My Home Is Not For Sale

Bob had just walked outside the front door to begin weeding the flowerbed when his neighbor saw him. The neighbor began the conversation with a comment about how sad he was to see Bob selling his home for they had become good friends. The neighbor was surprised when Bob said we

are not selling our home, we never plan to do that. We are selling our house, and next month our home will be in a new house just a few miles away. There is a vast difference in a home and a house, especially for Christians.

It may be easy, at first, to see this as nothing more than a play on two words we often use inter- **houses but never** of Christians which are not for sale, but one so vital is changeably, but such is far from the case. Consider the following to see that there is a vast difference in the home of Christians and the house in which they live.

One aspect of that home is how marriage is viewed so differently. The vows they made were not just words which seemed so appropriate for the occasion. They would never forget the expression found in that ceremony where they each promised "...to keep yourself him/her alone for as long as you both shall live." Their home had been built around the solemn promises made that day. There was trust which began that day and was never violated. They were faithful to each other.

There was another part of the ceremony they both remembered, and it followed them in every house in which lived. The words were those from Jesus: "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh...Therefore what God has joined together let no man separate" (Matt. 19:5-6). The concept of how the two become one flesh removes selfishness from the hearts where selfishly they are standing and arguing

> their own private position. They have surrendered and become selfless, and a new entity has been formed. Divorce is not a word ever considered in their relationship.

> There are many other aspects in the home how children are seen. Like Hannah, they prayed before the children were born and God heard them.

Hannah said, "The Lord has granted me my petition which I asked of Him. Therefore I also have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives he shall be lent to the Lord" (1 Sam. 1:27-28). Our world has vastly changed as the government uses the school system to control the values children need. If parents do nothing, children will be brainwashed with new sexual orientation of society. Our children are not for sale!

Our world view is different. Our homes are not for sale. We sell our houses but never sell our homes!



Saved When They Got the Spirit? Not According to Scripture!

In an effort to prove that baptism is not essential to salvation, an appeal is often made to the Holy Spirit falling upon the household of Cornelius in Acts 10. The claim that is made goes something like this: "They received the Holy Spirit and were saved before they were baptized; therefore, baptism

really isn't essential to salvation." In short, consider this.

First, the text does not say that they were saved from their sins when the Holy Spirit fell upon them. Read it carefully. It never says that.

Second, notice what the text does say was essential for them to be saved. The word "saved" is found once in the text. An angel told Cornelius to send for Peter, "who will tell you words by which you and all your household will be saved" (11:14). In

order to be "saved," they needed to have "words" spoken to them by Peter. Why? Because "the gospel of Christ...is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16), and in order to "believe" the gospel, it is essential for one to "hear" the words of the gospel (10:13-14), for "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (10:17).

Ask yourself this question: "Could they be saved before and without hearing the words of the gospel from Peter?" The answer is obvious—No, they could not!

Third, note carefully when the Holy Spirit fell upon them. When Peter reported to the other apostles the events at Cornelius' house, he "explained it to them in order from the beginning" (Acts 11:4). Peter said, "And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them" (11:15). The Greek word for "began" "indicates that a thing was but just begun when it was interrupted by something else." They had not heard the "words" yet, as Peter had just started. Thus, they were not saved yet, although the Spirit fell upon them.

> Fourth, note that Peter identifies this as the baptism of the Holy Spirit, which was "the same gift" that God imparted to the apostles "at the beginning" on Pentecost in Acts 2 (11:15-17; 10:45-47). There are no other accounts of Holy Spirit baptism than these two. It occurred in Acts 10 for the benefit of the Jews, as a Divine demonstration to them that

God's Word was for the Gentiles also (10:45-46; 11:17-18).

Fifth, note that they were "commanded...to be baptized in the name of the Lord" (10:48). Why would Peter command the Gentiles to do that? For the very same reason that he commanded the Jews to be baptized—"for the remission of sins" (2:38). Baptism was essential for all of them...and for us.

Read the text. Let the Bible do the teaching. They were not saved before they were baptized. No verse teaches that. In fact, every part of the text teaches just the opposite.

"Where Are the Nine?"

Jesus healed many but few returned to show gratitude. On one occasion Jesus healed ten men with leprosy—a disease that produced years of indescribable misery, advancing slowly but surely, as it destroyed the body. Ten such leprous men stood afar off and pleaded with Jesus to have mercy on

them (Luke 17:11, 13). The Lord healed them (Luke 17:14). It was necessary that a healed leper go to the Jewish priest to be restored (Lev. 14:1-32). That is why Christ commanded that the lepers go show themselves unto the priests (Luke 17:14). However, only one of the ten turned back and thanked Jesus for this new lease on life (Luke 17:16), and he was a Samaritan, a man least expected to express gratitude to the Lord. Jesus asked, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine where are they?" (Luke 17:17). The question concerns gratitude.

Ingratitude is a blight on a gracious act of kindness. The unrighteous are described as, "For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks" (Rom. 1:21). It characterizes a rebellious people in the last days, "For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy" (2 Tim. 3:2). Prosperity often gives way to ingratitude. Man seldom ever appreciates the well until it runs dry.

Ingratitude is a blight on a gracious act of kindness.

We should ask the question of ourselves, "Are we grateful?" We are the recipients of a thousand blessings daily, both spiritual and physical (Eph. 1:3; Jas. 1:5, 17). But, we often forget the One that cares for us (Acts 17:25). When do we show our gratitude? We are blessed with six days to work, and what do we do when the church gathers to worship (Acts 20:7)? Where are the nine? When we offer the fruit of our lips in song and thanks, where are the nine (Heb. 13:15)? When

the contribution plates are passed, where are the nine (1 Cor. 16:2)? When there is work to be done at the building, gospel meetings, campaigns, service in His name, where are the nine? Paul's being saved caused him to feel that he was a debtor to others who needed to be rescued. He said, "I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. So, for my part, I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rom 1:14-15)

Rome" (Rom. 1:14-15).

"Be thankful" is a command of God (Col. 3:15). "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 5:18). "Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving" (Col. 4:2). There are so many little, everyday things to remind us of our blessings. It is important that we remember and show our gratitude to the One who provides us with everything. Where are the nine? They should be counting their blessings and returning service.
