## Put a String on Your Finger to Remind You

The Jews, like

a way to remem-

ber important

things

I am not sure where the idea originated, but it has been around for decades. If there was something really important you needed to remember, you were told to put a string (or ribbon) on your finger to remind you. I am sure other cultures may have similar figures of speech and times have changed

in our world. More recently we talk about putting it on our calendar or putting a reminder on our cell phone.

It is remarkable that the Jews evidently did something very much like this. When Moses gave the **most people, had** ah, the suffering Servant would come. law, he told the Jews to do two things to keep God's word before them. They were to write them on the gates and doors of their houses or to write God's words and put them in containers and wear these containers on their hands or around their heads, just above their eyes.

Moses said, "You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your doors" (Deut. 6:8-9—in the New Testament these containers or frontlets are called phylacteries—Matt. 23:5). They did not put strings on their fingers, they wore them before their eyes.

Evidently, they also wrote words on their hands. Have you not at some time or another used a pen to write important numbers or details on your hand when you could not find paper you might use? Isaiah indicates the Jews did this when he described how and where God wrote His message.

What was that message that was so important that He wrote it down on His hand? It was written in that part of Isaiah where he told the Jews that they were headed for captivity, and he then began to give a detailed description of the coming of the Messiah. When they were in captivity, they

> might have felt that God had forgotten them. Such was not the case for after the captivity of the Messi-

> What was that message God wrote? Perhaps if we knew what He wrote it might help us know and understand our God even better. What was that message? Read these words slowly and carefully. "Yet I will not forget you. See, I have inscribed you on

the palms of my hands" (Isa. 49:16). God had written the name of His people on the palms of His hand!

God had not forgotten Israel, and He has not forgotten us! It was not a string on a finger—it was your name written on the palm of His hand. As I thought about all of this, I could not help but remember the words of Thomas about not believing in Jesus unless he saw the nail prints in His hand. As you think about the fact that God remembers us, look at the hands of Jesus. Figuratively, your name is beside those wounds in His hands!

Don't graduate from the church! Some people, maybe even fellow "Christians," are going to try to convince you that the church is "optional" and that you are ok (maybe even better off) without it. Don't believe them for a second! They're wrong! You need the church and...the church needs you (Matt. 6:33; 1 Cor. 12:12-27; Eph. 4:16; Heb. 10:24).

Don't graduate from godly living! "Just live any way that you want! You only live once! You do you!" That's what some folks will try to convince you to believe. The truth is that the very best life on this earth is the Move on with faithful Christian life! You will be more blessed (Eph. their lives to 1:3; John 13:17) and more fulfilled (John 10:10) by bigger and better living the godly life than any other life (Tit. 2:11-14)!

**Don't graduate from Jesus!** You might think that you can't see Him, so He must not be real. He is more than real! 



#### When Conflicts Arise

It is easy to fall into the misconception that Christians will never have disputes within the church. While we should strive for no divisions amongst our brothers and sisters (1 Cor. 1:10; 2 Cor. 13:11), there will be times when, despite our best efforts, strong disagreements will arise. What should our response be when Christian conflicts arise? Consider the story of Paul and Barnabas.

In Acts 15:36-41, Paul and Barnabas planned to visit brethren in each city and see how they were. A disagreement over taking John became so sharp that they went their separate ways, taking new partners with them (Acts 15:39-40). Knowing the history of Paul and Barnabas makes this story even sadder, considering Barnabas would have been akin to a mentor to Paul. They would have been extremely close thanks to the missions they went on together (e.g., Acts 13).

It is important to note two big things from this passage. Firstly, even though they disagreed, they did not sin. The conflict did not lead to something they would regret more later. Secondly, they did not let this cause them to stop serving the Lord! They continued to work just as planned but now separately. Likewise, later in the New Testament, we see they settled their dispute (Gal. 2; Col. 4:10). May our disagreements never cause us to lose track of what is most important in our lives or cause us to sin against our brethren and God!
