the application of this message better than the events which happened early in the public life of Jesus. At His first miracle performed in the wedding in Cana He said to His mother, "My hour has not yet come" (John 2:4), but because of her insistence He began displaying His power. Shortly thereafter He was in Jerusalem where He manifested exactly who He was and why He came. He had obviously come to do what His Father wanted.

Before He came into the world, He knew that He was to be given the body of a man, and He knew how He should use that body in serving God. He said, "A body You have prepared for Me...behold I come to do your will" (Heb. 2:5-9). Jesus was in Jerusalem and look at how fervently He used His body.

He came into the temple and saw what was happening. He looked around Him and saw the oxen, sheep, doves and the tables of the money changers. What followed had to startle those who saw it. Jesus took a whip and drove those thieves who had turned a house of prayer into a den of thieves. His own disciples did not understand what He was doing and why warm but the end result is so obvious to all. It has water has deeper He was doing it. It was only later that they remember that prophecy about Jesus, "The zeal for Your house has eaten me up" (John 2:14-17). He was consumed

> by what He saw. His "spiritual temperature" began to rise, and it then boiled over, leaving behind empty "stores" and overturned tables.

> Now as you look at Him who has left us the example we should follow, look at yourself. What is your "spiritual temperature" of service? As you use the body God has prepared for you, what is your level of devotion? Think about Jesus and how He responded. I am not advocating turning over tables, but I urge you to let your devotion become more and more fervent as you become like Him. What is your "temperature"?

Was Jesus Still Hurting?

Have you ever had a doctor or nurse ask you, "On a scale of 1 to 10, what's your pain level?" Imagine if someone asked Jesus that question. What would His "pain level" have been in His last hours?

We think about Jesus' agony in Gethsemane, His mistreatment in the trials,

the vicious Roman scourging and His excruciating crucifixion.

The pain that Jesus endured was immense! We can read it, but our imaginations cannot even fathom it. But, after He was raised from the dead, He was "all better," right? No more pain? He was 100%?

The Bible does not detail His postresurrection pain level for us, but consider this. Jesus was raised in the same human body in which He died. It was not a "new and improved" body. It was

not an "upgrade." It was the same body that had been beaten and killed. He told His disciples that He was not "a spirit," for He was still a man of "flesh and bones," and He ate with them (Luke 24:37-42). More than that, He showed them the wounds on His hands and feet (Luke 24:39-40), and He had Thomas "reach" his "hand" and "put it into [His] side" (John 20:27). What do we learn from that?

Jesus' post-resurrection body still had the same wounds that His pre-death body had. The wounds had likely closed up (hopefully), but the scabs and scars of the dreadful suffering were still present.

Have you ever had a large puncture wound that was in the process of healing? Did it still hurt after the scab started to form? If your hands had been pierced with an iron nail, how would they be feeling afterwards? If your feet had been pierced with an iron nail, would you want to be walking around in sandals on dusty roads? Is it possible that Jesus' feet were

> in severe pain? Is it possible that His back, which had been torn to shreds in the scourging, was still raw and very tender to the touch? Is it possible that His side, where a spear had pierced and out flowed blood and water, was not only very sore on the surface but the tissue and muscles underneath were constantly aching and having shooting pains?

I don't know. The Bible does not tell us to what level Jesus' body had healed, but it does tell us that the external wounds were still apparent. Is it not therefore likely that those 40 days on earth after His resurrection were still filled with pain as His physical body healed from the torture?

For how long Jesus suffered the physical hurt we do not know, but we do know that He still hurts for us today. As our High Priest, He is "touched with the feeling of our infirmities" (Heb. 4:15, ASV). He hurts (i.e., sympathizes) with our weaknesses. I wonder, when He looks at us today, what His pain level is...for us.

To Dwell In A Troubled Land

Peter tells us that Lot was oppressed by the sinfulness around him when living in the area of Sodom and Gomorrah. This "righteous man, while living among them, felt his righteous soul tormented day after day by their lawless deeds" (2 Pet. 2:7-

8). It is likely that we feel the weight of torment by the lawless deeds of the ungodly all around us. There

are some safeguards that can help us from falling into the same unrighteous life.

First among these is a fear of the Lord. Solomon would say that the whole duty of man is to "fear God and keep His commandments" (Eccl. 12:13). Also, this fear is the beginning of knowledge (Prov. 1:7). Without a fear or reverent respect for God there will be no obedience.

Knowledge of God's instructions is closely related to a right relationship with Him. During the work of the prophet Hosea God said, "My people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge" (4:6). You can't obey what you don't know. Knowledge is something we are to add to our moral excellence (2 Pet. 1:5-7). We need to "be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15).

A knowledge of the results of sin should motivate us

to keep ourselves separate from sin. "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 6:23). "Everyone who has this hope fixed on Him purifies himself, just as He is pure. Everyone who practices sin also practices lawlessness; and sin is lawlessness" (1 Jn. 3:3-4).

The opposite is true also. A knowledge of the rewards of faithful obedience should help keep us on the right path. Christ says that He came to this earth for that purpose. "The

thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). In Christ we have these blessings. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ" (Eph. 1:3).

Lastly, we must remain in strict obedience to God. That was the warning that Moses gave the people before entering into the promised land. "See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse: the blessing, if you listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, which I am commanding you today; and the curse, if you do not listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I am commanding you today, by following other gods which you have not known" (Deut. 11:26-28). See to it that we maintain a healthy fear of the Lord and that we grow in the grace and the knowledge of our Lord (2 Pet. 3:18).

Pay somebody else to do it?

At what point do you pay someone else to do something for you? At what point do you pay someone else to...change your vehicle's oil for you...paint your house for you...mow your grass for you...do your taxes for you...walk your dog for you? The list of questions seems endless. But when faced with the cost factor, the convenience factor, the time factor, the personal preference factor, we face this decision.

So, consider this question: Why didn't Jesus just pay someone else to come to earth and die on the cross in His place? The cost factor was really high. The convenience factor was real. The time and personal preference factors could have come into play. But Jesus did it Himself!

The expression "gave Himself" is found five times in the Bible, and EVERY time it is used to emphasize that Jesus "gave Himself for me...for us...for our sins" (Gal. 1:4; 2:20; Tit. 2:14; Eph. 5:25; 1 Tim. 2:6). He did not pay with someone else's blood but with "His own blood" (Heb. 9:12; 13:12; Acts 20:28; Rev. 1:5). Jesus Himself paid it all! All to Him I owe! – DS

Thinking that worship is right doesn't make it right!

While Moses was with God on Mount Sinai, the Lord told Moses that the people had "corrupted themselves," in that they "made themselves a molded calf, and worshiped it and sacrificed to it" (Ex. 32:7-8). Moses descended to deal with the people, meeting Joshua who had gone up with him (24:13).

Joshua heard noise that he thought was the "noise of war in the camp" (32:17), but Moses knew better. Moses said it was "the sound of singing" (32:18). They came near the camp and Moses "saw the calf and the dancing" and his "anger became hot" (32:19).

The people THOUGHT that they were doing right. They were told, "This is your god" (32:4). They were told to offer "burnt offerings" and "peace offerings" on the altar that had been built, as a worshipful "feast to the Lord" 32:5-6). But their worship provoked God's "wrath" (32:10).

CALLING something "worship" does NOT make it worship! THINKING that something is acceptable to God does NOT make it acceptable to God! May God help us to worship HIM exactly as HE has directed (John 4:23-24), not as man might find appealing! -DS


